

Regular Session of The City Council

May 6th, 1912 at City Hall

The Council met in regular session in the City Hall May 6, 1912 at 8.00 P.M. and was called to order by Henry A. Dedman, Mayor.

Upon roll call the following were found present - to wit: Mayor H. A. Dedman, Recorder, C. F. Romig; Chief of Police E. C. Shull; Councilmen: H. C. Gillmore, J. L. Dickson, J. L. Eckerson, John Graham, J. E. Southland, Geo. Meeks and H. J. Hewitt.

Minutes of the adjourned meeting of April 8th, 1912 read, approved and ordered placed on file.

Under the head of Communications, a letter from the Agricultural College of Corvallis, Ore. was read. This letter, having been received in reply to a communication written to that Experiment Station of said institution by the Recorder at the request of Committee appointed to look after the sanitary condition of our Cannery, related that septic tanks have proven successful receptacles for the waste matter from Canneries.

The following claims against the City were presented and upon motion were allowed by an unanimous vote of the Council, the vote being taken by calling the roll, and warrants were ordered drawn for the payment of the same.

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Committee on Streets and Public Property made the following report, Councilman, H.C. Gillmore, presenting same:—A complaint has been made relative to Mr. Lien having his gate across the side walk open; also the need of a side walk on the road leading to Good's Bridge. After some discussion the Chief of Police was ordered to notify Mr. Lien to keep his gate closed and the matter of the side walk was referred by the Mayor to the Street-Committee to be looked after. The Recorder reported that notice had been given property owners of the two streets, "C" and Fenton, relative to the meeting of the viewers on Apr. 29, 1912 and that notice was also published in The Inquirer as provided by law.

Motion made and carried that Mr. Kamisch of The Corvallis Creamery be notified by the Recorder to provide other means to care for the waste matter from the Creamery and that thirty days from the date of such notice be allowed him.

Report by Councilman, H.C. Gillmore, relating to the opening of a public road to the bottom land of the Middle River via: Power House, was made and it was stated that as far as could be learned all persons concerned are willing that this road be opened.

The report of the viewers, C.J. Bates, Chas. Roth and John Eid, relative to the opening of "C" and Fenton Streets was read and accepted by the unanimous vote of the Council and Monday evening June 3rd, 1912 was the time set for the consideration of this report by the Council and the Recorder was instructed to publish a notice of the filing of said report. The Canby Inquirer, announcing June 3rd, 1912 as the date when same was to be considered by the City Council of Canby and also to notify all persons interested to present in writing their objections to said report, if any they have and said objections, if any there be, will be heard and determined by the Council.

Committee for fire and water reported through Councilman, J. L. Eckerson, that - the chemical engine needed repairs. This was referred to the Street Commissioners, Wilson Evans, to do.

The subject of a public watering trough was presented by Councilman, W. C. Gillmore, a member of the committee formerly appointed to investigate prices and conditions relative to said trough. The report stated that a suitable trough could be made at an expense of about \$15.00, whereupon by a vote of the Council the committee was instructed to have said trough installed.

Councilman J. L. Eckerson the subject of the need of an improved fire alarm. This was referred by the Mayor to the Committee on fire and water to look after.

The attention of the Council was called to the fact that - all of the lights which had been provided for had not yet been installed by the Electric Company.

Council adjourned.
