

The City Council met in reg. session on the 2^d day of Sept. 1907. and was Called to Order by the Mayor V.L. Mack at 8 O'clock P.M. The Mayor, Recorder, and Chief of Police and all of the Councilmen were present, excepting Councilman H.K. Stopdill. Minutes of last meeting read & then approved.

After which the following Claims against the City were read, Audited, and Ordered paid, by unanimous vote of the Council:

The Claim of A. Koehler Agent for Home Insurance Co for insurance of City Hall for the Ensuing year for the amount of \$52.50 was not allowed, and by Motion, duly seconded and Carried, was referred to the Committee on Street & P.P. with power to insure for a less amount.

After which, a proposal, of M.J. Lee was submitted to the City Council for the privilege to lay pipe lines in the City limits of Canby Oregon, and after considering the matter, it was by motion duly seconded & Carried, that an Ordinance be submitted to the City Council at their next reg Meeting.

In the matter of Regulating the R.R. Trains, and Locomotives running through the town Canby, It was suggested that an Ordinance be drawn up, to the effect that trains should not run through the Corporation limits of Canby at a greater speed than Six Miles an hour, and that trains No. 16 and 13, should come to a full stop, &c.

After which the Mayor V.L. Mack, tendered his resignation as Mayor of the City of Canby (verbally) stating that he was about to remove from the City before the next regular Meeting of the City Council in Oct. which resignation was, by motion, duly seconded and Carried, Accepted, and the Office of Mayor declared vacant, and that an Election be immediately held to fill the vacancy. Leroy D. Walker was placed in nomination for Mayor.

and the Council proceeded to vote by ballot which resulted in the Election of Leroy D. Walker by a ^{vote} unanimous of all Councilmen present, Seven ~~votes~~ being cast for Leroy D. Walker, and so declared by the President of the Council, C. N. Wait and that a Certificate of Election be issued accordingly. After which the Council adjourned in due form, to meet in regular session October 7th 1907.
