

Reg. Session July 6th 1909.

The City Council Met in Reg. Session, on Tuesday July 6th 1909. (the first Monday July 5th being a legal Holiday) and was called to order at 8:20 O'clock P.M. by the Mayor J.F.M. Present: The Mayor, Recorder and Chief of Police and Councilmen, Bair, Bates, Fisher, Gilliam, Graham, Hilton, Wait and Evans.

The Minutes of last reg. meeting stood approved except, as to the omission of stating, that A.G. Long be notified, in writing, that the motion, to accept the chemical Engine, was declared lost.

After which: a "Referendum Petition," signed by fifty citizens of Canby, and directed to the Recorder of Canby, requesting that the Ordinance, preventing Cattle from running at large, shall be referred to the people of Canby for their approval or rejection.

The next annual city Election Dec. 6th 1909, was read by the Recorder; whereupon it was Moved and Seconded, that the Referendum Petition be accepted, which Motion Carried, & was so ordered.

After which, a communication from A.G. Long of Portland, was read, in reference to the acceptance of the Chemical Fire Engine, the Contract ^{heretofore} entered,

by the respective parties for the purchasing of same, was also read, and after due consideration: Motion was made by Councilman Wait, that the Motion of the last council meeting made for the acceptance of the Engine, and was lost, by a vote of 4 to 3, be reconsidered; the motion was duly seconded, and put to a vote, which was carried in favor of reconsideration.

A vote of 5 to 3, and was so declared;

After which, a motion was made by Councilman W.H. Bair, that the Chemical Fire Engine be accepted, provided; that the said Engine does as good work as any other machine of its kind and size will do, and that a committee be appointed by the Mayor to investigate, and ascertain the facts, and report at the next meeting, which was duly seconded, and a vote was taken, which resulted in 6 votes being cast in favor of the motion, and 2 votes against the motion: Councilmen Fisher & Hilton voting.

The motion was declared Carried; and the Mayor appointed Councilmen S.J. Fisher, Chas. J. Bates & W.H. Bair, on the Committee of investigation.
