

Regular session of City Council Sept. 5,
1911.

The City Council of Carby met in regular session and was called to order at 8 P.M. by H. A. Dedman, Mayor.

Owing to the absence of C. F. Roring recorder Fred Roth acted as recorder.

Upon roll call the following were present. to-wit: H. A. Dedman - Mayor; J. S. Dick - Chief of Police; Councilmen H. C. Gilmore, Joe Lister, J. L. Eckerson, J. Alstead, Wilson Evans and W. H. Bair.

Minutes of last regular meeting read and approved.

The following claims were presented & ordered paid by unanimous vote:

Councilmen W. H. Bair, J. L. Eckerson and H. C. Gilmore were appointed special Committee to confer with Mr. Hurst in regard to electric light wiring in City limits, and individual light wiring.

Motion made by Councilman W. H. Bair to grant Fred Roth, J. B. Manley and A. Kocher to put down gravel walk along their property under supervision of Street-Committee, seconded by J. L. Eckerson, Motion Carried.

Motion made by W. H. Bair to buy the land of H. A. Lee for \$90.00 for the extension of Fourth Street. Seconded by Joe Lister, Motion Carried.

Motion made & carried that ordinance be drawn regarding the buying of the land for the extension of Fourth Street.

Motion made & carried that W. N. Shenefield be employed by the City to draw up an

amendment to the Charter in regard to the opening up of streets, widening streets etc. respecting the procedure of condemning property and appropriating same for public use.

Motion made and carried that an amendment be made to the Charter to the effect that the Council have power to levy a maximum of (10) ten mills as tax, if it is necessary in their opinion. ~~for~~

Councilmen, Bair, Leiser and Evans were appointed a special committee to look over street connecting the Canby Gardens with the extension of Fourth Street easterly.
Council adjourned.
