

The City Council met in Special Session on the 19th day of March 1907. and was called to order at 8 O'clock P.M. by the Mayor, V.L. Mack, on roll call there were present: Mayor V.L. Mack, and the newly Elected Chief of Police, J.S. Dick, (his Bond having been filed and accepted, together with his Oath of Office); Wm Knight Recorder, and Councilmen. Riggs, Roth, Graham, Beck, wait and Bair; ^{at} ~~at~~ ^{Hampton} Minutes of last Meeting read & stood approved, after which the resignation of J.S. Dick, as Councilman was presented, read, and accepted by the Council, and immediately Ordered, by Motion, duly seconded, that a new Councilman be Elected to fill vacancy, whereupon H.K. Stogsdill was placed in nomination and the Council proceeded to ballot, which resulted in the Election of H.K. Stogsdill as Councilman, and was so declared by the Mayor, as unanimous, said H.K. Stogsdill, being immediately notified of his election, appeared forthwith, and was qualified, by taking the Oath of Office, administered by the Recorder, and after subscribing his name thereto, was filed in Recorder's Office, and the newly Elected Councilman took his seat +

After which the Claim, of Ernest P. Rando against the City of Lanby, for Surveying, and erecting monuments in the Street, a plat of Lanby, profiles, and drawing up Ordinances, &c to the Amount of fifteen and 85/100 dollars. (\$16.85) was presented, Audited, and Ordered paid by unanimous Vote of the Council + and also: Ordered that the Mayor should see to it, and have the plat of Lanby suitably framed, with a glass over it, and ~~hang~~ ^{place} it into the City Hall on the wall +

after which the following Ordinances were proposed, and read first time:

to wit:

1st An Ordinance Regulating Salary & fees of Chief of Police; read first time, and ordered passed. to come up April 1st for final passage +

2^d an Ordinance: forbidding, holding + storing or Keeping powder, & other explosives: in the City limits &c was read 2^d time. and placed on its final passage, a ballot was taken: and was lost by unanimous vote.

after which an Ordinance, to Establish Monuments at intersection of certain designated Streets; was read first time; and the motion, which was made & seconded to lay over to next Meeting was lost; a motion was then made, and duly seconded; to have the Ordinance posted and was Carried, and to come up for final passage at the next reg. meeting in April, 1907.

After which; an Ordinance, to provide for the width, and manner of Constructing Sidewalks in Canby, was read first time. The motion to pass the Ordinance was lost and the Motion Made, and seconded, for the Ordinance to be laid on the table; Carried. An Ordinance, defining the Base of Elevation and establishing the grade of first & C Street was read first time, and by motion, duly seconded and Carried, was Ordered posted to come up for final passage at reg. Meeting in April. After which; it was by motion duly seconded and Carried that the "Jail Building," now standing on the Old Lot in the easterly part of the City, be removed from said lot and placed on lot, po. 10, Blk. No. 8, in the City of Canby, and that an addition be built to the jail building, and that the said Old lot be sold, at a price, as the City Council may be willing to take for the same, and that an Ordinance be drawn up, accordingly for the consideration of the Council at next reg. Meeting and that the committee on Streets & Public Property, is to see to it, that the jail building be removed accordingly.

And in the matter of having the City Charter amended in reference to establishing a "Recorder's Court," and other matters of importance, it was Moved Secd & Carried, that the Mayor appoint a committee to fix up the Charter, so that it can be placed before the People, for a vote on the same, at a city Election to be held hereafter. Said committee may employ an attorney to assist them in fixing up the Charter for that purpose, the Mayor appointed on said committee; Councilmen, Ezek. Riggs, and Bair. Council then adjourned in due form to meet in Reg. Session April 1st 1907.
