

Special Session of Council June 19, 1911

The City Council of Canby met on the 19th day of June¹⁹¹¹ at 8 o'clock P.M. Council~~led~~ was called to order by the Mayor, Dr. H.A. Dedman.

Upon roll call the following responded: Mayor, H.A. Dedman, Recorder C.F. Romig, Chief of Police, J. S. Dick; Councilmen: W.H. Bair, Wilson Evans, Joe Leiser, J.T. Eckerson, Warren Kendall, John K. Alstad and Chas. Bower.

City Attorney Stipp was present, and after examining the minutes and the published amendment providing for opening streets, etc which was voted on at our last City's regular election, Dec. of 1910, he decided that there were flaws which left the City with no provisions, except those that it previously had before passing this amendment to the City Charter; therefore no action was taken on the report of the Viewers in reference to opening "C", 1st and 2nd and Fulton Streets.

The subject of setting off fireworks within the City limits was brought up and discussed.

Motion made and carried that a resolution be drawn prohibiting the firing of firecrackers and other dangerous fireworks on the streets and around the depot grounds in the City of Canby, and that such resolution be posted.

Motion made and carried that the chairs in the hall be reinforced and repaired.

The subject of a Road to the Fair Grounds was then discussed.

Motion made that the Recorder and Mayor confer with Mr. Herman Lee and learn from him what he is willing to do to give us such a road over his grounds.

Motion made and carried that the Recorder and Street Commissioner, O.R. Mack, confer with The I.P.R.R. Co. and

secure if possible lower rates.

Motion instructed removing and allow as far as applicable.

Motion made that the Recorder be instructed to take up the matter of removing the fence & cattle guard and allow their right of way to be open as far as where the new crossing appt field is to be.
