

Special Called meeting of the Council
 Canby, Ore., Aug. 19, 1912.

Council convened at the call of the mayor at 8:00 o'clock P.M. in the City Hall Aug. 19, 1912, and was called to order by Mayor H. A. Dedman.

Upon the roll call the following were found present, to-wit: Mayor H. A. Dedman; Chief of Police E. C. Shull; Recorder C. F. Romig; Councilmen; H. C. Giltmore, John Graham, J. E. Southland, J. R. Newton, Geo. Weeks and H. J. Hewett.

The object of the call was briefly stated by Mayor H. A. Dedman, namely: To decide on what conditions, if any, the Council would allow the gravel from the excavation of cellars, which are to be dug in the business part of town, to be placed on the streets. After much discussion, motion was made by councilman, J. R. Newton & seconded by councilman, H. C. Giltmore, that the City Engineer make an estimate of the exact amount of dirt required on First, Second, Third and the Cross Streets and that this be done at once; motion carried un-
 anously.

Motion was made, that the conditions on which we allow the gravel to go on the streets be postponed until after a report shall have been submitted by the City Engineer, motion carried. Whereupon motion was made and carried that the Council adjourn.
