

Reg. Session Dec, 4th 1907,

The City Council met in Regular Session on the 4th day of Dec. 1907. and was Called to order by the Mayor L.D. Walker, at 7:30 o'clock P.M.
Present: The Mayor, Recorder & Chief of Police and Councilmen, Bair, Graham, Hampton, Riggs, Roth, Stogdill, Wait & Zeek, —

Minutes of last reg. & Spcl. Meetings were read, and stood approved (Except, that in the matter of an appropriation of \$75.00 being made by the City Council to the Band-Boys, for the purchase of Instruments; the instruments so purchased, should become the Property of the City of Canby.)

after which the Band-Committee reported that 14 instruments had been purchased costing \$144.00; also: for music 3.80. Box 1.25 and freight 95 cents: Grand total cost, \$150.00, one half of which amt. was to be appropriated by the City Council out of the Gen. fund.

After which the following Claims against the City of Canby were presented, read, and audited, and Ordered Paid by unanimous vote of the City Council,

Orders to be drawn on City Treasurer for same,

In the matter of putting in a crosswalk, on the west side of C. Street, across 2^d Street, from the corner of lot 1. Blk. 10, to cor. of lot 12. Blk. 3, in the City of Canby. It was by motion duly seconded and Carried, that the Street Supt. be instructed to put in said crosswalk, with the usual kind of material, also; Ordered that the Street Supt. repair & lower the sidewalk, at or near the Postoffice on first Street. Also, Ordered; that a suitable step or steps be placed at the side entrance of the City Hall door, and a substantial railing be erected along the sidewalk on the west side of the City Hall, leading from the sidewalk on first Street to the Truck House back of ^{City} Hall. Also; that an Electric Light, @ 16 candle power be erected and placed at, or near the side entrance of the City Hall.

In the matter of Repairing Hill-Road, at East end of New Bridge across the Molalla river, between Barlow & Canby, which matter was laid over from last reg meeting to this meeting for further consideration, and after due consideration, it was by motion duly seconded and Carried, that the City Council appropriate One hundred dollars out of the Genl fund, for the repair of said Hill-Road, provided that the County Court of Clackamas County appropriate a like amount for said repair; The work to be done under the Supervision of the Road Supervisor of road district No. 17 of Clackamas County, Oregon; and it was further resolved, that after the aforesaid amount shall have been all expended on said Hill road, and the Supervisor should find that a further appropriation would be necessary to put the said hill-road in good repair; the City Council would make a further appropriation, but not to exceed the sum of Seventy five dollars, = In the matter of repairing County road, leading north from the City of Canby, and within the City limits, it was moved & seconded that the City of Canby would stand one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) the expense of repairing said road, the total amount not to exceed Fifty dollars, motion Carried.

After which the City Council proceeded to canvass the City Election returns. The Tally Sheet of said City Election, held on the 2^d day of Dec. 1907, was read by the City Recorder, the City Council being satisfied in the premises, that said Tally Sheet had been duly filed in the Recorder's Office by the Election Board & duly certified to, as required by Law & and that according to said Tally Sheet, the following named persons received the number of votes set opposite their respective names, & for the office specified.

Whereupon it was, by Motion duly seconded and carried, that the same be declared Elected, and that Certificates of Election be issued accordingly

The City Council being satisfied in the matter of the vote on the City Charter and Bonding issue according to Tally Sheet, The Charter having received 98 votes in the affirmative, and for the Bond issue 58 votes, being a Majority vote for the City Charter, and Bonding issue, The Council declared said Measures Carried, and adopted by unanimous vote; Whereupon the Mayor, L. D. Walker (being satisfied that the Charter rec^d 98 votes for, and Eleven votes against the same, and the Bonding issue rec^d 58 votes for, and 51 votes against the same) forthwith issued his proclamation declaring said Charter and Bonding Measure as a whole, to be in full force and Effect as a law of the City of Canby, Clackamas Co. Oregon, from the Fourth (4th) day of Dec. 1907, that being the day of said proclamation. After which, the Recorder was instructed and Authorized to have one hundred (100) copies, of the said New Charter, printed and bound in pamphlet form, by unanimous vote of the Council, and so Ordered —

after which the Council adjourned in due form,
