

Minutes of first regular City Council Meeting for - 1899.

The City Council met in Knight's Hall in the City of Canby on the 2^d day of January 1899, and was called to order by the Mayor H. A. Lee. at 7:45 O'clock P.M.

Present the Mayor. H. A. Lee. Recorder Wm. Knight and J. A. Graham Chief of Police and Councilmen G. W. Knight; A. H. Knight; W. W. Weed and James Evans being the Holdover Members of the Council; and the newly Elected, who; having been first duly qualified, by filing their Oaths of Office with the Recorder of Canby, answered, to their names being called to wit: O. W. Sturges, J. A. Cox, F. Hampton and Wm. Borpahl.

The Minutes of the last Special Meeting, having been read and approved, the City Council proceeded to transact the following business.

An application, for a license to sell Spirituous and Malt Liquors, in less quantities than one Gallon, for the first quarter of 1899, was read before the Council, said application having been filed, by Peter Sustauer in the office of the City Recorder, on the 19th day of Dec. 1898. The City Council and Mayor, having been satisfied in the premises, that notices had been published, and application made according to law, and that the City Treasurer's receipt for \$100.00 had been filed with the recorder. The application was accepted, and a license granted to Peter Sustauer for the 1st qtr. of 1899, to sell Spirituous and Malt liquors, within the Corporate limits of Canby, and at the place of business named in said application, subject in every way to the Bond of said Peter Sustauer approved by the Mayor of Canby, and filed in the office of the City Recorder, with P. H. Miller and Adam Bany as Sureties on said Bond, after which, the Bond of the City Treasurer Elect; and Oath of Office

were read, and, after the bond having been approved by the Mayor, were ordered placed on file. The Treasurers Quarterly, and Annual reports were then read, for the terms Ending Dec. 31st 1898, and accepted by the Council and ordered placed on file by vote of the Council, After which, the Recorder's financial Statement for the year 1898, showing the receipts & disbursements of the City of Canby, the number and amount of Warrants issued during the year, and an Itemized statement of all expenses, was read, and by vote of the Council, was duly accepted, and ordered placed on file.

The Mayor then announced the next order of business was to Elect Officers: Chief. Graham acting as teller. The Council proceeded to vote for City Recorder, which resulted in the Election of Wm. Knight. he having received the unanimous vote of the Council, and so declared by the Mayor.

The Mayor then appointed J. A. Graham to the Office of Chief of Police, which appointment was confirmed by the Council by unanimous vote. The Mayor declared J. A. Graham duly Elected, and appointed D. R. Dimick and H. C. Gillmore as regular policemen, which appointment was duly confirmed by the Council by a majority vote, & so declared.

The Mayor then appointed S. J. Garrison to the office of Superintendent of Streets, which was Confirmed by the Council, by a vote of 5, to 3.

The Council then proceeded to Cast a ballot for President of the Council, which resulted in G. W. Knight receiving 5 votes - J. A. Coy. 1; A. H. Knight - 1; and W. W. Weed - 1; The Mayor declared G. W. Knight duly Elected,

After which it was moved, seconded and Carried that the Chief of Police, procure a new lock with two keys, for use at the City Jail, and also;

that the Chief of Police bring in a list, of all the City property in his care, at the next regular meeting;

The Chief then reported, (as per former request of the Council) that the length of the City jail was 14^{ft} 6 in; width 10^{ft} 6 in. and the height up to the eaves 10^{ft}.

After which it was moved and seconded that the City Council procure the use of Knights Hall for the ensuing year, at the same rate and terms for rent, as for the past year, Carried, after which the Mayor appointed the standing Committees to be as follows, to wit:

After which the Council considered the matter of the Amendments to the City Charter, & of Fire Protection.

Mr A. G. Long, of Portland Oregon, an Agent for Fire Protection Apparatus, addressed the City Council in explanation of the different fire protecting apparatus, and also filing a proposition to furnish outfits, &c, to wit: One at \$450.00 and one at \$180.00 for consideration &c,

After which it was moved and seconded.
 That the City Recorder be instructed
 to post notices, in three public places
 within the City limits, that a Mass
 meeting of the Legal voters of Canby
 would be held, to meet in Knights
 Hall on the 9th day of January 1899,
 at 7.30 O'clock P.M. for the purpose
 of Considering the proposed amendments
 to the City Charter of Canby, and
 Also the Question of providing Appa-
 ratus for fire protection = Carried;
 and so Ordered =

After which it was moved and
 seconded to adjourn, and to meet
 in Special Session on Tuesday
 the 10th day of January 1899 at 7.30 P.M.
 for the purpose of further Consider-
 ing the business of Charter amend-
 ments, and fire protection,
 Carried $\frac{1}{2}$ and adjourned,

The City Council met in Special Session on the 10th day of January, 1899, and was called to order at 7:45 P.M. by the Mayor.
 2nd { Minutes of last regular meeting was read & stood approved.
 { Present: the Mayor, H. A. Lee, Recorder W. M. Knight & J. A. Graham, Chief =
 1st { and Councilmen: E. W. Knight, O. W. Sturges, Fred Hampton,
 James Evans, W. W. Weed, A. H. Knight, J. A. Cox & W. M. Vorpahl.
 The matter of the Charter amendments was then brought up, and a recommendation to change the boundary line on the north of the City limits, to the section line between Sections 29 and 32, in T. 3. S. R. 1. E. which recommendation was, by Motion, duly seconded, carried by unanimous vote of the Council.

after which it was moved, seconded and Carried, that the Amendments, heretofore recommended by the Committee on Charter amendments, be accepted and that the same be prepared, by said Committee, and that the same be presented to the Legislature of the State of Oregon, now in session, for the purpose of having the same passed, and a Charter made for the City of Leanby, =

After which the Matter of Fire-protection was taken up for deliberation by the City Council, a proposed Ordinance, for the appropriation of (blank) dollars for the purchasing of fire-fighting machines, &c; was read first time, and by motion, duly seconded, was laid on the table, by a vote of 4, to 4. the Mayor Casting the deciding vote, to lay on the table until the next regular meeting. after which it was moved to adjourn, after the motion was duly seconded and vote taken, the motion to adjourn was lost. An Ordinance, for the appropriation of \$175.00 was then introduced, and read first time, and a motion made, which was duly seconded to have the Ordinance passed, was lost by a Majority vote of the Council. after

which it was moved and seconded, that the Committee on fire and water be instructed to bring in a list of prices at the next regular Council Meeting, showing at what price a hook and ladder wagon can be bought for, and the prices of other apparatus, that may be deemed suitable for fire protection. - Carried; and so ordered. after which, by Motion, duly seconded, and Carried, the Council adjourned,

The City Council Met on the 6th day of February in regular session.

and was called to order at 8 O'clock P.M. by Geo. W. Knight President of the Council.

Present. = The Recorder and Chief of Police, and Councilmen = Geo. W. Knight = President = presiding = W. W. Weed; A. H. Knight; James Evans J. A. Coy. F. Hampton; O. W. Sturges and William Verpahl Absent the Mayor. H. A. Lee.

Minutes of last Special Meeting, were read by the Recorder and stood approved.

The Chief of Police; J. A. Graham, then presented a list of City property in his care, and by motion, duly seconded and Carried, was ordered placed on file;

After which = Claims against the City were presented and read by the Recorder, as follows to wit:

The several Claims were then referred to the Finance Committee, for examination, and report. After examining said Claims, the Committee reported all Claims O.K., and recommending the payment thereof = excepting the Claim of the Cl. Co. Independent, on account of Error in publishing the treasurer's report, whereupon, it was moved and seconded, that the Claims Marked "O.K." by the Finance Committee, be ordered paid, and that Orders be drawn on the City Treasurer for the same, which Motion was Carried by a unanimous vote of the Council = and so. Ordered

after which: a motion was made: that the Clackamas County Independent be requested to republish the Treasurers Report in the next issue, and that the Claim lay over until the next Council Meeting = which: after further consideration by the Council, said Motion was withdrawn, and a Motion to pay the Claim, was made, which: after being duly seconded, was Carried by a unanimous vote of the Council, and that an order be drawn on the Treasurer for the same,

After which: the Committee on Fire & Water, were allowed further time, until the next reg. Meeting, to report prices at which a Hook and ladder-wagon, and other fire apparatus can be bought for.

After which, it was moved and seconded that the proposed Ordinance which was laid on the table at the last special meeting be taken up for further action; Carried.

A motion was then made, and duly seconded that said ordinance be posted, which motion was, Lost.

after which: an Ordinance was introduced and read first time, for the changing of certain lamp-posts and Lamps, from their present positions, within the Corporate limits of Canby, and Motion made to have the ordinance posted, which Motion, after being duly seconded, Carried by unanimous vote,

After which: it was moved and seconded that the Committee on fire and water, be instructed to bring in, at the next meeting, the price or cost of a wagon, suitable to carry, a 30 foot extension ladder, two 18^{ft} ladders = one 18^{ft} roof ladder & a pull down apparatus = buckets, & other necessary apparatus. Carried = after which the Council adjourned in due form, Wm. Knight

unanimous vote of the City Council, 6 votes.

The Committee on fire and water, then gave notice that they were not ready to make a report on prices of wagon, ladders, & other fire apparatus and asked for further time to report, there being no objections made. More time was granted. The Street Superintendent S. J. Garrison, by request, made a verbal report, of work and repairs, done on the City pump and well, sidewalks, drains, &c during the past month,

after which the proposed Ordinance, to move certain lamps & posts, was read second time, and placed on its final passage, which passed the City Council by unanimous vote.

After which, the Notice of Resignation as City Councilman, filed by Geo. W. Knight, was read by the Recorder, and upon a Motion made, and duly seconded, was accepted by the City Council,

Thus, a vacancy in the Office of City Councilman occurred, and in regard to filling said vacancy, it was moved, seconded and carried, to postpone such election until the next regular Meeting,

After which: Our Village-Blacksmith, H. A. Borpahl, and Master Mechanic, Alex Beaty, who being both present, were requested, and permitted to address the Hon. City Council in regard to estimates, and prices of a wagon, or truck, and ladders and other fire apparatus suitable to be used by the City of Leavenworth for fire protection.

However, an exact estimate of the price, could not be given, owing to the lateness of the hour, but suggested that about \$110.⁰⁰ for wagon and ladders would be a fair estimate - and not being prepared ^(at this meeting) to examine the matter more particularly, the Council, by motion, duly seconded, adjourned, in due form.

Special Session Mock 13th 1899.

The City Council of Canby Oregon, Met, and Convened on the 13th day of March 1899, in Special Session, pursuant to a Call of a Majority of the members of the Council, personal Notice having been first served on the Members. Said Special Meeting having been called for the purpose of transacting business regarding fire protection for the City of Canby, and for the consideration of Contracting for, and the purchasing of a truck or wagon, and ladders, &c. Said Call was dated March 8th 1899, and signed by Councilmen J. A. Cox, A. H. Knight, W. W. Weed, Wm. Vorpahl and James Evans, and filed with the Recorder, March 8th 1899. The Meeting was called to order at 7:30 P.M. by the Mayor,

Present: the Mayor, Recorder and Chief of Police and Councilmen W. W. Weed, A. H. Knight, James Evans;

J. A. Cox; Fred Hampton; O. W. Sturges and Wm. Vorpahl;

Minutes of last reg. and adjourned Meetings of March 6th & 7th were read and stood approved.

After which: the business for which the Meeting was called for to transact, was brought up and considered. The City Council being satisfied in the premises, and being favorably inclined to purchase a truck, or wagon, and ladders, and such other apparatus, according to a diagram, or specifications, on file in the Recorder's office,

Ordered that an Ordinance be drawn up accordingly after which; Such a proposed Ordinance was prepared by the recorder, and read first time, after which it was moved seconded and Carried.

That the proposed Ordinance be posted, and to come up for final action at a ^{Special} Meeting of the Council to be held March 23rd 1899, at the usual time & place of Meeting;

The Council then adjourned in due form, to meet in Special Session on March 23rd 1899.

Special Session Mch 23^d 1899.

The City Council met on the 23^d day of March 1899, in special session pursuant to previous adjournment of March 13th 1899. and was called to order by the Mayor at 8 O'clock P.M.

Present the Mayor, Recorder, & Chief of Police and Councilmen A.H. Knight, Jas Evans, J. A. Cox, F. Hampton, O.W. Sturges, and J. Vanpahl
W.W. Weed appearing after roll call.

Minutes of Last Special Meeting were read and stood approved.

A communication, or letter from Mr Shilling was read, in regard to liquor license, but no application having been filed with the Recorder, no action was taken in the matter by the City Council.

After which, the proposed Ordinance which was ordered posted at the last Meeting and to come up for final action at this meeting, was read the 2^d time, and by motion duly seconded, was placed on its final passage, and by unanimous vote of the Council, passed, and was immediately approved by the Mayor.

After which the Recorder was ordered to post notices, that sealed proposals would be received at the regular April term of the City Council, to wit, April 3^d 1899, at 7 O'clock P.M. for the Manufacturing, or furnishing a Hook & ladder wagon, and Ladders, and pulldown apparatus.

Pike poles, &c, according to Specifications on file, Reserving the right to reject any or all bids, and the successful bidder to be required to furnish bonds for the performance of any Contract that may be let for the furnishing of such apparatus. The Council then adjourned in due form.

The City Council met on the 3^d day of April 1899. and was called to order by the Mayor at 7:30 P.M.

Minutes of last Special Meeting were read and stood approved.

Present the Mayor, Recorder and Chief of Police and Councilmen as follows.

An Application for a License to Sell Malt & Spirituous liquors, within the Corporate limits of Canby was then read by the Recorder. Said application had been filed with the recorder on the 17th day of March 1899. The City Council and Mayor being Satisfied in the premises, that Notices had been published in the Canby Newspaper, and the Treasurers receipt for \$100⁰⁰ having been filed with the recorder, and a Bond having been filed according to Ordinance No. 37th with H. K. Jackson as principal, and Peter Lusbauer

and John Bany as Sureties, on said Bond it was moved and seconded that the Bonds be accepted, and a License be granted to said H. K. Jackson for the 2^d Qtr of 1899, which Motion Carried by unanimous vote, and so Ordered, and declared, = After which the Council proceeded to the Election of a City-Councilman, to fill a vacancy, occurred by the resignation of Councilman Geo. W. Knight which resignation had heretofore been filed, and accepted, The Chief of Police, acting as teller, proceeded to read the first Ballot which resulted in no Election, Charles Lucke rec^d 3 votes Fisher 1, R Mack 1, and two Blank, after which a second ballot was taken, which resulted in the Election of Charles Lucke, he having received four (4) votes a Lee 1, Fisher 1, and one Blank, and so declared by the Mayor, to fill said vacancy, after which a vote was taken for the Election of a President of the Council, which vote resulted in the Election of James Evans, he having received four (4) votes = Hampton 1, A. H. Knight 1, James Evans was declared duly elected, by the Mayor, After which, The Sealed proposals for furnishing fire apparatus - were opened and read, there being only one Bid received, which was signed by H. A. Bonpahl, proposing to furnish Fire Truck Ladders and pulldown hooks as per specifications complete, for the sum of \$115.⁰⁰ = and after considering the same, it was moved and seconded that the bid be accepted, which was carried by a unanimous vote of the Council,

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The City Council met in Special Session pursuant to a Call by the Mayor, to Commence on the 11th day of April 1899, for the purpose of Considering, and Taking Action upon the Application of Henry Schilling for a License to sell Spirituous, ^{& Malt} Liquors within the Corporate limits of Canby, and was called to Order at 7.30 O'clock P.M. by the Mayor.

Present; the Mayor. Recorder & Chief of Police, and Councilmen W.W. Weed. A.H. Knight James Evans. J.H. Cox. O.W. Sturges. Wm. Vorpahl and Charles Lucke. the newly Elected Councilman. to fill the unexpired term of G.W. Knight who resigned, and Councilman Lucke, having previously filed his Certificate of Election and Oath of Office with the Recorder. The Minutes of last reg. Meeting were read, and stood approved, after which J.H. Hampton Councilman appeared and took his seat.

after which; An Application, for a License to Sell, Malt & Spirituous Liquors in the City of Canby. was read, said application having been filed with the Recorder on the 27th day of March 1899, by Henry Schilling. a Motion was then made to grant a license to Henry Schilling, for the 2^d quarter of 1899, to sell Malt & Spirituous liquors within the Corporate limits of Canby. which motion was duly Seconded,

The applicant; Mr. H. Schilling, being present, was permitted to address the City Council & Mayor, in behalf of his application for such License; after a few remarks, made by Mr. Schilling, and the matter being under debate by the Council, a petition was presented and filed with the recorder, which said petition was read at this meeting, which was signed by J. H. Graham, W. F. Evans and 34 others, Remonstrating against granting a License to said H. Schilling. After which: a vote was taken on the Motion which resulted in six (6) votes being cast against the motion, and two (2) in favor of the motion. The Motion was declared Lost, by the Mayor and that no license be granted to said H. Schilling;

After which: the Contract, by and between the City of Canby and H. A. Vorpahl, was read, for the furnishing of a Fire Truck and apparatus, which was accepted by the Council, and the Bond of said H. A. Vorpahl was approved by the Mayor, and the Contract and Bond ordered placed on file;

After which the Council adjourned in due form

Meeting, which motion was duly Seconded, and, after due consideration, Carried by a full vote, and so ordered.

H.A. Borpahl, to whom the contract was awarded to furnish fire trucks for the City of Leamy, asked permission from the City Council, to be allowed to make the stringers of said truck fourteen feet long, instead of sixteen, as required by the Contract, which request was granted, by Motion duly Seconded, and Carried unanimously, after which the Council adjourned in due form.

The time of contract for the furnishing of the Fire Truck and ladders, having been set for this Meeting, to be received and paid for by the City of Leaville, when the same shall have been completed according to Contract etc. Whereupon the Committee on Fire and Water made their (verbal) report to the City Council, stating that the Outfit was completed according to specifications and Contract, and recommending that the Truck and ladders etc. be received by the City Council, and that the agreed price of One hundred and fifteen dollars be ordered paid to H. A. Voepahl the Contractor, after which it was moved & seconded that the report be accept. Carried: and the Bill of \$115.00 was ordered paid by unanimous vote of the Council,

The proposed Ordinance, in regard to regulating
 the fees and salary of Chief of Police; was
 brat up and read the second time,
 and by motion duly seconded, was placed
 on its final passage, and passed the
 City Council by a unanimous vote of all
 the Councilmen present; being seven votes,
 said Ordinance was then approved by the
 Mayor, and placed on file, & numbered 56.
 after which: the Chief of Police: J. T. Graham
 presented his written resignation, as Chief of
 Police of the City of Canby, to the Hon. Mayor
 and City Council: said resignation was
 placed on file, and read to the Council,
 after which: it was moved and seconded
 that the resignation of J. T. Graham as
 Chief of Police be accepted, which motion
 was carried by unanimous vote of the
 Council; The office of Chief of Police having
 been declared vacant by the Mayor;
