

Regular Session Jan'y 3<sup>d</sup> 1905-

The City Council met in first regular session January 3<sup>rd</sup> 1905. And was called to order at 7:30 P.M. Present: the Mayor, Recorder, and Chief of Police, and R. Fenton & Chas. J. Roth Councilman holding over, and the Newly Elected Members, who having previously been qualified, by taking & filing their Oaths of Office, to wit, Cornelius Bair, Andrew Kocha, Chas Lucke James Phegley and A. W. Riggs. Absent: A. J. Knight Minutes of last reg. meeting read, & Stood Approved, After which, a Petition, signed by J. J. Schmitt, L. R. Dimick, and 48. Others, was presented, for consideration by the Council, praying for a sidewalk to be established from corner of lot 1, block 4, <sup>on 1st st.</sup> to corner of lot 12 block 16, on 4<sup>th</sup> Street. and after the reading, and consideration of said petition, it was, by Motion duly seconded, and carried laid on the table. = After which, the Council considered a further Proposition, to build sidewalks, commencing at corner of lot 1, bl. 2, on first & B. st. to cor. of lot 1, bl. 11, on Second St, thence along north side of Second street, to corner of lot 1, Bl. 8, on E. street, also, from cor. of lot 1, Bl. 4, on D. st. to cor. of lot 1, Bl. 9. And from cor. of lot 6, bl. 4, on E. street, to lot 6, bl. 9, on Second street, including all intermediate crosswalks, which proposition was accepted, by a Motion, duly seconded and carried, sidewalks to be left wide, also, Moved, seconded and carried, that the lumber and material for building said side, and cross walks, be furnished by the City of Cauley, and that the Committee on Streets & Pub. property be instructed to ascertain the amount of lumber required, and to recommend plans and specifications for the building of said walks, and to report to the City Council at their next special meeting to be held on Tuesday the 10<sup>th</sup> day of Jan'y 1905, at the usual time and place.

Jan'y 3<sup>rd</sup> Reg. Session continued:

The City Treasurers Annual, and 4<sup>th</sup> quarterly reports for the year 1904, were then read, examined and ordered placed on file.

And the Annual financial statement, of the Recorder, for the year 1904, was also presented, and read, showing the receipts & disbursements for the year, and the number and amount of City warrants issued, and for what purpose, which report was duly accepted and placed on file. After which the following Claims against the City were read, and Audited, and ordered paid by unanimous vote of the Council.

Wait, having made a statement in reference to collection of road money from the County, that he found no desission, on record of any Court, against collecting road funds &c, so it was by motion duly seconded and Carried, that the City proceed to collect the road funds, from the County, due the City of Caubly,

Reg. Session Jany 3<sup>a</sup> 1905 Continued.

The Bond, of Heman A Lee, as City Treasurer for the ensuing year, and the Bond of George Knight as Assessor & Collector were presented and read, and duly accepted, and approved by the Council, after which, the Applications of Frank Astman and H.S. Jackson, which had been duly filed in the Recorders Office, on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of Dec. 1904, directed to the Hon. City Council of Caufus, for a License to Sell Spirits & Malt Liquors within the Corporation of Caufus, in quantities less than one quart, for the 1<sup>st</sup> Qtr of 1905, were read by the recorder, and after due consideration by the Council, and being satisfied in the premises, that Notices had been posted according to law, and the receipts of the City Treasurer, for the sum of One hundred dollars, each, had been filed with the City Recorder, and that the Bonds of Each applicant had been filed as required in the sum of Five hundred dollars, each, whereupon, it was moved and seconded, that the Bonds be accepted and approved, and a License granted to Each applicant, for the 1<sup>st</sup> Qtr. of 1905 as applied for, whereupon the Council proceeded to vote upon the Motion, which resulted in five (5) votes being cast in favor of the Motion, and two (2) votes against the Motion. The Motion was declared Carried, and that License be issued accordingly; after which the Council proceeded to the election of Officers. The election of a President of the Council, resulted in the electing of A.W. Ruggs on the second ballot, receiving four votes. And for City Recorder, - William K. Knight received four (4) votes, and Chas. V. Wait received three (3) votes, William K. Knight was declared duly Elected Recorder.

Special Session Jan 10<sup>th</sup>, 1905

The City Council met in Special Session on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of Jany 1905, & called to order at 7:30 PM,

Present the Mayor Recorder & Chief of Police and a full Council, except A.J. Knight.

Minutes of last reg. meeting stood approved.

After which the "Report" of the Committee on Streets & Public property, in the matter of the proposed Side, & Crosswalks, was heard:

Which report stated that it would require 30,300 feet of lumber to construct said proposed walks, and that the same could be had at \$9.00 per M. for surfaced, & \$8.00 per M. for rough lumber.

& the total cost of lumber, about = \$257.26

and recommending 1½ in by 8 in & 6 ft. long (surfaced) for sidewalk, and 2 x 6 in (rough) for stringers & 4 x 4 in 6 ft long for blocking under sidewalk, and for crosswalks to use 3 x 12 in, and to use cull ties for blocking under & walks,

and after <sup>due</sup> consideration it was ordered that one half of the 4 x 4 in blocking, be changed to 2 x 4 in, and so Ordered;

which would make the total no. of feet of lumber 29,516 feet, and the cost reduced to \$250.20

after which it was moved 2<sup>d</sup> & Carried

the each property owner should lay down the sidewalk, along the lots, according to plans furnished by the City; and upon refusing to do so, that the labor

be done by the City, and assessed to the property owners, and placed on the law docket and collected accordingly; and that

the Recorder draw up an Ordinance for the building of said walks in accordance therewith!

and bring it up at next special meeting to be held Jan 16<sup>th</sup>

and after Electing J.A. Graham & J.S. Dick as Reg. Policemen =

the Council adjourned in due form, Wm. Knight Recdr.

The Council met in Special session on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of Jan'y 1908, as per previous adjournment, and was called to order by the Mayor at 7:30 P.M.

Present, a full Council excepting A. J. Knight.

Minutes of last Spcl. meeting stood approved.

The Special business, for which the Council met, to consider, being the matter of passing an ordinance for the Construction of the proposed side, and crosswalks, and after due consideration, it was ascertained that in order to conform with the requirements of the City Charter in building sidewalks, it would prolong the time in which the side and crosswalks could be constructed if any part of the work should be assured to the owners of the property, so it was concluded to have an ordinance passed for the City to pay the expense out of the general fund, for sidewalks amounting to about \$1054.80 for the lumber.

The Committee on St. & P.P. having made an estimate of a requirement of about 30,000 feet of lumber, which amount was ordered according to Bill on file, A proposed Ordinance was then read first time, and by unanimous vote of the Council, was ordered posted, to come up for final action at next reg. Meeting in Feb'y, and after granting permission to the New Era Mutual Telephone Co. to put up poles along Co roads within Corporate limits of Caufy, the Council adjourned in due form.

Reg. Session Feb'y 6<sup>th</sup> 1905

The City Council met on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of Feb'y 1905, and was called to order at 7:30 P.M.

Present the Mayor Recorder and Chief of Police, and a full Council, excepting Chas Lucke. Minutes of last Spec. Session stood approved, after which the following Claims against the City were Audited, and ordered paid by unanimous vote of the Council, to wit;

After which, the proposed Side, & crosswalk Ordinance was read second time, and placed on its final passage; and passed the Council by a unanimous vote.

After which, an ordinance for the regulation of Chief of Police Salary, was read first time, and by Motion duly Seconded and Carried was Ordered to be posted, to come up at next reg Meeting.

After which, a Franchise Ordinance was introduced by R. Stanton, and was read first time, purporting to authorize the Canby Improvement Co. ~~their~~ successors or assigns to lay mains, & spouts in Canby to conduct water; and after due consideration was ordered posted by a unanimous vote, to come up for final action, at the next Reg. meeting in ~~March~~

After which, the Health & Police Committee was requested to examine the city jail bldg. and report its condition at the next council meeting in March,

In the Matter of the renting of the lower Store-room of the City Hall. It was moved, seconded and carried; that Andrew Kocher have the privilege of renting said Storeroom for another year at the same rate as now, after the present term of lease has expired; after which; it was by Motion duly seconded and carried that. A. H. Knight, Supt. of Streets. be Authorized to take the City Charter in hand, to have it amended in proper shape, in reference to Road Money and for the expenditure of the same, and the establishment of roads, highways & streets in the corporate limits of Caubyn, and for the election of City Officers by the general City Elections, &c, provided that the same may be, or can be amended by the present session of the State Legislature. Also, Moved, seconded and carried, that the Aurora Electric Company, may light the street lamp on First & "D" Streets same as the other two on First Street, at the expense of the City of Caubyn, until otherwise ordered by the Council.

The Council then adjourned in due form; to meet in Reg. Session on first Monday in March 1905

The City Council met in Reg. session on Monday the 6<sup>th</sup> day of March 1905, and was called to Order by the Mayor at 7:45 P.M.

In the Matter of Second reading of the Ordinance Regulating Chief of Police Salary & fees, was, after due Consideration, placed on its final Passage and Passed the Council by ~~unanimous~~ Vote,

In the Matter of the Franchise Ordinance, Authorizing the "Cauly Improvement Co." which Company's name was Substituted by the name of "Aurora Electric Company" its Successors and Assigns, to Lay mains and pipes in the Streets, alleys and Public places of the City of Cauly, &c.

was read Second time, and by motion duly seconded and carried, was placed on its final passage, and Passed the City Council by unanimous vote, and so declared by the Mayor:

In the Matter of the Report of the Committee on Health & Police. Said Committee asked for time until next reg. meeting in April to report on the Condition of the City jail, which time was granted.

In the Matter of Establishing future rates and prices, for Hallrent to Shows, lectures, entertainments and other purposes, it was ordered, by motion duly seconded and carried, that the Mayor appoint a Special Committee of 5, to make out a scale of rates and prices for that purpose, and report the same to the City Council at the next reg. meeting in April. The Mayor then appointed the following named persons on said Committee, to wit: A.J. Knight, Wm. Knight, E.C. Shull, A.W. Riggs and James Piegley.

In the Matter of Hallrent, for Dancing: it was ordered, by motion, duly seconded and carried that the price of City Hall rent for an all night dance, shall be Five dollars, and up to midnight the price shall be Four Dollars, after which the Chief of Police was instructed to Notify proprietors of Candy Stores, and other places in the City of Canby, to stop, and discontinue Card playing, and Dice Shaking in their respective places of business, on Sundays,

And, after requesting the Recorder to draw up a Curfew Ordinance, for consideration at the next reg. meeting in April, the Council adjourned in due form - Wm. Knight, Recorder

The City Council met in Reg Session April 3<sup>rd</sup> 1905 and was called to order at 8 o'clock P.M. by the Hon Mayor. A full Council was present, excepting Councilmen Fauten, Knight and Phegley — and after the reading of, and approval of the last Minutes of regular meeting in March, proceeded to transact the following business, the reading of Treasurers Quarterly report for the first Quarter of 1905, showing a bal. on hand at end of Quarter to be — \$ 273.08 which report was accepted and placed on file; after which the following Claims were audited and Ordered paid, and warrants drawn for the payment of same, to wit:

The Committee on Health and Police, to whom the matter of reporting on the condition of City jail, was referred, made a verbal report, stating, that the City jail was in a bad condition, and that it would require some repairs to place it in a proper condition. The Council not being fully advised in the premises at this time, the matter was left for future consideration.

After which, a Curfew Ordinance was read first time and by motion duly seconded and carried, was ordered passed, to come up for final passage at next reg meeting in May, 1905;

Also: an Ordinance, was read first time, granting unto the Portland General Electric Company, the right

to erect poles, and string wires thereon for the purpose of transmitting electrical current upon the streets and alleys of the City of Canby which was ordered posted, by motion Sec<sup>2</sup> & carried, and to come up for final action on Monday May 1<sup>st</sup> 1905 in regular session, —

After which, two applications for Liquor License were read, one from Frank Actmann and one from H.R. Jackson, for the 2<sup>d</sup> Oct. of 1905, Said applications having been filed with the Recorder on the 15<sup>-th</sup> day of March 1905.

The Council having said matter under advisement, and being satisfied in the premises, that notices had been posted according to law, and the receipts of the Treasurer had been filed with the recorder, together with the Bonds duly executed, it was ordered by unanimous vote of the Council that the Bond of each applicant be accepted, approved and placed on file, and that a License be granted to each applicant for the 2<sup>d</sup> Oct of 1905, to sell Spirits and Malt liquors within the Corporation of Canby, in quantities less than one quart at their respective places of business as prayed for.

After which: the Acceptance of the terms and conditions of Ordinance No. 69, by the Aurora Electric Company, filed April 3<sup>d</sup> 1905, was ordered placed on file +

After which, the Committee's report, on prices of Hall rent for Shows, Entertainments &c. was accepted by the Council, and ordered put on file, as follows

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The City Council met in reg Session in (K.E.S Hall) on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of Dec 1905, and was called to order by the Mayor at 7:30 P.M.

Present, the Mayor, Recorder and Chief of Police and Councilmen, Bair, Knight, Strother, Lucke, Phegley, Riggs and Rath, absent, Hilton + Minutes of last reg. & spcl Meetings were read and Stood approved as read.

Dick rec'd 55 votes, J. A. Graham rec'd 49 votes, Fred Hampton 50 votes, & Chas. J. Roth rec'd 65 votes, and who were declared duly Elected for Councilmen + H. C. Gillmore rec'd 48 votes, F. H. Hilton 35, and Wm. Vorpshe 45, votes, for Councilmen, the council then adjourned, to meet on Dec. 29<sup>th</sup> 1905, to transact business usual by the outgoing council at end of year = Wm.
