

1st Regular Meeting Jan'y 2^d 1906 Continued.

After which, the following Claims against the City, were presented, read, and Audited, And Ordered paid by unanimous Vote of the Council, to wit

Claim of Recorder "Wm Knight. Sal. & fees.	\$13.00
" " Carlton & Rosenkrans. Supplies	1.40
" " H.A. Lee Treasurers percentage &c.	5.50
" " James Evans. Chief of Police, Salary, &c.	8.10
Total amt of Orders drawn =	\$27.90

The Bonds of Treasurer and Assessor were then read, and by motion, duly seconded, were accepted and approved by the Council, After which three (3) Applications for Saloon License were read, as follows to wit: Application of Jacob Michel was first read, having been filed with the Recorder of Canby, on the 14th day of Dec. 1905, for a License to Sell Spirituous & Malt Liquors within the Corporate limits of Canby, in quantities less than One quart for the 1st Qtr. of 1906, on lot to. 2. Block to. one, on first street in the City of Canby Oreg.

The Council being satisfied in the premises, that Notices had been posted, and the receipt of the City Treasurer had been filed with the Recorder, together with his Bond; and after accepting his Bond, the Council proceeded to vote on the application of Jacob Michel, which resulted in a vote of seven for granting the license as applied for, and one vote against granting license, wherefore it was ordered that the Recorder issue a License to Jacob Michel accordingly, =

After which the Application of H.K. Tackleson for a License, to Sell Spirituous and Malt liquors, in Canby, for the first Quarter of 1906, at the Corner of first and C Streets, on lot 6. Bl. 2. in quantities less than One quart, was duly granted by the City Council, by a vote of six (6) Councilmen for, and two votes against a license: the Council having been satisfied, that Notices had been posted, and the money received for, and his bonds filed, which bond was accepted and approved by the Council, and that the Recorder issue a License accordingly, =

The application of Frank Astmann was then taken up for consideration. The Council being satisfied that application had been properly made, Notices posted according to law, and the Treasurers receipt filed with the Recorder, and that his bond would be filed with the Recorder next day, (that is, Jan'y 3^d 1906) The Council granted ~~a~~ License to said Frank Astman, to sell Liquors in Canby according to his application, for the 1st Qtr. of 1906, and that the Recorder issue such license to Frank Astmann, upon filing his bond with the Recorder on or about the 3^d day of Jan'y. 1906, to sell Spirituous and Malt Liquors, at his place of business, on lot, 1, Bl. 4, cor. of first and ~~D~~ Streets: in the town of Canby Oregon.

The Council then proceeded to Elect City Recorder, Chief of Police, Street Superintendent, and Regular policemen, as follows
A ballot was taken for City Recorder by the Council, which resulted in six (6) votes being cast for Chas. N. Wait, who was declared duly Elected, after which; James Evans received Five (5) votes for Chief of Police, and was declared duly Elected, George Kesseling received Seven (7) votes for Street Supt., who was declared Elected, After which, it was moved, seconded & carried that H. C. Gillmore be declared elected as Regular policeman, and so Ordered; and that the Recorder issue Certificates of Election to all of the officers so Elected for the ensuing year, After which the Mayor Announced the Appointment of the following Standing Committees
