

The City Council Met in Regular Session on the 4th day of Oct. 1909, and was called to order by the Mayor J F Mills at 8 O'clock P.M.

Present. The Mayor, Recorder and Chief Baty, and Councilmen W.H. Bair, C.A. Bats, S.J. Fisher H.C. Gillmore, J.A. Graham, F.H. Hilton and H.W. Evans absent - Chas. N. Wait,

Minutes of last reg. Meeting read & stood approved, The City Treasurer's Report for 3^d Quarter of 1909, was read, and accepted & placed on file, After which the following Claims against the City were read, Audited, and Ordered paid by unanimous vote of all Councilmen present, and that Warrants be drawn for payment theretofore.

In the matter of Cart & Tank for fire protection the Committee on Fire and Water were granted more time to procure the same, the cost thereof, not to exceed \$35.00 and for the housing of said Cart and Tank, the enlarging of building was left in charge of same Committee, and the Committee on Streets & Public property were instructed to fit windows in City Hall.

The Committee on Health & Police reported that dog-pound had not been constructed as yet, more time was granted to have it done,

In the Matter of Resignation of Claude Baty as Chief of Police, laid over from last meeting. It was by motion, duly seconded and carried, that the Resignation be accepted, and that a New Chief be Elected in his place;

whereupon Gco. W. Hoyt was placed in nomination for Chief of Police to fill the vacancy & whereupon it was moved & seconded that rules be suspended, and that the Recorder Cast a ballot for Gco. W. Hoyt. Motion Carried; the Recorder Cast a ballot for Gco. W. Hoyt, and was declared duly Elected, by the Mayor,

In the matter of the Albany Creamery Co.
asking permission to put drain tiling
across first street at the Bernasser property
in front of lot 2. Block 1. leading into the
ditch on front street, was granted.

In the matter of a sidewalk to be built
in front of lot 1. Block 4. on first Street,
It was, by motion, duly seconded & carried
that Frank Aspinwall be notified accordingly.
In the matter of filling in the crosswalk
at North end of G.E. Braddell's new sidewalk
leading across 4th Street to S.E. corner of the
Schoolhouse Block. (and also at S. end of sidewalk)
It was moved and seconded that the Street
Supt. be instructed to fill in said
crosswalk, and use gravel on top if
deemed necessary. the motion carried
and was so ordered.

In the matter of the proposed Ordinance No. 90.
regulating the use of public streets, sidewalks,
and railway crossings: the ordinance
was read second time, and by motion, duly
seconded and carried, section 3. of said
ordinance was amended, excepting children
express wagons, used for delivery purposes.
such wagons not to exceed 75 lbs in weight;
propelled or used upon any of the sidewalks
abutting on platted lots & blocks of Canby.

and that Sec 5 be amended to read as follows:
(Sec. 5. That Ordinance No. 34. of the City of Canby,
be, and the same is hereby repealed, and
that this ordinance shall take effect, and
be in force from and after its final passage

and approval by the Mayor, was ordered to be
posted again as amended to appear on final page of the Nov. 1st 1909.
In the matter of Bonding the City for building
and maintaining waterworks: It was by
Motion duly seconded and carried:

that the recorder be authorized to post notices
in 3. public places in the City of Canby. notifying
the legal voters of Canby, that a vote will
be taken at the next general City Election in Dec.
1909. to vote for or against Bonding the City of Canby
in a sum, not to exceed \$10,000.00 for the purpose of building
and maintaining waterworks. = Council then adjourned in due form
