

Regular Session of Council Nov. 6, 1911.

Council called to order at 8:00 P.M. by Mayor H. A. Dedman. Upon roll call the following were found present, to-wit: Mayor H. A. Dedman, Recorder C. F. Romig, Councilmen: W. H. Bair, H. C. Gillmore, Wilson Evans, Joe Leiser, Warren Kendall and J. Alstead.

Minutes of previous Council, read, corrected and approved and placed on file.

The communications from the Horticultural Insurance Company in regard to fire policy on City Hall, were read and on motion it was unanimously decided to continue the policy in force another year.

Street Commissioner, O. R. Mack explained that it would be impossible for him to attend to the duties connected with this office and therefore tendered his resignation which was accepted.

Councilman Chas. Brewer's place was declared vacant since Mr. Brewer had moved from the City.

Councilman H. C. Gillmore reported progress on the street-work under the direction of Committee on Streets and Public Property.

Mr. J. A. Graham was nominated and elected unanimously to fill the vacancy made in that office of Street Commissioner for the remainder of this year. Motion made & carried that Mr. J. A. Graham care for the City Hall & look after City lights and that he be allowed as compensation an amount on the same ratio as the amount received for performing work as Street Commissioner.

Councilman W. H. Bair recommended that a light be placed at the Cor. of 3rd and D Streets.

Mayor H. A. Dedman & W. H. Bair were appointed by motion to interview S. P. R. R. Co. in regard to putting electric lights in the depot.

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The Committee on Streets and Public Property were authorized to put in four more electric lights in such places as they considered proper (one at the depot, one at Graham's Cor. and one at the Norwegian Church were suggested).

Ordinance No. 101 relative to buying Right of Way of H. A. Lee to Fair Ground for road was read for the second time and passed upon final vote unanimously.

It was agreed that the Mayor appoint a Deputy Marshall.

The following Election Board was then ~~app~~ elected:

W. C. Shull - Chairman of Election Board; C. L. Bates and Claude Baly, Judges; and Fred M. Roth and Harvey Bissel, Clerks.

Recorder instructed to see when County Clerk must know the amt. of tax levy for Carby.

The request, to use the City Hall for rhetorical and school purposes on Friday afternoons, made by C. F. Roming, was granted and it was decided that no charge would be made.
