Also the Financial Statement of the Recorder for the year 1897 was read, and by motion and Second, was duly accepted and placed on file. After which the Mayor announced, that the next Order of business was to Elect Officers; The City Council then proceeded to vote for City Recorder, The Chief of Police S. J. Garrison Acting as teller; read the Ballots, which resulted in the Election of Wm Knight to the office of Recorder for the ensuing year. He having recd. seven (7) votes, & D. R. Dimick recd one vote, The Mayor then declared Wm Knight duly elected. = After which the Council proceeded to vote for President of the Council; which Resulted in the Election of G. W. Knight He having received six (6) votes, Hampton 1. & Cot. 1. The Mayor declared G. W. Knight duly Elected for the ensuing year, After which: the Mayor Appointed E. C. Skull to the office of Chief of Police; and by motion duly seconded

and Carried, the appointment of E. G. Skull
was duly Confirmed by the Council, and
declared duly elected by the Mayor;

After which the Mayor appointed J. H. Skull
and S. R. Dimick as Regular Policemen, which
appointments were duly Confirmed by the Council.
The Mayor then placed the name of S. J. Garrison
in nomination for the office of Street Superintendent
which by motion & second was duly Confirmed by
the Council, and so declared,

Also; Moved and Seconded, that the Hall of Mr Knight be procured for the use of the City Council for the ensuing year; at the same rates per Month as last year;

Mr Knight being present, and consented that the Hall may be used by the City Council for the ensuing year, at the same rate and terms as last year; the motion

Carried; and Mr Knights proposition accepted;

~~And~~ In the matter of fixing gravel-Crosswalks on the east side of the Rail Road track; it was moved Seconded and Carried, that the Committee on Streets and Public Property be requested to examine into the Matter, and report at the next regular Council Meeting;

After which the Mayor made a few suggestions - among which was a recommendation that the City Jail should be weatherboarded, for the preservation of the building, & Comfort of Prisoners.

Owing to the lateness of the Evening, the matter was postponed for future consideration, and the Council adjourned in due form, -

After which; the Committee on Streets & Pub. property; (to whom was referred, the matter of gravel Crossovers on the east side of R.R. Track to examine and report at the next reg. meeting) Made their written report, - which report was read, and in their said report stated - that they investigated the matter, and find it is not a feasible Idea to construct any walks there until the Consent of the S.P. Co. is procured to do so, and that they thought it best to do some repairing and building on first and other streets, &c Such as cleaning out ditch on first street, and enlarging boxes on A + B Streets - and

to drain said ditch, by laying Tiling across first Street, to the ditch on South side of R.R. track - Also; recommending a five foot plank sidewalk on 2^d Street along block to 4. to E Street, thence across to the M.E. Church, and also to gravel first Street one foot deep from A. to D. Streets, & 20 feet wide;

After which: (the matter having been taken under consideration by the Council) it was moved and seconded, that the report be accepted & placed on file. Carried,

After which; Councilman James Evans was requested to ascertain from the S.P.Co. as to wheather there would be any objections in putting sidewalks on the depot grounds, and putting tiling across first Street to intersect ditch on East side of R.R. track, and to report to the Recorder;

After which it was moved, seconded & Carried that the Street Supt. be instructed to examine boxes across A & B Streets, and if necessary to make a pinch opening, and to extend the ditch across and beyond "A" Street,

after which; the Motion & 2^d, for the recorder to bring in an Ordinance for Sidewalk along Block to 4. thence to M.E. Church, was lost by a vote of 5 to 3.

The Council then adjourned in due form, to meet on the 8th day of March 1898, at the usual hour, on account of the District School Meeting being held on the 7th of March 1898.

no report having been made by Councilman J. Evans, in regard to objections being made by the S.P. Co. if any, in allowing crosswalks to be made on depot grounds, &c, no action was taken in the matter by the Council.

After which a proposed "Curfew Ordinance" was read first time, and after amending Section one thereof, by adding the following words and figures thereto, to wit: "From the 1st day of October to the 31st day of March, and after the hours of ten (10) O'Clock P.M. from April 1st to Sept 30th, of each year," it was moved and seconded, that the Ordinance be ordered posted, and to come up for final action, at the regular Council Meeting in May next, - Carried; and so Ordered,

After which it was moved, and seconded, that the Recorder draw up an Ordinance, setting wages for Common labor to be done for the City of Canby hereafter, to be \$1.25 per day, and \$2.50 for one man with team. - Lost, by being a tie; a division was called for, and a motion made to Call the roll, after roll Call, it was found to be a tie vote three voting no, and three voting yes, the Mayor then cast his deciding vote in the affirmative, and the Motion declared, Carried, and so ordered.

After which, by motion duly seconded, the Council adjourned in due form, to meet at next reg. session, on April 4th 1898.
