

Minutes of first Reg. Meeting of City Council Jan'y 4th 1904.

The City Council Met on the 4th day of Jan'y 1904. at 8:30 P.M. in Regular Session. and was Called to order by the Hon Mayor, H. C. Gillmore, the Newly Elected Mayor, who Having been previously Qualified, by taking the prescribed Oath of Office, and filing same with the Recorder; and at Roll Call, the full Council answered to their names, being Called, to wit: H. C. Gillmore Mayor J. A. Graham Chief of Police, Wm Knight Recorder; and Councilmen Holding over, were J. Hampton E. J. Shab and Chas. T. Wait - and the Newly Elected Councilmen, who having first been duly qualified by taking and filing an Oath of Office with the Recorder, as required, to wit: R. Stanton; Andrew J. Knight; E. B. Skull, and Chas. J. Roth; H. C. Gillmore, having been Elected to the Office of Mayor, did not Respond at Roll call as Councilman;

The minutes of the last Meeting were then read and stood approved;

After which, the Annual financial report of the Recorder; and the City Treasurers, 4th Quarterly, and Annual reports were read; and finding that the City Treasurers reports did not correspond with the Recorders Report, by a deficiency of one dollar. It was by motion, laid over to next Reg. Meeting for final acceptance and approval.

After which the Claims against the City were read, audited, and ordered paid by unanimous vote:

and that Orders be drawn on the City Treasurer for payment accordingly.

After which: the Bond of the City Treasurer F. Gollner was read, accepted, and approved by the City Council for the year 1904, and placed on file with the Recorder:

Two Applications for liquor license were then read by the Recorder: to wit: One, from Frank Astmann for a license to sell spirituous and Malt liquors for the first Quarter of 1904.

And one from H.A. Vorpahl for the same time, and purpose,

The Council being satisfied that notices had been posted as required and the applications filed with the recorder, and Receipts of the City Treasurer for \$100.⁰⁰ Each had been filed in the Recorder's Office;

and whereas: H.A. Vorpahl having filed his Bond with the Recorder, duly signed and Executed as required, which bond was duly accepted and approved by the City Council; and Ordered that a License be Granted to H.A. Vorpahl for the 1st Qtr of 1904.

and whereas: Frank Astmann reported that his Bond had been delayed, but would be filed with the recorder in a few days, duly executed, as the one for the last Quarter had been executed, with the same parties as Sureties: whereupon it was moved seconded and Carried that a license be granted to Frank Astmann for the first Quarter of 1904, provided that his bond would be filed with the Recorder, within a week, duly executed, as required: and that such bond be approved, and Recorder to issue the License,

The Police Salary Ordinance was then read 4th time and by motion duly seconded ^{& carried} was placed on its final passage. A vote was then taken, which was five (5) votes yes, and two (2) votes no: and the Ordinance was declared passed, by the Mayor. —

After which: the report, of a Committee of one; (C. N. Wait) on Stage-Curtain, for the City Hall, was heard. which report showed that the Curtain of James Evans. together with scenery, and an additional back curtain, and other apparatus, could be purchased for the sum of twenty-five dollars. also; that other curtains could be had, with or without advertisements, at from \$18.⁰⁰ to \$40.⁰⁰; and, after considering the matter, it was moved and seconded, that the Evans-Curtain be purchased.

Which motion was amended, by a motion duly seconded and carried, that a Committee of three be appointed to investigate the whole outfit, and if found suitable: to be authorized to purchase the same.

The Original motion, duly seconded, was carried, and so Ordered, and the Committee appointed, consisting of Councilmen: Elias. Shull, and Knight;

After which the Council proceeded to Elect Officers;

For President of the Council: on the third Ballot, Councilman Chas. N. Wait was duly Elected. he having received four (4) votes.

And for Recorder: William Knight received six (6) votes and L. Grazer one (1).

William Knight was declared duly Elected =

and for Chief of Police = James Evans received four (4) votes. Graham 2, A. H. Knight one

James Evans was declared duly Elected.

For Street Supt.: Adam H. Knight rec^d four (4) votes
O.R. Mack. 1. L. Grazer. 1. Blank. 1.

Adam H. Knight was declared duly Elected,
after which various names were placed in
nomination for Reg. Ploicemen:

O.R. Mack received five votes on third ballot,
and on the fourth (4th) ballot A.W. Riggs
received seven (7) votes, O.R. Mack, and
A.W. Riggs were then declared Elected.

H.C. Gillmore then presented his resignation
as Councilman (in writing) which was duly
accepted by the Council, by Motion duly Seconded
and Carried: after which the Council
proceeded to Elect a Councilman to
fill the vacancy occurred by the resignation
of H.C. Gillmore for the unexpired term of one year
he having been duly elected to the office of Mayor.

The first three ballots resulted in A. Kocher receiving 3 votes
B.H. White 3. and J.A. Graham 1. vote, and on the
4th ballot = Kocher 2. White 3. Graham, 2. votes:

5th ballot = " 1 " 3 " 3. "

6th ballot = " 0 " 3 " 4. "

J.A. Graham was declared duly Elected
as Councilman for the term of One Year.

After which the matter of Repairing Cross
walks. at 1st & B. Streets, and the Depot Crosswalk,
and other ^{cross} walks, where it be deemed necessary,
was brot up for consideration = after which;
it was, by motion duly Seconded & Carried,
that the Street Superintendent be instructed to
repair said ~~cross~~ walks, under the
Supervision of the Committee on
Streets and Public property.

After which: it was Moved and Seconded.
that the Recorder inform the Aurora

Electric Company to place five (5) lights in the City-Hall, that is, as follows: four (4). = sixteen; and one (1). thirty two (32) C.P. in the main Hall. = and one (1) sixteen in hall at head of stairs, and one (1) thirty two in the Council Chamber, and also: the necessary number of stage foot-lights, as may be required. "Carried" and so Ordered.

After which: a committee of the "Artisans" reported that no change would be made from "four" to "two" meetings per. month, and that they would be willing to pay hall rent at the rate of ten (\$10.⁰⁰) dollars per quarter under the present contract. "Granted".

after which the Mayor appointed the following Standing Committees for the Year Commencing January 4th 1904.

The City Council met on the 1st day of Feby 1904. and was called to Order at 8 O'clock P.M. by the Mayor. The full council being present, proceeded to transact the business as follows: Minutes of last meeting read & approved, after which, the Treasurers Qtrly. and Annual reports laid over from last meeting, having been Corrected; and now correspond with Records Report, were, by Motion duly Seconded and Carried, accepted as corrected: after which, the following Claims against the City were read, Audited, and Ordered paid by unanimous vote of the Council: to wit:

 After which: the committee of three, heretofore appointed, to investigate the Evans-Curtain-Outfit, with authority to purchase same if found suitable, made a verbal report to the City Council, that said Outfit was worth the agreed price of Fifteen dollars, and recommended that the City of Canby pay to Mr James Evans the Sum of Fifteen dollars, for the Curtain and Outfit, which report, was, by Motion duly Seconded and Carried by a unanimous vote, accepted, and so Ordered, and warrant be drawn in favor of James Evans for amt \$15.00
 after which, the matter of Horses running at large on the streets of Canby, was considered a nuisance, and that Councilman White, draw an Ordinance to be acted upon at

the next Special meeting of the Council, to be held on Monday July 8th at the usual time and place, after which the resignation of Mr. A. Martin as regular Policeman, was presented, and by motion duly seconded and carried, was Accepted.

The Recorder then reported that Certificates of Election had been served upon O.R. Mack and A.W. Riggs, Regular Policemen Elect, but said Policemen refused to accept, and would not qualify. So that now the offices of ^{regular} Policemen are vacant. Whereupon it was by motion, duly seconded and carried, that the election of Reg. Policemen be deferred until the next Special Meeting of the Council, after which, the Council having under consideration, the matter of Fire protection.

The Mayor introduced Mr. J. M. Rogers, agent and Manager, for the Rex, and Royal hand Chemical Engines, of Portland Oregon, who entertained the Council for a short time, explaining the good qualities of his machines, the most up to date, and latest improvements, after which the Council took a short recess, and proceeded to the street in a body to witness a demonstration made by Mr Rogers in showing how to extinguish a fire with a small, Royal hand chemical machine, after which the Council came to order again in the Council Room, where the matter was farther explained by Mr. Rogers to the satisfaction of the Council, that the "Chemical Machines," handled by Mr Rogers, are the best on the Market; whereupon it was by motion, seconded and carried (unanimously,) that one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) doz. Small (3 gal.) Royal Machines be Ordered, everything Complete, at \$13.50 a piece, whereupon a "contract" was immediately signed by the Recorder of Clatsop, to be shipped by freight soon as possible, after which the Council adjourned in due form, to meet in Spcl. Session, July 8th Wm Knight Recorder.

Special Meeting Feby 8th 1904

The Council met in Special Session on the 8th day of Feby. 1904, and was Called to Order at 7:45 O'clock P.M. by the Mayor. The full Council being present, excepting Elias and Graham. Minutes of last Reg. Meeting read & stood approved, after which the following Claims were presented and read. to wit: filed Feby 2^d 1904.

and after Auditing said Claims - it was Moved seconded and Carried, by unanimous vote, that the Claim of twelve dollars be paid, and an order be drawn on the City Treasurer for same, and that the Claim for twenty eight dollars and fifty Cents, be laid over until next reg meeting, or until the work is completed.

After which the proposed Ordinance - "Entitled" An ordinance forbidding Horses to run at large &c, was read first time, And by motion, duly seconded and carried, was ordered posted and to come up for final passage, at the next regular meeting in March. next, after which; a letter, or remonstrance, against said proposed Ordinance, was read, which was duly laid on the table =

after which the Council proceeded to Elect Regular Policemen, as those who were formerly Elected failed to accept and qualify - Cornelius Bair and James Phegley were placed in nomination. Mr Phegley recd 2 votes and C. Bair recd 4 votes:

Cornelius Bair was declared Elected, after which James Phegley recd 6 votes (on the 2^d ballot) was declared Elected, and ordered that certificates of Election be served on Bair and Phegley accordingly.

After which a letter from J. M. Rogers "agent," in regard to Royal Fire extinguishers, was read. Stating that the same would be shipped the last of next week, &c, whereupon it was ordered, that, upon the arrival of said Machines, the Chief of Police should keep them in charge until the next meeting,

after which it was by motion, duly seconded, that the Mayor appoint a Committee of three, to confer with business houses of the City of Canby, that they purchase one, and the City would place one at the side of it, "Carried," the Mayor appointed on said Spec Committee. Councilmen Wait, Rath and Shull, after which Council adjourned in due form,

by unanimous vote of Council present, and that City warrants be drawn on the Treasurer for the payment of same, and so Ordered.

After which: the proposed Ordinance; forbidding the running at large or loose, any horses, Mares or geldings &c, was read second time, and by motion duly seconded, was placed on its final passage, and after taking a vote it was found that 4 votes were for, and one vote against its passage, so it was declared, not Carried, after which it was Moved and Seconded to reconsider, which was Carried, and again placed on its final passage and was Carried by 5 votes, all Councilmen present voting yes, so the Ordinance was declared Carried, and passed on its final passage, and was immediately Signed and Approved by the Mayor.

After which it was reported to the Council, that the "ditch," along the County road, in front of G.H. Brown's Warehouse, and the residence property of Mr Kesseling and J.A. Graham, was filled up, and in bad condition, and that the same should be Cleaned Out, in order to have better drainage in that part of the town of Canby &c, after which it was Moved and Seconded, that the Street Superintendent be instructed to Clean Out the said ditch, and that he also Notify Mr G.H. Brown to put a Culvert across said ditch at his Warehouse, which motion was duly Carried. and so Ordered +

In the matter of placing a water trough, at the pump in front of the Maple Shade Hotel at lot No. 2, Block No. 3. in the town of Canby.

It was Moved, Seconded and Carried, that the Street Superintendent, be Authorized to make, and place a suitable watering trough ~~at~~ the outside of the sidewalk at said pump, for a public watering trough, together with a hitching-post at one end of the trough, and also: to procure water pipe, and place the same in proper position to run water into said trough.

It was also by motion, duly second & Carried, Ordered; that the Chief of Police, repair the roof of the City jail, and put fresh straw in the bunk tick, and to otherwise repair, and clean up the jail, that may be deemed necessary, for the keeping of prisoners in a proper manner, After which the Council adjourned in due form, to meet in regular session, on April 4th 1904.

After which: "Two" Applications for "License" to Sell Spirituous and Malt Liquors, were read; One from Frank Artmann, & one from H. K. Jackson. Each for the 2^d Quarter of 1904, in the City of Cauley. in Quantities less than one quart.

The Council being satisfied in this matter, that the Applications had been duly filed, and Notices posted, as required, and that the City Treasurers Receipts for the sum of One hundred dollars Each, had been filed in the office of ^{the} Recorder of Canby: together with their Bonds as required by Ordinance No. 37 of the City of Canby, which bonds were duly executed by said applicants and their Sureties respectively: Whereupon it was by motion, duly seconded and Carried by unanimous vote of the Council present: that the bonds be accepted, and approved, and that the License be granted to each of said Applicants as applied for, for 2^d Qtr of 1904, and that License be issued by the Recorder to said Applicants accordingly: and was so Ordered:

After which: the Council by motion duly 2^d and Carried: declared a vacancy in the office of one Councilman: by reason of Councilman E. C. Shull having moved from the City: and that said vacancy be filled by the City Council at once, Whereupon the Council proceeded to vote for Councilman: and, after Casting (4) four ballots: "A. W. Riggs" was declared duly Elected, he having received 4 votes out of six: And that a certificate of Election be issued to A. W. Riggs accordingly, until the next Annual City Election: After which it was M^d. S. ² and Carried: that any Political Party could use the City Council Chamber, for Club Meetings, at fifty Cents per Evening, until after Election, when not in use by City: And after authorizing Chief of Police to procure some stone boards for Hall, the Council adjourned in due form. It was also Ordered by Motion, duly Seconded and Carried, that the Committee on Streets and Public property, and the Street Superintendent, be authorized to visit the County Court of Clackamas County for the purpose of Making arrangements in the Matter of Road work.

It was also ordered that the Aurora Electric Light Company, be notified to Cut-out Street-lighting in the town of Canby, until otherwise Ordered by the Council: after which the Council adjourned in due form.

Jackson and one from Frank Aspmann to sell Spirituous and Malt Liquors within the corporate limits of Canby, at their respective places of business, in quantities less than one quart. And after due consideration, the Council being satisfied in the premises that Notices had been posted, applications duly filed with the Recorder of Canby, together with the receipts of the City Treasurer, and bonds filed duly executed, it was ^{ordered} by unanimous vote of the Council, that the

After which it was ordered that if any societies or lodges wish to occupy the City hall for lodge purposes. The recorder be authorized to enter into, and draw up contracts, or agreement for such hall rent at the price of \$7.50 per Qtr. with meetings of twice a month, or for \$10.⁰⁰ per Qtr. of weekly meetings,

In the Matter of taking Out & removing The Petition Walls in the City Hall,
