In the matter of the rent collected from A. Kocher  
on lower room of City Hall, The finance Committee  
was instructed to investigate, and ascertain  
as to whether the rent had been collected up  
to Jan'y 12<sup>th</sup> 1909, or up to Dec, 12<sup>th</sup> 1908, and report  
their findings at the next reg. meeting in April.  
After which, upon motion duly seconded  
and carried, the Council adjourned  
in due form:

The Council met on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of April 1909  
and was called to order at 8 o'clock P.M.  
in reg. session, by Mayor J. F. Witts.  
A full council was present, except H.H. Hilton.  
Minutes of last meeting read & stood approved  
after which, the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarterly Report of the City Treasurer  
was read, and accepted, showing a bal. in  
the City Treasury March 31<sup>st</sup> 1909, of \$330,02- not  
including a certain check, of 20<sup>00</sup> not collected;  
after which the following claims against the  
city were read, audited and ordered paid  
by unanimous vote of all councilmen present.  
To wit. Claim of A. Kocher on last meeting = .50  
Claim of Recorder for March, <sup>72<sup>nd</sup></sup> reduced to 3.75-

Reg. Session, March 5<sup>th</sup> 1909, continued

The returns, of Spcl. City Election held March 20<sup>th</sup> 1909, were then opened, and read, and Canvassed, and by motion duly seconded and carried, were accepted, showing 46 to 48 votes to keep up Stock, The report of the finance committee in reference to rent collecting on lower part of City Hall, was heard, the report being verbal, and not compleat, no action was taken in the matter, awaiting further investigation by Committee,

The committee, on fire & water, reported that some of the fire extinguishers were damaged, and could not be used for extinguishing fires in their present condition, having been put out of Commission by the cold weather and freezing of last winter &c.

after which, the Committee on Streets & P. Property were instructed to look after the matter of the Horsesheds on "B." Street, which is reported as being a Nuisance, in the matter of obstructing the Sidewalks &c, also, to notify Mr. F. Gallenow that it would be in order to have a new Sidewalk constructed at lot. 1, Block 2, on 1<sup>st</sup> Street,

In the Matter of Leasing the lower story of the City Hall to J.J. Sandness, it is agreed by the City Council and A. Kocher, that the lease of A. Kocher be discontinued, and that a lease be granted to J.J. Sandness, for a term of five years, and that the Committee on Streets and Public Property is hereby instructed, by motion duly Seconded & Carried, to see to it that Lease be made, and executed in accordance with terms and conditions heretofore agreed upon by the respective parties,

In the Matter of Road work to be done, on the road leading from Carly to the North boundary line of the City limits, as stated by the Street Superintendent to be graded and repaired, in conjunction with the work to be done north of said line of the City limits by the Road Supervisor of Dist. No. 17. It was moved and seconded that the proposition be accepted, and that the work be done accordingly. Carried & After, which, a Copy of the Woodburn Ordinance, in reference to Stock running at large, was read; and the Recorder was instructed to conform the same to suit City of Carly

and to make some other changes, and have same ready for 1<sup>st</sup> reading, at regular meeting in May, 1909, and after instructing the Street Supervisor to repair 2<sup>nd</sup> street, at M.G. Church and East Boundary, the same will be adjourned in due form,
