

Reg. Session Aug. 3<sup>d</sup> / 08

The City Council met in Regular Session on the 3<sup>d</sup> day of Aug. 1908, and was called to Order at 8 O'clock P.M. by the Mayor:

Present: the Mayor, Recorder & Chief, and Councilmen Bair, Wait, Sias, Fisher, Hilton, Lucke, and the Newly Elected Councilman, "Chas J. Roth," who was elected by the City Council at the last meeting, to fill the vacancy of Frank Weed, whose office was declared vacant at said last meeting, the said C.J. Roth having been duly qualified by taking, and filing his Oath of Office, with the Recorder, previous to his entering upon the duties of his office as Councilman.

Minutes of last reg. Meeting were read & Stamped, after which, a communication from T.J. Gary, was read by the Recorder, in reference to the sum of Two Hundred and fifty Dollars, subscribed by the City Council, for Fifty Shares of Stock, to the Clackamas County Fair Association, and requesting the City Council to pay over to the Canby Bank & Trust Co., the said sum of Two Hundred and fifty Dollars: whereupon, after due consideration by the City Council, it was, by motion duly seconded and carried, that upon receipt of the Certificates of fifty shares of said stock, the money is to be paid to the Bank as requested, & after which, a warrant of (\$250.00) Two Hundred and Fifty dollars, was ordered to be drawn on the City Treasurer, in favor of said Fair association, by a vote of five, Councilmen voting for, and two against it; Bair, Wait, Sias, Fisher & Roth voted "yes;" and Hilton and Lucke voted "no;"

The Mayor declared the vote Carried, & so Ordered, after which the Treasurer's report for the 2<sup>d</sup> Rtr. 1908, was read by the Recorder and by motion duly seconded & carried, was ordered placed on file & after which, the Resignation of A. W. Riggs as Councilman, was read and by motion duly <sup>2<sup>d</sup> ded</sup> & Carried was accepted, and the office declared vacant.

Claims against the City of Canby were presented; read; and Audited by the Council

 and that Orders be drawn accordingly

The Committee on Streets & Public Property reported, that the Crosswalk, at the Bank across C. Street, needed some repairs, which should be fixed, whereupon it was Ordered by motion. 2<sup>d</sup> & Carried, that the Street Supervisor be instructed to repair said crossing, as the committee on Streets & public Property, may direct.

In the Matter of renewing the Lease of the lower story of the City Hall, to A. Kocher, for an other year, at the same terms and conditions of the present Lease which expires Sept. 12<sup>th</sup> 1908. It was by motion duly seconded and Carried that the Lease be granted for one year at the same terms, and that the Recorder be, and is hereby authorized to execute said Lease accordingly, on the part of the City, & was so Ordered.

After which, the Matter of assisting the Clackamas Fair Association, by donating Labor, Lumber or Money, for the purpose of building a fence around the Fair grounds, was brought up before the Council by R.S. Coe, L.D. Walker and many others; soliciting aid from the City Council of Canby in that direction, as well as from private individuals: And after Considering the Matter pro. & con. It was Moved & Seconded that the City of Canby donate One Hundred dollars towards building said fence; a vote was taken by the Council resulting in 4 votes for, & 3. against Bair, Wait, Sias & Roth, voting Yes, & Fisher, Hilton & Luckett No.

The Mayor declared the motion carried, & after which it was moved & Seconded to take up order of business auditing claim which was carried by 4, yes, and 3, no; & so Ordered. Whereupon it was Moved & Seconded that a warrant be drawn for One Hundred dollars in favor of the

"Clackamas County Fair association" and deposits the same with the Canby Bank & Trust company, to be used for the purpose of building said fence; a vote being taken which resulted in Councilman Bair, Wait, Sias & Roth voting Yes; and Fisher, Hilton & Lucke voted No. The Mayor declared the vote Carried, and was so Ordered.

The Council then adjourned in due form

Minutes of last Meeting read, & stood approved,

A Petition, was then read, signed by Leroy Walker, J.B. Howard H.A. Dedman, and 43 others, all representing to be legal residents of the City of Canby, Oreg., Addressed to the Hon. Mayor & City Council, Requesting that "C. Street" of the City of Canby, be extended from the Southerly side of the O.C.R.R. Co. Depot Grounds, in a southerly direction to the street known as "Mack's" or "Maple Street," and to be 80 feet in width, and conform with "C." Street of said town of Canby, &c. (here the Mayor apposed his signature)

And in connection with the foregoing petition,

W.H. Bair, one of the committee on Streets & Public Property, reported (verbally) that they had interviewed the owners of the property, in reference to establishing said road through their land, [as they were instructed to do, by the council at the Reg. meeting in July last, and to report] which report is: that Dr. H.A. Dedman was in favor of allowing the road to be established
