

Regular Session of City Council

Mar. 4, 1912.

Council called to order by Mayor, H. A. Dedman at 8:00 P.M.

Upon Roll call the following were found present, to-wit: - Mayor, H. A. Dedman, Recorder C. F. Romig, Chief of Police E. C. Shull, Councilmen: H. C. Billmore, Joe Leiser, J. L. Eckerson, John Graham, J. E. Southerland and J. R. Newton

Minutes of regular session of Feb. 5, 1912 and called session of Feb. 26, 1912 were read, approved and ordered placed on file.

Under the head of communications: resignation of J. Alstad as Councilman was read and upon motion was accepted.

M. J. Lee presented corporation papers and a proposed ordinance requesting a franchise to run a Rail Road through Canby or into Canby as he might decide. Said papers were read by the recorder and after some discussion the matter was referred to a committee consisting of Councilmen Newton, Leiser and Billmore with instructions that said committee confer with our attorney, W. U. Shubfield.

Councilman, J. L. Eckerson, reported the assurance he received in an interview which he had with Messrs Fields and Blood, officials of the S. P. R. R., that they would give Canby such loading yards and other improvements as were necessary, and that they too desired to have everything look neat about the R. R. premises in the town.

Several requests for electric lights

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in different parts of the town were presented and the matter was referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property.

The City Engineer's report giving the survey for the opening of Fanton, South 2nd and C Streets was read approved and accepted together with the map covering said streets.

Thereupon ordinances providing for the opening of the 3 streets, namely Fanton, South Second and "C" Streets were read, said ordinances being ordinance #104 in reference to the opening of "C" St., #105 in reference to the opening of Sp. 2nd St. & #106 in reference to the opening of Fanton Street, and by an unanimous vote the ordinances were passed and ordered published as required by law.

The following claims against the City were presented and upon motion were allowed by an unanimous vote of the Council, the roll having been called, and warrants were ordered drawn for the payment of same:
