

# Minutes of Regular Session of May 1, 1911.

Council was called to order at 8:00 P.M. by the Mayor, Dr. H. A. Dedman. The following members were present: H. A. Dedman, Mayor; C. F. Roring, Recorder; J. S. Dick, Chief of Police; Councilmen, W. H. Bair, H. C. Willmore, Warren Kendall, J. Alstead, Chas. Brewer, J. L. Eckerson, Wilson Evans and Joe Leiser.

Minutes of previous Council were read, approved and placed on file.

Recorder, C. F. Roring made report on the prices quoted the Council for oil to be used for oiling the streets.

Councilman W. H. Bair made report of amount raised towards buying oil to be used on the streets. This report showed \$125.00 subscribed by the citizens.

The Recorder was instructed to order oil to arrive on or after May 10<sup>th</sup>.

The Committee on Streets and Public Property reported a complaint in regard to the <sup>condition</sup> open ditch running and carrying away refuse from the Chalmers. Councilman Joe Leiser was authorized to confer with Mr. Kampisch and see what could be done to make the conditions more sanitary.

Motion made and carried that the Recorder examine records and find out if the Scramblin Telephone Co. has a franchise and make report of same at next regular meeting.

Upon motion Ordinance No. 100, relative to keeping <sup>and regulating the</sup> supplies of powder and gasoline within the city, was placed on final passage and was

Carried unanimously.

Upon ballot Chas. Roth, C. L. Bates and J. F. Eckerson were elected <sup>viewers</sup> to appraise values of property to be appropriated by City in opening streets provided for by ordinances Nos. 97, 98 and 99.

Upon motion The recorder was instructed to draw up an ordinance regulating the peddling of fish and meat so that a license will be received for this privilege and report same at the next regular meeting of the Council.

Motion made that - if the Ogle property can be secured at the price and on the conditions reported except that - there shall not be the condition in the deed that the property must be used exclusively for park purposes, that - The Recorder be authorized to arrange for a special election to vote a  $\frac{1}{2}$  mill tax for this purpose.
