

Minutes of June 3, 1912.

Regular session of The City Council June 3 1912 at 8:00 o'clock P.M. was called to order by Mayor Henry A. Dedman.

Upon roll call The following were found present to-wit:- Mayor H. A. Dedman; Recorder, C. F. Romig, Chief of Police E. C. Shull; Councilmen:- H. C. Gillmore, J. L. Eckerson, John Graham, J. E. Southerland, J. R. Newton and Geo. Weeks.

Minutes of the meeting of May 6, 1912 were read, approved and ordered placed on file.

Under the head of communications, after the report of the viewers, C. L. Bates, Chas Roth and John Eid was read, relative to the extension of "C" Street and the widening of Fantom Street and the objections to this report by W. R. Telford and wife, H. O. Hills, Wm Chantwell, S. B. Reese and Mrs. Fina Nelson, all of whom claimed that the damages allowed were not sufficient as per the report of said viewers and they prayed the Council that they be increased. After some deliberation and discussion motion was made by Councilman H. C. Gillmore and seconded by J. L. Eckerson, That as the report of the viewers seemed fair and equitable in every respect that the report be embodied in an ordinance and the same be published in the Canby Irrigator as required by law. Vote was taken by roll call with the result Councilmen; H. C. Gillmore, J. L. Eckerson, John Graham, J. E. Southerland, J. R. Newton and Geo. Weeks voted in favor of motion.

Thereupon the following claims against the City were presented, motion being made that they be allowed and warrants drawn to cover same, which motion was carried unanimously, all present voting yes as their respective names were called:-
