

Regular Session of City Council Oct. 2, 1911.
The City Council of Canby met in regular session and was called to order at 8:00 P.M. by H. A. Dedman Mayor.

Upon roll call the following were present, to wit: H. A. Dedman Mayor, C. F. Romig - Recorder, J. S. Dick - Chief of Police, Councilmen: W. H. Bair, H. C. Gillmore, J. L. Eckerson, Warren Kendall and J. Elstead.

Minutes of last regular meeting and also of the special called meeting of Sept. 25, 1911, were read and approved.

The proposed amendment to the City Charter of Canby, having been drafted by Atty. W. N. Sheffield and filed with the Recorder at 10:10 A.M. Sept. 30, 1911 by Wilson Evans was read to the Council whereupon motion was duly made and seconded and carried whereby the following Resolution was adopted:

Resolution

Be It Resolved: - That The Amendment to the Charter of the City of Canby, drafted at the request and by order of the Council by Atty. W. N. Sheffield and filed with the Recorder of Canby at 10:10 A.M. Sept. 30th, 1911 by Wilson Evans providing as follows: - A Bill for an Act to Amend

An act entitled, "Charter of the City of Canby," adopted by the People of Canby at the General City election held on the 2nd day of December, A.D. 1907.

Be It Enacted By The People of the City of Canby:

The City of Canby Does Ordain as follows Section 1, That an act entitled "Charter of the City of Canby," adopted by the people of Canby, in Clackamas County, State of Oregon, at the general City election held on the 2nd day of December, 1907, be amended by the addition of Chapter 11, providing for a method of condemning and appropriating private property for the purpose of opening, changing or widening of streets and other thoroughfare. That this amendment be submitted to the legal voters of Canby, Oregon, at the general City election to be held in said Canby on the 4th day of December, A.D. 1911 for their adoption or rejection.

Upon a vote being taken those voting Aye were to-wit: W. H. Bair, H. C. Gillula, J. L. Eckerson, Warren Kendall and J. Alstead, Each one having voted Aye, The Mayor declared the resolution carried and the Recorder was instructed to have the required pamphlets printed and attend to the matter as required by law.

Whereupon the Recorder submitted and read ^{to the Council} the proposed amendment, relative to amending Section 33, paragraph 1 so as to give City Council of Canby authority and power to assess, levy and collect a one per centum tax upon all property both real and personal, which is taxable by law for state and county purposes within said Canby, whereupon a motion was duly made, seconded

and carried whereby the following resolution
was adopted:

Resolution

Be It Resolved: That a bill for an act
to amend an act entitled, "Charter of the
City of Canby," adopted by the people of Canby
at the general City Election held on the
2nd day of December, A.D. 1907.

Be it enacted by the people of the City of
Canby:

The City of Canby does ordain as follows:
Section 1. That an act entitled "Charter of
the City of Canby" adopted by the people
of Canby, in Clackamas County, State
of Oregon, at the general City election
held on the 2nd day of December, A.D.
1907, be it amended so as to give
the Council power and authority with-
in Canby to assess, levy and
collect taxes for general municipi-
pal purposes, not to exceed one per
centum upon all property, both
real and personal, which is
taxable by law for State and County
purposes thus amending paragraph
1 of section 33 of said Charter by
substituting the word "one" for the
words "one-half of one", That this
amendment be submitted to the legal
voters of the City of Canby, Oregon at
the general City election to be held in
said Canby on the 4th day of Dec.,
A.D. 1911 for their adoption or re-
jection.

Upon a vote being taken, those voting
aye were to-wit: W. H. Bair, H. C. Gillman,
J. L. Gettersen, Warren Kendall and J.
Alstead. Each one having voted aye, the
Mayor declared the resolution carried
and he instructed the Recorder to
have this published as required by law
in the pamphlet and mailed to the legal voters
of Canby. Whereupon said proposed amend-
ment was ordered placed on file at 9:40 P.M.

Resignation of Chief of Police, J. S. Dick was read and accepted since Mr. Dick's entire time was required at the school during the day.

Committee on Streets and Public Property reported suggesting that the grading on Second Street be completed and that all crossings be repaired so that the water will run off. This report was adopted & the work ordered done.

Request of Mr. Blain White to cut down knoll on street in front of his property was referred to the Street Committee to look the matter over and arrange it with Mr. White.

Moved & carried that the Street Committee and Commissioners be instructed and given authority to fill up mud holes and make such other street improvements as are deemed necessary.

Select Committee on Opening & Extension of Fourth Street to Canby Gardens reported progress, stating that part of the \$55.00 had been paid by Messrs. Lee & Gorham and that it was agreed to pay the balance.

W. H. Luckie was appointed to look after the duties of Chief of Police for one month.
