

Minutes Regular Session of Apr. 3, 1911.
Council was called to order at 8 o'clock P.M. by the Mayor.

Upon the roll call the following were present to-wit:- H. A. Dedrick, Mayor; C. F. Romig, recorder; J. S. Dick, Chief of Police; Councilmen; W. H. Bair, Wilson Evans, J. L. Eckerson, J. Alsted, Chas. Bauer and besides that body were the following: for Leases and Warren Kendall.

Minutes of previous Council, read approved and placed on file.

The following communications were read: A letter from The S. P. R. R. stating that - when we got ready to oil the streets they would be ready to co-operate with us: also a notice to the Council from Frank Actinam stating his intentions of applying for a license to sell lights which in the corporate limits of Canby. These communications were ordered to be placed on file by the Mayor. The following claims against the City were then ordered paid:

Select Committee W. H. Bair, asked for an extension of time to make final report on raising money with which to oil streets, progress however was reported. Time was extended as requested.

Ordinances Nos. 97, 98, and 99 were read for the second time and were passed by a unanimous vote of those present. Ordinance No. 100 relative to the keeping of stables and holding of giant power and

gasoline, was read and approved and ordered posted.

An ordinance in reference to securing a franchise from the Council by the United Telephone Company was read and referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property.

The Street-Commissioner asked and granted more time to make the street-improvements ordered by the Council, request granted.

Motion made and carried unanimously that the Street-Commissioner or his clerk make which will be suitable for use to oil the streets. Street-Commissioner was ordered to have the ditch on the road through the Roth Addition to Carley either filled in or bridged.

Recorder was ordered to secure prices for oil for street-use from local merchants.

Motion and carried that-henceforth all ordinances or published in future issues (the price quoted being 3¢ per ordinance for publishing during 4 years of the Carley Tribune hereafter, as shall as stated by the Recorder as heretofore.

The Mayor profited by the presence of the many citizens and requested that there be a general cleaning up of the premises in town at least by a time we might be convenient.
