Regular Session of Mar. 6, 1911

Council was called to order at 8:00 o'clock P.M. by the Mayor.

Upon roll call the following were present - to wit: H. A. Dedman, Mayor; C. F. Ronig, recorder; J. S. Dick, Chief of Police; and Councilmen W. H. Bair, H. C. Gillmore, Joe Leiser, J. L. Eckerson, William Kendall, and J. Alstead.

Minutes of previous Council read, approved and placed on file.

The following communications were read: A letter from The Southern Pacific R.R. in reply to asking help from them to oil our streets. Letter was ordered filed. Also a notice of ^{intention to} applying for a license to sell liquor at Canby from Reames & Oglesby of Barlow. The Council decided that no action was necessary as this was not an application for a license, but merely an intention of making a future application.

Under the head of reports of officers, The Chief of Police reported that he had made the changes as ~~reper~~ instructed in regard to the store.

The various merchants, and after discussion of this subject The Recorder was instructed to draft an ordinance to ~~handle~~ regulate the handling of powder and also gasoline and read same at next regular meeting.

It was proposed that hereafter all ordinances should be published in The Canby Tribune as well as posted in ~~three~~ conspicuous places. Estimates for the expense of doing this were requested to be secured for the next meeting, but no other action was taken.

Thereupon ordinance providing for the prevention and removal of all obstructions from the sidewalks and for the clearing the same was read for the second time and unanimously adopted.
