

The City Council met in Evans Hall on the 4th day of January 1897 and Called to order by the Mayor at 7:30 O'clock P.M.

Present: The Mayor H. T. Lee; and Councilmen G. W. Knight; H. A. Vorpahl; W. W. Weed & Jas Phegley, and the Councilmen Elect: who having previously filed their Oath of Office in the Office of the City Recorder, were present: to wit: Fred Hampton, Henry Smith, O. M. Sturges, and J. A. Cox; & Ed Shull Chief of Police;

Minutes of last Meeting were read, and stood approved as read; - after which:

The following Claims against the City were read:

To wit: Claim of James Hodges - for 5 gal oil, amt. .80^c

" " D. R. Dimick for delivering papers to J. C. Hunt, .50^c

" " Geo Knight Treasurer, for fees & Station \$1.24

Whereupon by Motion duly seconded the foregoing Claims were ordered paid by unanimous vote;

The quarterly and annual reports of the Treasurer George Knight: were then read; showing a balance of Cash on hand, in the City Treasury at the end of the year 1896 to be \$283.37 - whereupon it was moved, seconded, and carried by unanimous vote, that said reports be accept and placed on file, after which; the financial statement of the Recorder, was read for the year 1896.

but owing to some few statements, not corresponding with the Treasurers report, it was moved seconded and Carried, that the Recorder have time until next regular meeting, to examine and report;

Communication of W. S. Tull in regard to refunding License was laid over to next Reg. meeting; also the two Ordinances (guarantee & Purchase grounds) were laid over to next reg meeting;

The next order of business was to Elect Officers;
 The Council proceeded to ballot for Recorder
 which resulted in; William Knight receiving
 Eight votes, being a ^{unanimous} ~~majority~~ of the Council.
 William Knight was declared duly Elected to the
 Office of Recorder of Cauley for the ensuing year;
 The Treasurer Elect; (V.L. Mack) at the last annual
 City Election failed, and declined to qualify;
 wherefore the office of Treasurer was declared
 to be vacant; whereupon the City Council and
 Mayor proceeded to Elect a City Treasurer;
 The Mayor appointed George Knight for
 City Treasurer for the Ensuing year;
 which appointment was duly accepted &
 Confirmed by the unanimous Consent of the Council,

The Mayor then ~~then~~ appointed Ed. C. Shull
 to the office of Chief of Police; which was also
 accepted and confirmed by the Council, unanimous;
 D. R. Dimick was then appointed to the
 office of Superintendent of Streets, by the Mayor,
 and confirmed by the Council;
 after which G.W. Knight was duly Elected
 as President of the Council, by Ballot,
 Receiving (6) six votes. H. Smith, 1. J. A. Coy 1.

The Mayor then appointed the following
 Standing Committees for the Ensuing year.
 Audit: Finance = G.W. Knight; W.W. Weed & J.A. Coy.
 Streets & Public Property = H. Smith, H.A. Vorpahl & F. Hampton
 Fire & Water = Jas. Phegley, W. Sturges & G.W. Knight
 Health & Police = Jas. Phegley, H. Smith & W.W. Weed,
 after which the question of Procuring a Hall for the
 holding of Council meetings, came up,

William Knight then made a proposition to the Council - that he would let his Hall to the City Council at one dollar per month: to include the use of the Hall for regular Monthly Meetings, and all Special Meetings and to hold Annual City Elections therein: The regular sessions to be held on the first Monday evenings of Each Month; and Special Meetings to be appointed at such evenings: that the Hall is not engaged; including lights & fuel; after which it was moved and seconded that Mr. Wm Knight's proposition be accepted which was Carried by unanimous vote of the Council. In the matter of repairing sidewalk: it was moved and seconded: that the Superintendent of Streets (D. R. Dimick) proceed to repair the sidewalk on C. Street from Geo Knight's Corner to 2^d Street: Carried by unanimous vote;

After which the Hon. Mayor: made some remarks: (in lieu of an annual message,) in which: (among other suggestions;) he referred to the Ordinances in regard to temporary Stands, & temporary Restaurants, or Eatinghouses: also Pedlars of Meats and fish licenses: and the ordinance in regard to quarreling & fighting &c; that in his opinion, such ordinances do not promote to the public good; and best interest of the Citizens of Canby, and recommending that said ordinances should be changed in many respects: and license's lowered, or altogether repealed; and that ordinance, No. 32, in regard to taxing up fees only when the same Canby obtained from defendants &c should be repealed; also recommending that a new sidewalk to be erected, C. St. from Geo Knight's Corner to 2^d Street, and a crossing to opposite side. after which the Council adjourned in due form -

The following Claims against the City were then read &
 by unanimous vote of the Council were ordered

 month of January 1897. amt \$4.00, and to Wm Knight

 Claim of James Evans: Hall rent amt \$14.00
 ordered paid to H. A. Vorpahl, by request of Jas Evans;

Also a Claim in favor of H. A. Vorpahl for ordering Lamps & Cans.
 to date: \$1.00 and for a lost City warrant amt .40^c numbered 103,
 and dated Apr. 6th 1896, a New Order to be issued in place of said
 lost order - Said lost order to be considered annulled.

Business on the table was then taken up for consideration.
 The Communication of W.S. Tull, which ^{was} filed Dec. 29th 1896,
 was taken up, and by unanimous vote, the same
 was allowed to be withdrawn, by J.E. Marks, Atty. for W.S. Tull.
 The proposed Ordinance to purchase grounds for
 the erection of waterworks thereon &c. Filed Nov. 11th 1896
 was taken up ^(+ read 2^d time) and placed on its final passage,
 which resulted in a vote of yes, two; nays five;
 to wit: Knight & Phegley voting yes, all other Councilmen
 voting no, excepting W.W. Weed being absent,
 so the Ordinance was declared lost.

The proposed quarantine Ordinance was then
 taken from the table, and read 2^d time
 and placed on its final passage, which
 was also declared lost. The vote being one
 (1) yes (Jas Phegley) and all others voting no, six
 (6) and one absent (W.W. Weed)

Recorder's financial report was then read
 for the year 1896, (in lieu of a report filed Jan. 4th 1897)
 and upon motion duly seconded: it was
 ordered that the report be accepted & placed on file
 which was carried by unanimous vote;

after which a proposed Ordinance; for the
 erection of new sidewalks; was read by the Recorder;
 which upon motion, duly seconded, and carried
 was referred to the Committee on Streets & Public Property;
 to remodel, and bring the same in at the next
 meeting for consideration and first-reading,
 after which it was moved seconded & carried
 that the Recorder examine into the matter of
 Ordinances, and bring in a report at the next regular
 meeting in regard to defective ordinances, & recommending changes
 the same, or some new ordinances. = Council adjourned in due form
 to meet on Monday Feb. 15th 1897. Wm Knight Ric.

Feb'y 15th 1897: Council met in Special Session and was called to order at 7⁴⁵ P.M. by the Mayor. The following Councilmen were present to-wit: G. W. Knight, Jas Phegley, H. A. Vorpahl, J. Hampton, H. Smith, J. A. Coy. & O. W. Sturges. & Chief. Ed Shull. absent: W. W. Weed:

Minutes of last reg. Meeting read & stood approved, A. proposed Ordinance; to build Side, & cross-walks on C. Street; was brot in by the Committee on Sts. & Pub. Prop'ty; and was read first time.

and upon motion duly seconded: it was Ordered that the Ordinance be posted, and to come up for final action on March 2^d 1897:

after which it was ordered by unanimous vote of the Council: that the Street-Superintendent, D. R. Dimick be instructed to fix a "walk," across the mud hole, (on the road, leading from "C. St. in Canby to Mr. J. Hamptons premises;) directly in front of Mr. Hamptons residence; by filling in with gravel, also to fill in the low place at the corner of first & D. St. at lot 6. Blk. No. 3.

No more business being on hand, it was moved: Seconded, and Carried; to adjourn to meet on Tuesday March 2^d at the usual time and place of meeting, for the transaction of business, instead of the 1st Monday in March, on account of the Annual School meeting being held on said 1st Monday in March 1897.

Sturges - Carried: 5 to 1. The Mayor; H.A. Lee, approved said Ordinance, by signing the same.

After which it was ordered, that a certain Ordinance: (which passed the City Council, & was approved by the Mayor, Oct. 23^d 1895;) be entered into the Journal: said ordinance having been inadvertently omitted from said record, also; that the Bicycle Ordinance: now on the record, be canceled, and the one which is on file: and signed by the Mayor: be entered in lieu thereof; After which the Recorder was instructed to write up an ordinance ^{for} the repeal of some of the ordinances now on record, such as Ordinance No. 5, and No. 40, and others; and to bring in new Ordinances for consideration also: to post notices, soliciting sealed bids, for the building of Side, and Crosswalks on C. St.; bids to be opened at the next reg. meeting in April:

City Council met at usual place of meeting on the 5th day of April 1897. in regular session and was called to order at 8 o'clock P.M. by the Hon Mayor H.A. Lee.

Present: G.W. Knight, H.A. Dorpahl, O.W. Sturges, Henry Smith, J.A. Cox and James Phegley, and E.C. Skull Chief of Police; Absent: Hampton & Weed.

Minutes of last reg. meeting read & stood approved.

upon motion & second, it was carried that the ordinance be posted, to come up for final action, at a Special Meeting of the Council, to be held on Monday the 19th day of April 1897, at 7:30 O'clock P.M. after which the following proposed Ordinances were also read first time, and Ordered posted to come up at next reg. Meeting in May, to wit; an Ordinance to prevent fighting &c amending Ordinance No. 2.

— An Ordinance; for the repeal of Ordinances Number's 5, 26, 32 and 40, and an Ordinance to amend Ordinance's number's 3, and 38, and No. 1.

The City Treasurer's Report for quarter ending March 31, 1897. Showing a bal of \$347.98 on hand at end of quarter; was read, accepted, & placed on file.

After which; bids for the Erection of Side & cross walks on C. Street, were opened and read. There were only two proposals, = One from John W. Fice for the sum of \$117.50 = and one from H. C. Weber for \$115.00 = which bid being the lowest was accepted by the City Council; and that the recorder write out a contract for said work, giving time up to May 20th 1897 for the work to be completed;

The Council then adjourned in due form to meet on April 19th in Special Session, at 7:30 P.M.

after which: the Contractor, H. C. Weber; to whom was awarded the Contract for Erecting Side and Crossovers on C. Street at the last meeting of the City Council held on April 5th 1897, appeared before the City Council and represented to the City Council + Mayor, that the work on said side + Crossovers was nearly completed, and that the work so far had been done according to Contract, and that in order to pay for the material used on said work, would respectfully call upon the Council for an order to be drawn on the City Treasurer for the sum of One Hundred dollars, The Mayor and City Council being satisfied in the matter of said work, upon a motion duly seconded the request of Mr. H. C. Weber was granted, and that the amount of \$100.00 be paid, by a vote of Six, all the Councilmen present, after which the proposed Ordinance for repair of D. The City Council Met in regular session on Monday May 3^d 1897, and was called to order at 8 O'clock P.M. by the Mayor H. T. Lee.

Present: Councilmen: G. W. Knight, H. A. Vorpahl, Henry Smith, J. A. Cox, O. W. Sturges and F. Hampton and Chief Police E. C. Shull; Absent: Phegley & Weed. Minutes of last Special meeting was read, and stood approved;

The following Claims against the City were then read, and Ordered paid, as follows. The balance of Claim of H. C. Weber Contractor on work of Side, and Crosswalks on "C" Street amounting to \$15⁰⁰ was reported by the Committee on Streets and Public property, and upon a Motion duly seconded, was accepted, and the bill of \$15⁰⁰ ordered paid, by a vote of six Councilmen, being a unanimous vote of all Councilmen present,

also a Claim of \$33.95 against the City, for work done on "D" Street, by Street Supt. D. R. Dimick and Others, according to City Ordinance No. 42, which authorized the work to be done under the direction of the Committee on Streets and Public property, said Committee reported upon the work, and recommended that the same be paid; with the recommendation that the Street Supt. D. R. Dimick should complete the work of filling said "D" Street, for which work the sum of Four dollars should be paid extra, making the total Claim amount to \$37.95 which upon a Motion duly seconded, said work was ordered to be completed by the Street Supt, and that the sum of \$37.95 be paid, which was carried by a unanimous vote, of six votes,

 which proposition was that the City pay the
 sum of Forty dollars, & take a receipt in full,
 after which it was moved seconded & Carried
 that said proposition be taken under advisement
 until Monday June 14th 1897 for acceptance or rejection,

After which the matter of supplying water
 from the well of Mrs. C. Knight to the public
 for watering Horses, was taken under Consideration,
 And after considering the matter, it was, by
 Motion, duly seconded & Carried that the
 recorder write up an ordinance, and
 bring the same in for consideration and action
 thereon, at the next Special Meeting of the
 Council to be held on Friday June 11th 1897
 at 7:30 O'clock P.M. Said Ordinance to be for
 the appropriation of \$50.00 or so much thereof
 as may be required for the purchasing
 of a New pump, to be placed in said well
 of Mrs. Knight, at Maple Shade Hotel, in the
 City of Cauley, and for pipes, suitable to
 carry water into a trough to be placed
 at a suitable place near the sidewalk
 on C. Street adjoining lot No. 1. of Block No. 3,
 and for the erection of said watertrough,

Dwyer Chief of Police from the Circuit Court to Supreme Court was taken under advisement, and by a unanimous decision of the Council - was Moved 2^d & Carried; that the proposition of J.E. Marks be rejected, and that a Notice of appeal be served on said J.E. Marks as Atty, and also filed in Circuit Court; - and also;

That W. S. Tull be notified that a notice of appeal will be filed in the Smith Case, & that his petition would not be acted upon until the appeal was perfected, - and also; that the recorder & atty.  after taking the matter under advisement, it
 was moved, seconded and Carried, by a
 unanimous vote of the Council, that
 the agreement be accepted as read, and
 that the Committee on fire and water be Authorized
 to sign said agreement, and after procuring
 the signature of Mrs. Catharine Knight thereto,
 the said agreement shall then be placed on
 file in the office of the City Recorder of Cauley,

After which the proposed Ordinance, to
 supply water to the public for watering stock &c,
 was read second time, and placed
 on its final passage, and passed
 the City Council by a unanimous vote,
 Aye: H. A. Trappe, J. A. Cox, O. W. Sturges Jas Phegley, and J. Hampton;
 An application was then presented and read by the Recorder
 Said application having been filed with the Recorder on the 16th
 day of June 1897. by Rudolf Klau, for a Saloon license for
 the 3rd quarter of 1897. to sell malt & spirituous ^{liquor} in less quantities
 than one gallon, in the City of Cauley; and naming P. H. Miller
 & Adam Brany as his Bonds men. The City Council being
 and Mayor being fully advised in the premises, that notice
 had been posted as required, it was moved, seconded & Carried,
 that said application be accepted, and a License issued, upon
