

Regular Session of the City Council Dec 4, 1912.

The City Council met in regular session at the City Hall, Dec. 4, 1912 at 8:00 o'clock P.M. and was called to order by Mayor H. A. Dedman.

Upon roll call the following were found present, to-wit: Mayor H. A. Dedman, Recorder, C. F. Romig, Chief of Police E. C. Shull; Councilmen: H. C. Gillmore, Joe Lieser, J. L. Eckerson, John Graham, J. E. Southland and Geo. Macks. Minutes of previous meeting read & approved.

The following claims against the City were then presented:-

Motion was made that the bills be allowed and warrants drawn for the same. The roll was then called & all voted "yes".

Report was made that Mr. J. B. Eddy, Right of Way representative of the S. P. & N. R. had come here Monday evening expecting to meet with the Council with a view to discuss & explain the R. R. Company's views in regard to granting the City a public highway through the gravel pit, but as there was no Council session on that evening, he

left word that he would try to arrange to meet with us on any date we might set. Thereupon, motion was made & carried that the Recorder get into communication with Mr. Eddy to arrange if possible for a meeting Dec. 9 (the following Monday). 1912.

After this the need of lights in different parts of the City was discussed and the places which were presented as most needy were as follows: In front of the Evangelical Church, out by Mr. Yergon's and one near Mr. Eckerson's place. Upon motion it was decided that five more lights be installed at such places as seemed best to the Committee on Streets & Public Property.

Motion made & carried that the Public Drinking Fountain be connected with the Water System and that the Carby Hdw. & Imp. Co. be given this work.

Ordinance #109 Providing for a seven and a half ($7\frac{1}{2}$) mill tax levy for municipal purposes was read for the second time. Motion was then made that this ordinance be placed on its final passage, whereupon the roll was called with the result that all the councilmen present voted "yes". The following being the councilmen present: - H. C. Sillmon, Joe Liser, J. L. Eckerson, John Graham, J. E. Southland and Geo. Necks.

Ordinance #110, revoking a part of Ordinance #107 relative to the damages allowed W. R. Telford for land required for the opening of "C" Street was read for the second time. Motion was then made that this ordinance be placed on its final passage.

whereupon the roll was called and the following councilmen, being present voted "yes" —

H. C. Sillmore, Joe Lieser, J. L. Eckerson, J. E. Southland, John Graham and George Weeks. Therefore the ordinance was declared passed.

Whereupon motion was made that since L. D. Walker received the highest number of votes be declared elected to the office of City Treasurer and that L. H. Wang, and J. L. Eckerson, H. J. Hewitt and Grant White, since receiving the highest number of votes cast be declared elected councilmen for a term of two years each and finally that W. H. Bain having received the highest vote be declared elected councilman for a term of one

year. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion made and carried that the Recorder be instructed to secure the necessary form etc. for a petition to create a special Road Dist. of Canby and report the findings at the meeting to be held Monday evening, Dec. 9, 1912.

Motion made and carried that the Council adjourn until 8.00 P. M. Dec. 9, 1912.
