

Regular Session of the City Council
Oct. 14, 1912 at City Hall.

The Council met in regular adjourned session Oct. 14, 1912 at 8:00 P.M. and was called to order by Mayor H. A. Dedman.

Upon roll call the following were found present, Mayor H. A. Dedman, Recorder, C. F. Roring, Chief of Police, E. C. Shull; Councilmen: H. C. Gillmore, Joe Lieser, J. L. Eckerson, John Graham, J. R. Newton and Geo. Weeks.

Minutes of Sept. 3 and also Oct. 7, 1912 were read approved and ordered placed on file.

The following claims against the City were then presented and upon motion by Councilman H. C. Gillmore, seconded by Councilman Joe Lieser were allowed, the roll having been called and all Councilmen present voting in favor of allowing same:

Under the report of committees, the Cramery's insanitary condition was discussed.

Councilman, Geo. Weeks, called attention to the dangerousness of the open ditch made by M. J. Lee & the Recorder was requested to communicate

with the responsible party and order same closed.

Moved, seconded and carried that the Recorder confer with the City Engineer of Portland in regard to the method advisable to settle with Mr. Wm. Cantwell and act accordingly.

Whereupon upon motion City Engineer, Fred. Roth, was given thirty days in which time to file map relative to the widening of Fantom Street.

Motion made that an ordinance be drafted levying a seven and one half (7½) mill tax for the coming year for general municipal purposes.

The matter of a bridge across the irrigation ditch at the North side of town was referred to the Street & Committee for adjustment.

The Recorder was instructed to confer with the S. P. R. R. Co. and complete the arrangements with them for the road through the gravel pit.

It was requested that the Recorder confer with our City Atty and learn what had been done relative to the extension of "C" Street - and if matters permitted to arrange to stay legal action until the matter of extending this Street - could again come up before the Council.

Meeting adjourned.
