

First Reg. Session Jan'y 4<sup>th</sup> 1909.

The City Council met in first reg. session on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of January 1909, and was called to order at 8<sup>o</sup> O'clock P.M. by the Mayor J. F. Mitts. Present: The Mayor; Recorder, and J. S. Dick Chifffain; and Councilmen holding over: S. T. Fisher, F. H. Hilton, & Chas Lucke, ~~and the Newly Elected~~ Councilmen. W. H. Bain; Chas J. Bates; H. C. Gilmore & J. A. Graham and Chas. P. Wait, <sup>having been previously qualified, by taking and filing their</sup> Oaths of Office & Certificates of Election with the Recorder & Minutes of Last Special Meeting read & Stood Approved, after which; a petition was presented by the Recorder to the City Council; having been served on the City Recorder by the Chief of Police of Canby, which Petition was addressed to the Hon. Mayor and Council of Canby, and was subscribed and sworn to, before ~~Wm~~ Knight, a Notary Public, by the Petitioner E. J. Sias, protesting the election of Chas. J. Bates as City Councilman. The Petition (or contest) was ordered read, and also: an Opinim; written by Hon. Geo. C. Brownell, and confirmed by Hon. Gordon E. Hayes; in reference to said Contest; was read by the Recorder; and after the reading of the foregoing protest papers: it was moved by Councilman Wait, duly seconded by W. H. Bain, that a time & place be set for Settlement of Contest; which motion was carried, & after which, it was moved and seconded, that the time be set for one week from tonight which resulted in a vote of 3 to 3, and was declared Lost; after which it was moved and seconded, that the Case be settled tonight; which resulted in a vote of 3 for, & 3 against, (<sup>not voting</sup>) to which the Mayor cast his vote in the affirmative, and the motion was declared Carried; after which it was moved and seconded, that the Office of Councilman Chas Lucke be declared Vacant under Sec. 23. of the Charter, which resulted in a rising vote of 4 votes yes, against 3 votes no, and was declared Carried; after which it was moved, seconded and carried, by a standing vote of six councilmen, that the Council now proceed to take a vote upon the Sias vs. Bates contest case: whereupon the Mayor put the Question: "Shall Chas. J. Bates retain his seat as Councilman?" which was carried by 6 to 1, in the affirmative, & so declared.

after which the Council proceeded to the election of a  
Councilman to fill the vacancy of Charles Lucke's seat  
for the unexpired term ending 1<sup>st</sup> Monday in Jan'y. 1910.

The following persons were placed in nomination: Lucke & Eddie  
on 1<sup>st</sup> ballot; Lucke rec'd 3 votes. Sims 1. Roth 3. No election was declared,  
on 2<sup>d</sup> ballot Lucke rec'd 3 votes Sims 4. Roth having declined; no election  
on 3<sup>d</sup> ballot, Sims declined; Lucke rec'd 3 votes, Wilson Evans 4; no election  
on 4<sup>th</sup> ballot, Lucke declines; Wilson Evans rec'd 5 votes, H. Knight 1. Blank 1.

Wilson Evans was declared duly elected, having received  
a majority vote of the whole Council &  
Wilson Evans being present; it was by motion duly seconded  
and Carried, that he be qualified immediately by  
taking and filing his Oath of Office. The Oath of  
Office was administered by the Recorder, and  
the newly Elected Councilman took his seat.

After which: it was Moved and Seconded, that  
the "Ratification" of business transacted by the Old  
Council in reference to Franchise Ordinances

be postponed to the next reg. meeting in Feb'y. Carried.  
The Ordinance; to Police, Fire, trades & Callings; laid over to Feb'y. meeting.

After which: a petition, signed by 28. Citizens of Carly,  
was ordered read, asking for a gravel sidewalk

to be constructed along the easterly side of "A" Street,  
from 1<sup>st</sup> to 2<sup>d</sup> Street, and a streetlight be placed  
at Cor. of "A" and "3<sup>d</sup> Street," and after due  
consideration it was Moved and Seconded,

that the Street Commissioner, Notify property  
owners, along said proposed Gravel walk.

to construct a six-foot-wide board walk  
instead of a gravel walk along said street.  
in accordance with City Ordinance, Speci-

fying the kind and size of material to be used:  
~~also to notify N.W. Co. to move poles 6 feet from the fence~~  
The Motion Carried, and was so Ordered.

And in the matter of Additional Streetlights;  
it was Moved Seconded and Carried,

that the Committee on Streets & P. Property  
Notify the Aurora Electric Company to put  
up, not to exceed 5 lights, on the streets  
of Carly, at the direction of said Committee;

new streets & P.P. committee consisting of Councillor Bain, Bates & Graham  
as announced by the mayor.  
The Recorder's & Treasurer's annual reports were  
laid over to next reg. meeting in Feb'y;  
after which the Council proceeded to the election of Officers;

H.C. Gillmore was placed in nomination for President of the Council & no other nominations Moved and Seconded that rules be suspended and Recorder Cast a ballot for H.C. Gillmore as President of the Council - Motion Carried - Recorder cast a ballot, & Gillmore was declared Elected For City Recorder, William Knight <sup>was</sup> placed in nomination and by motion duly Seconded & Carried. rules were susp'd and the Chief of Police J.S. Dick. cast a ballot, and William Knight was declared Elected For Chief of Police - Claude Baty was placed in nomination, [W.R. Porter who declined], and by motion duly 2<sup>dly</sup> and carried. Claude Baty was duly elected by the Recorder Casting a ballot for Claude Baty, who was declared duly Elected by the Mayor; after which; Adam H. Knight and W.R. Porter were placed in nomination for Street Supt; a ballot was taken which resulted in five votes for A.H. Knight and three votes for Porter; Adam H. Knight was declared duly Elected as Street Superintendent, after which; the Mayor stated that he would announce the other Standing Committees at the next reg. meeting in Feb'y. The Council then adjourned in due form:
