The Council then proceeded to ballot for City Recorder William Knight having received seven votes was duly declared elected Recorder for the year 1903. The Council then proceeded to ballot for Street Superintendent and resulted in O R Nease receiving five votes and was duly declared duly elected Street Superintendent for the year 1903 after which the Mayor appointed the following standing committees

Regular Session Feb 2^d. 1903.

The City Council met in regular session on the 2^d day of Feb. 1903 at 7.45 O'clock P.M. The Council was Called to Order by the Hon. Mayor "A.H. Knight." The Councilmen all being present, including Chief of Police, and Wm. Knight Recorder Elect, proceeded to transact business as follows:

Minutes of previous Meeting were read, and after correcting the following errors and omissions, the Minutes stood approved:

(a correction) that the Chief of Police J.A. Graham, and also Andrew Kocher, have authority to rent the City Hall for Shows, dances and Lectures &c., (an omission) That the annual reports of Treasurer and recorder be laid over until next reg. Meeting in Feb., for examination and approval.;

(an omission) That the Committee on Streets & Public property be, and are appointed a committee on the improvement of First Street, and to draw up an ordinance, for the improvement of said street, to be brot before the Council at their Feb. meeting for their deliberation.)

After which the following Claims were read.

To wit: Claim of Recorder H.A. Lee for Salary & fees, &c.

Claim of J.A. Graham Chief of Police Salary & Supplies and - \$ 8.25

after which: the Bonds of Wm. Knight Recorder Elect, and

Bond of Chief of Police J.A. Graham, were accepted and approved.

also: Certificates of Office and Oath. of Councilmen C.N. Wait,

and were approved and placed on file;

And by Motion, duly seconded, and carried the annual Reports of Recorder and Treasurer, were laid over until next meeting.

Regular Session continued Feb 2^d 1903.

 - = After which, the "proposed Ordinance" for improvement of First Street, presented by the Committee on Sts. & P. Prop., was read by the Recorder. after which, it was moved and seconded that the ordinance be Postea. but after due consideration the motion to post was lost by a majority vote.
 - = After which, by a Motion duly Seconded and Carried. It was Ordered, that the Committee on Sts. & Pub. Prop., be authorized to Employ a Competant Surveyor, to Make and Establish a grade, Set Stakes, and draw Specifications as to manner of grading, graveling, and draining, under the direction of Said Committee on Streets and public property.
 - = Also, Moved, Seconded and Carried, that after the plans and Specifications are handed in to the Recorders office; the Recorder is hereby Authorized to draw up an Ordinance Accordingly.
 - = It was also, Moved Seconded and Carried, that the Street-Supt. is authorized to make a gravel-Crosswalk, from the North East corner of block four (4) across Second Street, to the South East corner of Block Nine (9) in the town of Canby, After which the Chief of Police, "J. A. Graham", handed in the name of A. Martin, as appointed by the Chief, to the office of Regular Policeman, which appointment was duly confirmed by the Council.
- The Council then adjourned in due form, to meet in Special Session, on the 16th day of February 1903, at the usual time and place.

Special Session Feb 16th 1903.

The City Council Met in Special Session on the 16th day of February 1903, and was called to order at 8 O'clock PM by the Mayor.

Present: The Mayor, Recorder and Chief of Police and all Members of the Council excepting Councilmen Vorpahl and Wait being absent.

The Minutes of last Reg. Meeting were read & stood approved.

A claim against the City, and in favor of Carlton and Rosenthal, for chairs and leather supplies, as per bill on file, was read, audited and ordered paid by unanimous vote.

and that an Order be drawn on the City Treasurer in favor of Carlton and Rosenthal for the sum of Forty dollars & forty five cents (40.45)

After which the report of the Committee on Streets and Public Property was presented in the form of a plat, surveyed by J.B. Perrott showing the proposed grade of First Street from East side of "A" Street to the west side of "D" Street, together with plan of ditching and draining. Said grade to commence at east side of A street three inches below ground level, to west side of "C" Street at street level, thence to west side of "D" Street at ground level, before graveling. The north side ditch at east end to be 2 ft 6 in below street level, and at west side of "C" Street to be one (1) foot below street level, and at "D" Street one (1) foot below street level, and the south side ditch to be one (1) foot below street level the whole length thereof, with drain across east end to conform with ditches on either side, on west line of A street, gravel on center of street to be six inches deep, and taper off to two inches on sides, 3 ft wide, specifications to be made, and reported at next reg. council meeting. After which it was moved and seconded to adopt the report of the Committee. Carried: Council then adjourned in due form. Wm. Knight Recorder

Regular Session March 2^d 1903.

The City Council met in regular Session on the 2^d day of March 1903, and was called to Order by the Hon. Mayor in the Chair at 8.00 P.M.

The full Council being present excepting Councillor Stanton, Minutes of last Ap'd meeting read & Stood approved:

After which plans and Specifications, prepared

by J. B. Perratt Surveyor, were presented by the Committee on St. S. P. P. for the improvements on First Street, for the consideration of the Council;

and after due consideration by the Council, the Plans & Specifications were duly accepted by the Council, upon a Motion duly seconded and Carried, after striking out Matter of fine gravel passing through a half inch size, \$0.

After which the Ordinance which was prepared by the Recorder, for the improvement of First Street, was read first time, and after due consideration, and by Motion duly seconded, and Carried was Ordered posted. To come up for final passage on the 19th day of March at a Special Meeting to be held for that purpose.

After which the Council adjourned in due form to meet accordingly,

Special Session Mar. 19th 1903.

Pursuant to adjournment of March 3^d 1903, the Council met on the 19th day of March 1903, at 8 P.M. Present the Mayor Recorder and Chief of Police, and Councilmen. Knight, Krueger, Wait and Sias, there being no quorum to transact business; the Council adjourned the meeting to Monday March 23^d 1903, at the usual time & place, for the purpose of considering the final passage of the proposed Ordinance for the improvement of first street, and for the transaction of such other business, as may be properly bro't before the Council.

March 23^d 1903 =
March 23^d, the Council met, pursuant to last adjournment; and was called to order by the Mayor at 8 O'clock P.M.

Present.. The Mayor, Recorder & Chief, and Councilman " Gilmore; Knight, Krueger, Tanton & Hampton; about 8 Sias. spoke & Wait; Minutes of last Reg. & Spcl Meetings read & approved.

After which the Proposed Ordinance for the improvement of first st. was, by motion duly Seconded and Carried & laid on the table until the next reg. meeting in April; and in the matter, of the proposition to grade first street about 15, or 20 feet wider, than the proposed width mentioned in the plans and specifications for the improvement of said street & it was moved Seconded and Carried, that the Mayor appoint a Committee to Confer with the S.P. Co. in regard to permitting the City Council to grade a part of the Depot grounds, in addition to the width of first street, so that the street would be about 60 ft. wide, or more, after being graded, - the Mayor then appointed the Committee on Sts. & Publ. Prop. & such Committee, after which the Council adjourned in due form. Jpm Knight Recorder,

Regular Session April 6th 1903.

The City Council met in reg. session on the 6th day of April 1903 and was called to order by the Mayor at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present; the Mayor, Recorder and Chief of Police and all the Councilmen: Except Chas. K. Walt.

Minutes of last meeting, read, & stood approved.

The City Treasurer's Quarterly ^{Report} was then read,

Showing a bal. on hand at end of Quarter on

March 31st 1903. of the sum of \$441.45 — and

by Motion duly Seconded, and Carried, the report was

accepted and Ordered placed on file;

after which the Recorders Claim of ten dollars

and the Chief of Police's Claim of Eight Dollars

were presented: Read, Audited: and Ordered

paid by unanimous vote of the Council, and

that Warrants be drawn on the Treasurer for same.

After which the Applications for Liquor-
license of Frank Astmann and H.A. Vorpahl
were read, said application having been filed
on the 23^d day of March 1903, as required,
and The City Council being Satisfied in the Matter,
that Notices had been duly posted, and the
City Treasurer's receipts, for One hundred dollars
Each, has been filed with the City Recorder,
together with their Bonds, duly Executed,
the Bonds were duly accepted and approved
by the City Council, and Licensees granted
to Each, for the 2^d Qtr. of 1903, by a vote
of Six Councilmen.

After which the proposed Ordinance, was taken from
the table, and by Motion duly Seconded was placed on its
final passage: The motion was lost, by Seven votes.

After which a motion was made, duly Seconded, that the City of Caubey
do the work of improving first street: Carried, and so Ordered.

Provided however, that the work be done, in

accordance with the plans and specifications on file, prepared by J.B. Perot, and as changed by the City Council at this meeting, so as to eliminate, and leave out the ditching on the south side of first street, together with the tiling of 30 ft at road crossing, and 38 ft across 1st St. and the 50 ft at Depot crossings, otherwise the work may be done according to Specifications, under the supervision of the Superintendent of Streets, and that the Mayor shall have full control in directing, and overseeing the work in detail, and is authorized to employ the Surveyor J.B. Perrot to set stakes in the center of the street to define the grade. All said work shall be deemed as "Repairing" first Street,

after which, the Recorder was requested to advise Manager R. Kehler, of the S.P. Co., that his proposition, in reference to taking gravel, at a royalty of five cents per cubic yard, would be accepted by the City Council.

After which the Council adjourned in due form.

After which, the matter of Electing another regular policeman, was brot up for consideration, after which the name of James Evans, was placed in nomination, which nomination was duly seconded, and by vote of the council James Evans was duly elected a regular policeman for the town of Leavenby.

After which, the Council discussed various other matters of importance, but no action taken thereon, and the Council adjourned in due form, to meet ^{3rd} hold next reg. Meeting on June, 20th 1903.

Regular Session July 6th 1903.

The City Council met on the 6th day of July 1903, in regular session, and was called to order, at 8:30 O'clock P.M. by the Mayor.

A full council was present, excepting Fenton & Hampton. Minutes of last meeting was read & Stood approved, after which the following Claims against the City, were read, Audited, and Ordered paid: to wit: Claim of Recorder for Month of June,

for Salary and fees, amounting to — \$5.40

& Claim of Chief of Police for salary, Janitor work & supplies = 9.20
total amount ordered paid by unanimous vote = \$14.60

and that Orders be drawn for the same; After which, the City Treasurer's report for the 2^d Quarter was read, and by motion duly seconded and Carried, was accepted and ordered placed on file.

In the Matter of Application for Liquor License of Frank Astmann for the 3^d Qtr of 1903.

The Council being satisfied in the premises that Notices had been posted, and the City Treasurer's receipt for \$100.00 had been duly filed with the Recorder, together with his Bond, which Bond was duly accepted and approved by the Council, it was, by motion duly seconded, and Carried by unanimous vote, that a License be granted for the 3^d Qtr to Said Frank Astmann, to sell liquors in quantities less than one quart at his usual place of business.

License, to sell Liquors in quantities less than one quart, was also granted to H.A. Impahl, for the 3^d Qtr. of 1903. His application, receipt, and Bond having been filed and accepted and approved by a vote of 5th Council.

It was Ordered that hereafter Petitioners for liquor license, shall pay for preparing and executing their Saloon Bonds, and, after granting to Committee on St & Pub. prop. one month time to report on stage and lights, the Council adjourned in due form, to meet in Reg. Aug. Session. Wm. Knight Recorder.

Reg Session Aug. 3^d

The City Council met in Reg session on Aug 3^d 1903, and called to order by the Mayor at 8³⁰ O'clock P.M.

Present: all Members except Fenton & Hampton
Minutes of last meeting affirmed.

Claim of Recorder for month of July amounting to \$2.50, and Claim of Chief of Police, amounting to \$8⁰⁰ were read audited, and ordered paid, by unanimous vote of the Council; after which the Committee on Streets & Public Property were not prepared to make any definite report in the matter of stage & lights; the matter being left over for future consideration.

After which the Chief of Police was authorized to place public notices for Bicycler's "Not to ride on the sidewalk from road angle at or near corner of first and "A" streets, to the corner in front of Wm Vorpahl's residence.

After which the Council adjourned in due form:

Sept. 7th 1903. The City Council met in Reg. session, and was called to order by Councilman E.J. Sias. at 8³⁰ O'clock P.M.

Mayor & President of Council being absent at Roll call there were 3. Councilmen present, Sias, Hampton & Kruger. The Council then adjourned to Monday Sept 14th 1903, for want of a quorum to do business: Wm Knight Recorder

Pursuant to adjournment from Reg. Session of Sept. 7th 1903, the City Council Met on the 14th day of Sept 1903, and was Called to Order at 8 o'clock P.M. by the Mayor. Absent; Stanton & Hampton.

Minutes of last 2 meetings read & Stood approved.

After which the following Claims against the City were read, Audited, and Ordered paid by unanimous vote of all Councilmen present,

(one at B st. & one at C st.) at six dollars per Mo., & that the recorder Notify Aurora Electric light Co. accordingly, lighting to commence on or about Oct. 1st 1903, and the Committee on Streets & Pub. prop. is to designate the placing of lights.

The "proposed Ordinance", presented by the A.E.L.C. for granting a franchise to said Company & successors, for the right and privilege to Erect poles, wires for Electric purposes, within the corporate limits of Canby, was read, and laid on the table for future Consideration.

After which: Andrew Kocher, was granted special permission, to place a window in the west side of the City Hall, for his convenience, and at his own expense, the same to be put in, in a workmanlike manner, about the same size as the other windows;

The Council then adjourn in due form, to Oct. 5th 1903,

The City Council met in Regular Session on the 5th day of October 1903 and was called to order by the Mayor at 8 o'clock P.M. Present at roll call, the Mayor, Recorder & Chief, and Councilmen Gillmore, Knight, Krueger, Vorpahl & Sias - absent, Fenton, Hampton & Wait; Minutes of last meeting, read & stood approved, after which the City Treasurers report for the third Quarter of 1903, was read: and by Motion, duly seconded, and carried, was accepted.

The following claims against the City were then read: audited: and ordered paid, to wit:

In the matter of an application from Frank Actmann for a Liquor License, for 4th Quarter of 1903, the Council being satisfied in the premises, that notices had been posted, and application made, and treasurers receipt filed, and Bonds executed and filed, all according to Ordinance No. 37, of the City of Leavenly; it was ordered by a Motion duly seconded, and carried, by a vote of the Council, that the application be accepted, and the Bond approved, and placed on file, and that a License be granted to said Frank Actmann for the 4th Quarter of 1903, to sell, Spirituous and Malt Liquors in quantities less than one quart, at his place of business, in the town of Leavenly, Oreg. And, in the matter of an application from H.A. Vorpahl for a Liquor License for the 4th Quarter of 1903, the Council being satisfied, that said H.A. Vorpahl had in all respects complied with Ordinance No. 37, of the City of Leavenly, Excepting, that his bond had been delayed, and not, as yet having been filed with the Recorder of Leavenly. It was ordered by a vote of the City Council

that the application be accepted, and a License granted to said H. A. Vorpahl for the 4th Quarter of 1903, to sell Spirits and Malt Liquors, in quantities less than one quart, at his place of business in the town of Canby, Oregon, upon filing his bond, with the City Recorder of Canby duly Executed, according to Said Ordinance No. 37, and that the names of Sureties appear on said bond, as appear on his bond for the third Quarter of 1903, or any other good bondsmen, to be approved by the Mayor.

In the matter of trimming trees along first street, in the City of Canby, so as to allow teams, and horseback riders, to pass under the same without coming in contact with limbs. It was ordered, by motion duly Seconded and Carried, that the Street Superintendent be instructed to trim up the trees on first street accordingly.

In the matter of lighting the city Hall and Council Chamber with Electric lights, it was Moved, Seconded and carried, that the proposition of the Aurora Electric Light Co. be accepted, five (5) lights to be placed in the City Hall, one (1) at the head of the stairs, and one (1) in the Council chamber, at the prices quoted; and that the Recorder Notify said Company accordingly.

The matter of Stage was laid over to next meeting.

It was Moved, Seconded and Carried that the Chief of Police procure a large sheet of galvanized tin, and place it under the stone in the council Chamber.

The proposed Ordinance, to regulate the salary of the Chief of Police, was read first time, and ordered posted, and to come up for final passage at the next reg. Meeting in November, 1903. It was also Moved, Seconded and Carried, that the City of Canby offer a reward of Fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for the arrest and

conviction of any person or persons, violating City Ordinance No. Seven (7), by tearing down or defacing any Notice, Bill, or Sign posted within the corporate limits of Cañby, and that the City Recorder post up three (3) notices, within the City limits, in accordance therewith.

The Council then adjourned in due form, to meet in regular session in November next:
