

Residence. shall be New walks, and that portion running east along south side of Public Road, from Vorpahl's corner to the City limits, shall be repaired, and put in good order, provided however; that said New sidewalk to be constructed from R.R. Track to said Vorpahl's Residence, shall be not less than four (4) feet in width, and provided further: that the foregoing Motion is duly seconded and Carried, shall be deemed an Order to Construct, and repair sidewalks along the Streets, and Public roads designated; and that notices, to build such sidewalks, shall be given in accordance to Section's 63, & 64 of the City Charter of Canby;

In the Matter of working out their Road Poll tax: The Street Supt was authorized to allow such work to be done, at any place on the Streets, or roads, wherever, in his judgment; it may be required; after which, by motion duly seconded & Carried the Council adjourned.

The City Council met in Regular Session on the 6th day of July 1908, and was called to order by the Mayor at 8.30 O'clock P.M.:

Present: the Mayor; Recorder and Chief of Police and Councilmen: Bair, Riggs, Wait: Seas and Hilton: Absent: Fisher, Lucke and Weed: Minutes of last reg. Meeting read & stood approved; after which a Petition was presented; and read by the Recorder: which petition was signed by 48 Citizens of the City of Canby: directed to the Hon: Mayor & City Council; asking for the establishment of a Street and Crosswalk, across the R.R. Track south of the Depot = being an extension of "C" Street of Canby; and after due consideration, it was by Motion duly seconded and Carried, that the Petition be placed on file; and that the Recorder communicate with the R.R. Officials in reference to the matter, in order that the establishment of said Crossing could be proceeded with according to the prayer of the petitioners, & to the satisfaction of the R.R. Company;

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and that said crossing, and Road to be continued through other property, in a southeasterly direction, to terminate in, and intersect the street, known as O.R. Mack Street, provided that the property Owners along said proposed route will permit the said road to be established, and that the Committee on Streets & Public Property, are hereby instructed to interview the Owners of such property in reference to the establishment of said Road, & Report.

After which, an other and separate Petition was Presented, and read by the Recorder: which was signed by an equal number of Citizens, directed to the Mayor & City Council asking for a 60 ft. wide road to be laid out & established along the southerly side of the O. & C. R.R. Co's Depot Grounds; from the Howard Mill and Canby Road, to the Northwesterly corner of A. L. Snell's land, on the southerly or East side of the R.R. Tracks. And after due consideration, it was Ordered, by motion duly seconded & Carried that the petition be placed on file, and the Recorder communicate with the R.R. Officials in reference to the matter, and ascertain the wishes of said

Officials in reference to both Petitions. In the matter of the City report of City Treasurer time to report, was extended to next meeting. After which, the following Claims against the City were presented, read, Audited, and ordered paid by unanimous vote of the City Council, and warrants ordered to be drawn: To wit:

After which it was, by motion and 2nd Ordered that the Chief of Police procure a Lock for the City Jail; and put it on.

In the matter of repairing, and making new Sidewalks; the Street Supt A.H. Knight reported that Notices had been served on all parties as per, Order of last Council Meeting.

and that Mrs Lou. Grant asked for more time in which to build a new sidewalk; it was Moved; second, and Carried: that 30 days be allowed; after which it was Moved and seconded, that the Office of Frank Weed as Councilman be declared vacant; and that his successor be elected immediately: Carried;

C.J. Rath, and C.L. Bates were placed in nomination, a vote cast by ballot resulted in C.J. Rath receiving 4 votes and C.L. Bates one vote; the Mayor declared C.J. Rath duly Elected, and that Certificate of Election be issued accordingly: to hold office until next annual Election &c, =

after which the Council elected W. H. Bair as president of the Council, vice John Beck resigned = after which the Mayor placed E.J. Sias on fire & water Committee and C.V. Wait on Health & Police Committee.

The Council then adjourned in due form;
