

Regular session of City Council Jan. 2, 1912 Cont.

Ordinance No. 102 providing that the Council exercise their authority of making a seven and one-half mills tax levy was read for the second time, and upon roll call was unanimously passed, those voting being as follows: H. C. Gillmore, J. L. Peterson, John Graham, J. E. Southland and John R. Newton.

Thereupon the following officers were duly elected: C. F. Romig, Recorder, by an unanimous vote. E. C. Shull, Chief of Police, W. H. Evans Street-Commissioner, W. H. Bair, to serve for a term of one year to fill the vacancy made by Carl C. Koehler, who failed to qualify as Councilman, and H. C. Gillmore, President of the Council. Then the rules were suspended on motion and F. M. Roth was nominated and elected as City Engineer.

H. C. Gillmore, Chairman of Committee on Streets and Public Property urged that crossings and street repair work be continued as funds would allow.

Mayor, H. A. Dedman made the following proclamations in the presence of the assembled Council:

I, Henry A. Dedman, Mayor of Canby, do hereby proclaim that an Act entitled: A bill for an Act to amend paragraph one of section 33 of Chapter 1 of the laws of the City of Canby, State of Oregon as contained in the Charter of said Canby, entitled:

For an amendment to section 33, paragraph 1 of the Charter of the City of Canby granting the Council of said City of Canby power and authority, within the limits of said City of Canby, to assess, levy and collect taxes for general municipal purposes, not to

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 exceed one per centum upon all prop-
 erty, both real and personal, which is
 taxable by law for State and County
 purposes.

I therefore declare said act duly
 approved, passed and carried and
 now a part of the Charter and
 fundamental law of Canby.

I, Henry A. Dedman, Mayor of Canby, do
 hereby proclaim that an act entitled:
 A bill for an act to amend the Charter
 of the City of Canby by the addition of
 Chapter 2 to the Charter of the City of
 Canby, State of Oregon, entitled:

For amendment by addition of
 Chapter 2 to the Charter of the City of
 Canby, granting the Council of said
 City of Canby power and authority
 within the limits of said City of
 Canby whenever it may deem it ex-
 pedient, to open, lay out, establish, widen,
 alter, extend, vacate or close streets, and
 to appropriate and condemn private
 property. Therefor.

I therefore declare said act duly
 approved, passed and carried and
 now a part of the Charter and funda-
 mental law of Canby.
