

The City Council Met in Reg. Session. on the 8th day of Dec. 1909, and was called to order at 8 O'clock P.M. by the Mayor J. F. Mitts. Present. The Mayor. Recorder and Chief. Hoyt, and Councilmen W. H. Bair, Chad J. Bates, H. C. Gullmore, J. A. Graham, C. N. Wait and H. W. Evans, Absent. S. T. Fisher and F. H. Hilton, The Minutes of the last reg. & special meetings were read and stood approved as read, after which, business as follows, was transacted, To wit: In the matter of communication with S. P. Company in reference to permitting the City to take gravel from the gravel pit, provided it was taken from the bottom of the old pit not to exceed 20 wagon loads per month, and also, in reference to a street light at ~~spot~~. It was by motion duly seconded and carried that the permit, to take gravel, be accepted as being satisfactory, and in reference to the street light, the Recorder was instructed to inform the S. P. Co, that the City had put up the four street lights as heretofore contemplated and that the S. P. Co. could now inspect the same with a view of putting one up at the Depot in Canby. After which Two reports of the Street Superintendent were read by the Recorder, one in reference to Poll tax collections, and the other in reference to roadwork & Moved and seconded that the reports be accepted and that the Supervisor go ahead and complete the graveling on first street, Carried, also to see that sidewalk in front of Block No. 4, be repaired, & to notify G. H. Brown Admstr. accordingly. The Committee on Streets & P. P. reported that an insurance Policy had been written up, on the City Hall, at their request, which Policy was read by the Recorder, after which, by Motion duly seconded and Carried, the Policy was accepted, and that the advance claim of \$31.50 on said insurance policy be ordered paid along with other claims & all claims against the City were then read by the Recorder & audited by the Council, as follows:

After which, the proposed Tax Levy Ordinance No. 91, was brought up and read second time, and by motion duly seconded and carried placed on final passage, a vote was taken, and the Ordinance passed the Council by 6 votes, all councilmen present voted yes, and was declared passed by the Mayor J. F. Mitto, who then immediately approved the Ordinance, and the Recorder was instructed to notify the County Clerk "F. W. Greenman," of the five (5) mill tax levy for municipal purposes, &c,

After which; the City Election returns were
opened, and read by the Recorder +

Ordinance No. 89, was declared as ratified,

and that Certificates of Election be issued by the Recorder to the foregoing named Candidates for the respective Offices to which they have been declared Elected,

after which, the Committee on Streets & P.P. was instructed, (by Motion, 2nd & carried,) to Erect ^{a City Pound} and make suitable corals & stalls, and fences around the old jail lot on 3rd St. Lees addition, and have the same finished and ready for use by Jan'y 1st 1910, and that after said date, Ordinance No. 89, shall be enforced, after which it was Moved 2nd & carried that the Mayor, set a time and call a meeting of the Citizens for the purpose of organizing a fire company to take charge of the fire engine &c. The Mayor suggested next Wednesday evening, and after requesting Chief to fix jail windows; the Council adjourned. Wm. Knight Recorder.
