The City Council met in Regular Session on the 7th day of January 1901, and was called to order at 8 o'clock P.M. by the Hon. Mayor C. N. Wait

Present, - the Mayor, C. N. Wait and Recorder Wm. Knight, and Holdover Councilmen James Evans Adam, H. Knight, and E. B. Shull, and the newly Elected Councilmen, who, previous to their entering upon the duties of Councilmen, filed their Certificate of Office and Oath's of Office in the Office of the City Recorder, were also present, to wit: H. C. Gillmore, Emil Krueger, John R. Marks, J. C. Wolgmat and Wm. Vorpahl,

The Minutes of last Special Meeting were read, and Stood approved, after which, the City Treasurer's 4th Quarterly, and Yearly reports were read, and Also, the Recorder's Annual Statement, and Financial report for the year 1900, was read by the Recorder, showing that the Balance on hand at the beginning of the year, and the total receipts during the year, amounted to the sum of \$541.85 and the total disbursements for the year to be \$394.62 leaving a bal. on hand, Dec, 31st 1900. of = \$147.23

Said report also showing the number of City Warrants issued during the year, to be sixty one (61) and to whom, and for what purpose, commencing with No. 379, and ending with No. 439, inclusive.

And the City Council being satisfied in the premises, and that the reports were duly signed by the Treasurer, and Recorder.

It was moved, Seconded and Carried, that the reports be accepted and placed on file, and so ordered by the Mayor.

and the filing of a Receipt from the City Treasurer for
the sum of One Hundred dollars, and the Council
being satisfied that Notices had been posted
as required by Ordinance, It was Ordered,
"by motion, duly Seconded and Carried by uni-
versal vote of the Council that the "Bond" of
of said John Cook be Accepted and approved
and placed on file, and that a License
be granted, and issued for the 1st Qtr
of 1901, as applied for, by said John Cook,

After which the Council proceeded
to the Election of Officers, as follows;
The Office of "Chief of Police" having become
vacant by reason of H.C. Gilliland having been

duly elected to the office of City Councilman, and having filed his Oath of Office, and taken his Seat as Councilman, and S. J. Fisher a regular policeman, having been appointed as Teller, in place of the Chief of Police, by the Mayor. = The Council proceeded to ballot for President of the Council for the ensuing year, which resulted in the election of Councilman James Evans he having received a majority of all votes cast, and so declared by the Mayor, after which the Council proceeded to ballot for City Recorder, and nine ballots were taken without resulting in an election, and on the tenth ballot, Mr. Heman A. Lee received five votes, and whereupon the Mayor declared Heman A. Lee duly elected as City Recorder for the ensuing year, after which, a unanimous vote was cast for S. J. Fisher, for Chief of Police for the ensuing year, who was declared, duly elected to the office of Chief, by the Mayor, after which, it was moved and seconded that Highland W. Evans be elected a regular Policeman, by acclimation, = "Carried", and so elected, after which, it was moved and seconded, that D. R. Dimick be elected a regular policeman, "Carried" and so declared, after which, J. A. Cox was duly elected to the office of Supt. of Streets, he receiving five votes, on the second ballot, & so declared, after which it was moved & seconded that a Committee of three be appointed, by the Mayor

to see about a meeting place, for the City Council, during the ensuing year, which Motion "Carried", and the Mayor thereupon appointed, Councilmen J. R. Marks, James Evans and E. C. Shull as such Committee.

After which, the Mayor announced the appointment of the Standing Committees for the Ensuing year, as follows:
