Special session held Dec 29th 1902

Special session called by Councilman to consider the advisability of having the City charter changed in order that the City

shall have sixty percent of the road funds that is assessed within the corporate limits of the City of Canby Oregon to be applied on the County roads within the corporate limits of Canby and that forty percent of the road funds be applied on roads leading to Canby also that a Supervisor of Roads be elected to supervise the roads and streets in Canby under the direction of the City Council. The Council was called to Order by Mayor J. H. Knight, after which

it was moved seconded and carried that the Mayor appoint a Committee of three to draw up plans for the proposed change to be made in the City Charter of Canby the Mayor appointed J. H. Gilmore George Knight and C. N. Wait on such Committee, and it was proposed to consolidate sections twenty seven and twenty eight of the City Charter into section twenty seven and substitute for section twenty eight of the Canby Charter section twenty eight of the Oregon City Charter after which the Council adjourned in regular form
