

Regular Session of Council June 6th 1910

Council called to Order at 8 P.M. by H. A. Dedman Mayor.

Present: Mayor H. A. Dedman, Recorder Chas H. Naitz, Chief of Police J. S. Dick, and Councilmen: Bair, Gilmore, Evans, Knight, Mack ^{and} Weeks, Graham —

Minutes of previous Council then read and approved.

Upon report of Committee on Streets & Pub property Weeks said open water ditches were being complained of and demand was being made by Citizens that they be filled up either by the water Company or by the City. Councilman Gilmore also made remarks along the same line.

A Motion was Made, Seconded and Carried that the Water Co be allowed until the next Council Meeting (July 5th) next to fill up said ditches with water pipe or otherwise. And that if said Water Co did not fill up said ditches by July 5th 1910 that the City should proceed to do so at its own expense and charge the amt so expended, to the Water Co, holding a franchise from the City.

Stark Supt Kendall made report on Condition of Side walk from Torpake Corner to South line of City, along Foods Bridge Road. It was Moved and Carried that Stark Supt, ^{and} Committee on Streets and Pub property tear up said walk and build new one from Cemetery Road South to South line of City limits, said walk to be constructed of either plank or gravel, to be determined by the Committee on Streets & Public property.

Gilmore talked in regard to sewerage ditch from Karpisch Brewery. Referred to Committee on Health & Police.

Mr Bair Moved ^{and} it was Seconded and carried, That a certain amount be expended

for the improvement of the ~~boundary~~ ^{road} on the South side of Rail Road Tracks from Maltese Road East to the Suel Corner, the amount to be expended for said improvement not to exceed (\$50.00)
