

Regular Session of the City Council Dec. 6, 1911.

Council Called to order at 8:00 P.M. by Mayor H. A. Dedman.

Upon roll call the following were found present, to-wit: - Mayor H. A. Dedman, Recorder C. F. Roring, Councilmen: - W. H. Bair, H. C. Gilmore, Wilson Evans, Joe Leiser, J. L. Eckerson, and Warren Kendall.

Minutes of the previous Council read, approved and placed on file.

Gen'l Road tax.

It was reported by Councilman W. H. Bair, Special Com. Intermun, that he had been unable as yet to secure full settlement of the past as-
sumed by the Canby Canal Co. in reference to the road near the Fair Grounds.

In the presence of the Mayor and the Council of the City of Canby, the Recorder then canvassed the ballot of the general City Election held Dec. 4, 1911 on proposed Charter amendment, a resolution by the Council, voted on at the said general election, as entitled in the following report, and reported thereon as follows:-

In the presence of the Honorable Mayor of Canby, Oregon, H. A. Dedman, and the City Council of said City, I canvassed the vote cast at the general municipal election held in Canby, Oregon on the 4th day of December, 1911, on an act entitled: For an amendment to Sec. 33, Paragraph 1 of the Charter of the City of Canby granting the Council of said City of Canby power and authority, within the corporate limits of said City of Canby to assess, levy and collect taxes for general municipal purposes, not to exceed one per centum upon all property, both real and personal, which is taxable by law for State and County purposes.

Total No. votes cast 85: For 50; Against 35

Majority in favor of said act 15 votes;
and also for an act entitled: For amend-
ment by the addition of Chapter II to the
Charter of the City of Canby granting the
Council of said City of Canby power and
authority within the limits of said
City of Canby, whenever it may deem
it expedient, to open, lay out, establish,
widen, alter, extend, vacate or close

streets, and to appropriate and condemn private property therefor.
Total no. votes cast 87. For 62. Against 25.
Majority in favor of said act 37 votes;
and also that the following persons received a majority of the votes cast for their respective positions: Mayor H. A. Dedman 77 votes cast.
Treasurer, Leroy D. Walker, 76 votes of the 77 cast.

Whereupon The Council by an unanimous vote being - W. H. Bair, H. C. Gilmore, Wilson Evans, Joe Leiser, J. L. Eckerson and Warren Kendall declared the above named amendments carried and the above named persons duly elected and that the returns of the judges and Clerks of said election be accepted and placed on file.

It was moved and carried that a City tax levy of seven and one-half (7½) mills for City purposes for the year 1912, be made and that The Recorder draw ordinance to that effect at once, whereupon Recorder prepared and read ordinance no. 102 authorizing a seven and one-half mills tax levy for City purposes for the year 1912 and upon motion same was unanimously accepted and ordered posted.

J. A. Graham was then appointed Chief of Police for the month of Dec. at a salary of \$15.00 per month.

Councilman W. H. Bair moved that since the money raised at the Queen Esther Cantata, given by The M. E. Church in the hall and from whom \$800 net had been collected, was to be used toward helping pay

for the construction of the new church building in process of erection, that the amount be refunded to pastor of said church. Motion carried and Recorder was ordered to draw a City Warrant in favor of Rev. Creech for \$800.

Councilman H. G. Willmoss moved that a telephone be installed in the City Hall and that we ask same to be given us by telephone company having franchise from the City. Motion carried & Recorder was instructed to request same from one or both the mutual companies operating within the City of Canby.

The subject of painting the City Hall was then suggested by Councilman W. H. Bair, and upon motion it carried that the Recorder advertise for bids to paint the inside of Hall two coats, the City furnishing the paint. Motion carried. It was also moved and carried that the Recorder be instructed to advertise for bids to furnish paint to paint Hall as provided by previous motion.

It was suggested that a light be placed at the foot of the stairs in the Hall and upon same switch which is already there. Whereupon the Mayor ordered the Chief of Police to see that same is put in at earliest convenience.

Whereupon Council adjourned.
