

Regular Session of the Council June 6, 1911.

The City Council of Canby met on the 5th day of June 1911, and was called to order by the mayor, Dr. H. A. Dedman at 8:30 o'clock P.M.

The following responded to the Roll Call: Mayor H. A. Dedman, Recorder C. F. Romig, Chief of Police J. S. Dick; Councilmen: W. H. Bair, Wilson Evans, Joe Leiser, J. T. Eckerson, Warren Kendall, John K. Alstad and Chas. Brewer.

The Recorder reported that the report of the findings of the Viewers for the opening of C. S. 2nd and Canton Streets had been filed on June 5th 1911 with him.

Motion made & Carried That the required legal notice be given the editor of the Canby Tribune for publication in its next issue, and that the Council set Monday,

June 12, 1911 at 8 o'clock P.M. as the date for meeting to consider said report. Report of the results of the special election held May 27, 1911 was read and upon motion the report was accepted.

Street Commissioner was then given authority to sell Mr. Seramhin of Macksburg some of the oil for oiling the streets, if there was any to spare.

A discussion regarding the meaning and intent of the ordinance in reference to impounding cattle followed, after which the resignation of Chief of Police, J. S. Dick, was read and upon motion it was placed on the table.

Thereupon motion was made that the Recorder be instructed to reconstruct Ordinance #89;20 as to make it plain that the Chief of Police shall receive the fees collected for taking up stock.

Council adjourned.
