The City Council called to order at 7 o'clock P.M.
January 6th 1896, by the Mayor.

Minutes of special session of December 30th read
and approved, claims against the City.

A Bill of \$180 in favor of Carlton Rosenkraus
for Oil. and a bill of \$900 in favor of A. H. Lee
as salary of Chief of Police. both bills were ordered
paid by a unanimous vote of the council.

An Ordinance to prohibit bicycle riding on sidewalks,
was read the second time and upon motion & second
was placed on its final passage, carried by a
unanimous vote of the Council. An Ordinance
to prohibit Riding Driving or Herding Animals
on the Sidewalks in Candy, was read first
time and upon motion & second was ordered passed,
the same to come up for final action January
the 20th 1896.

The resignation of A. R. Shank as Policeman
was then read and duly accepted by Council.

Election of Recorder, L. D. Shank was elected
Recorder for the period of one year by a unanimous
vote of Council.

Upon motion & second the Bond of Geo. Knight
as Treasurer of Candy was accepted.

Council then proceeded to elect one as President
of the Council, with the following result,

James Phagley received two votes Geo. W Knight six votes and was declared as President of the council. The Mayor appointed as Chief of Police Ed. Schull. It was moved second & carried that the council vote by ballot on the confirmation of Chief of Police. Council then proceeded to vote by ballot on the confirmation of Ed. Schull as Chief of Police with the following result to wit; yes one, no seven. The Mayor then appointed as Chief of Police Geo. W Knight, however after some talk his name was withdrawn. The Mayor then appointed Harry Gilmore as Chief of Police. Which appointment the council refused to confirm, L. A. Clongar voting yes and H. A. Verphal L. R. Limich A. W. Riggs W. W. Weed for Phagley Geo. W. Knight & J. J. Schmitt voting no. The Mayor then appointed Henry Knight who declined, as also did A. H. Lee and Mr. Heming. The Mayor then refused to appoint any other person as Chief at this time, W. H. Dahms was appointed City Attorney by the Mayor and upon motion and second was confirmed by the Council.

in Hall, and to fix the same up in
good shape.

Claims against the City a bill of \$1400 in
 favor of A. H. Lee as Salter of Chief of Police and
 one in favor of Carlton & Rosenkrans ¹⁴⁰⁰ \$85 - for
 Oil & Wicks. Both bills were ordered paid by the
 Council.

An Ordinance to furnish water for Fire
 protection was read and upon motion & Second which
 carried the Ordinance was laid on the table.

The Mayor appointed as Chief of Police Wm. Weed.
 Moved seconded & carried that the Council vote by
 ballot in confirming the Mayors appointment.
 The vote to confirm Mr. Weed resulted as follows
 Yes. 3. No. 4.

The Mayor then appointed as Chief of Police
J. R. Leyce who was confirmed by the following
vote yes 4 No 3.

John Graham was appointed as Street
Superintendent by the Mayor and confirmed
by a unanimous vote of the Council.

the same was ordered passed.

Council then voted by ballot to confirm the following
Policeman to wit; Henry Smith yes 5 No 2
Sam. Cox yes 2 No 5, Adam Knight yes 4
No 1, Henry Smith & Adam Knight
were declared duly elected a Policeman of
the City of Banby. Council then adjourned
to meet the first Tuesday after the first
Monday in March.

the Table an ordinance providing for a water
supply for the City of Banff. However a part
of said ordinance could not be found and the
reading of the same was postponed until
the next regular meeting of the Council.

H. Knight was appointed as teller, and a vote taken which resulted in the election of William Knight, he having received 7 votes was declared duly elected,

after which the Mayor placed in nomination Ed. C. Shull as Chief of Police to fill vacancy, which nomination was duly confirmed by unanimous vote of the City Council.

Ed. C. Shull was then declared duly elected, after which the Council by Motion duly Seconded - adjourned to meet in Special Session on Monday Oct. 12th at 7.30 O'clock P.M.

The City Council Met on the 19th day of Oct, 1896 in Special Session, and Called to Order by the Mayor at 7.30 O'clock PM. The following named Councilmen present, H.A. Ursahl, W.W. Weed, James Phegley, D.R. Dimick, G.W. Knight & J.J. Schmitt, and Chief of Police; absent - W. Riggs. Minutes of the two previous Special Meetings were read and Stood approved as read.

No other business being on hand for transaction at this Meeting, except the consideration of an Ordinance: Entitled; An Ordinance for the Construction of waterworks within the city of Caulk, for the prevention and extinguishment of fire, and for Other purposes, file Oct. 19th 1896, which; Said proposed Ordinance was read first time. And after due consideration, and by Motion duly seconded. And Carried by unanimous vote, the same was ordered posted, to come up at next regular meeting in Nov. for final action. - adjourned in due form.

Monday Nov. 2^d 1896, Regular Session. 111

Nov. 2^d 1896. City Council met and was called to Order by the Mayor at 7.30 O'clock P.M.

The roll being called, found that the following officers were present, to wit: W.W. Weed, G.W. Knight, D.R. Dimick, Jas Phegley, J.J. Schmitt and A.W. Riggs and Chas. Blieck Ed Shull absent - H.A. Vorpahl,

Minutes of last Meeting was read, & approved.

After which, a petition, signed by Sami Leiblich & Jerry ^{Wm. B.} and S.J. Garrison, asking that the street lamp by the Christian Church be lighted up as it is on other streets in Canby during the winter, was read and by Motion duly Seconded, that the Petition be granted, was carried by a majority vote of the Council.

after which the following Claims against the City were read by the recorder, to wit: One Bill in favor of Ed Shull, for Police Salary, and repairing Side walk, amounting to, \$4.50, also a bill of \$3.85 in favor of Carlton & Rosenthal, for Oils, &c, and a bill in favor of William Knight for Recorders fees, Salary &c to the amount of \$13.05 all of which, by Motion duly Seconded, were ordered Paid, by a vote of the Council

as follows. W.W. Weed, G.W. Knight, D.R. Dimick, James Phegley, J.J. Schmitt and A.W. Riggs
at this time ^{and} ~~and~~ H.A. Vorpahl appeared & took his seat in the Council Ch.
The Finance Committee, (to whom were referred the Bills, or

Claims against the City, at the last Regular meeting in Oct.) then presented their report in writing, which was duly filed, and read by the Recorder, and after a Motion duly Seconded, to adopt the report as read, ^(The matter) was duly argued and considered, after which it was moved 2^d and Carried, by unanimous vote, that ^{all} the witness fees

referred to in said report be reduced from \$1.50 per day to 100^c
and claims allowed paid
the report was then adopted as changed, or amended by a vote of the Council as follows, W.W. Weed, G.W. Knight, D.R. Dimick, Jas Phegley, J.J. Schmitt, and A.W. Riggs, and H.A. Vorpahl,

The attention of the Council was then called by Councilman Vorpahl, to the matter of some uncomplicated drainage of water from the street corner of 18th & A, which, upon motion & second, & carried, was left to the Committee on Streets and Public property, for the completing of such drainage as heretofore contemplated.

The next order of business was the reading of Ordinances. A Motion was then made, to lay the Health & Quarantine Ordinance over until the next Regular Meeting, which Motion, upon being duly seconded, was carried by a unanimous vote, and so ordered.

The proposed Ordinance on Waterworks was then read 2^d time, and placed on its final passage, by a motion duly seconded, which resulted in the following vote of the Council, to wit: Aye's: James Phegley, W.W. Weed, G.W. Knight & R.Derrick J.J. Schmitt and A.W. Riggs. (6) Nay's: H.A. Vorpahl (1) Carried. A motion, duly seconded, was then put, to refer the matter, of procuring a Lease for the grounds to erect said works upon, and for the purpose of digging a well thereon, to the Committee on Fire & Water, whereupon it was moved and seconded, to amend said motion by adding the words, "and to get up plans and Specifications for all works, in reference to said Water-works, and to report at the next Special meeting." Carried; The original motion was then put as amended, and carried by a unanimous vote of the Council, after which the following named Judges, and Clerks of Election were appointed by the City Council, to conduct the annual City Election to be held in the City of Caulk, on the first Monday in December 1896, to wit: James Evans, Chairman

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Henry A. Knight & V.L. Mack, Judges, and M.H. White
and Adam H. Knight, Clerks, said Election to be
held in Evans Hall, in said City of Caufus.

The Recorder was then directed, by the City Council
to post notices of said Election, and to procure
Poll Books, tally Sheets, Ballots, and Ballot box, and such
other material necessary to carry on such Election,

The Mayor then appointed Adam H. Knight, as a Regular
Policeman (to fill vacancy) up to the 31st day of Dec, 1896, inclusive
which appointment was duly confirmed by the Council
whereupon, by Motion duly seconded the City Council
adjourned in due form, to meet in Special Session
on Wednesday the 11th day of Nov, 1896 at the usual hour

Nov. 11th, 1896. Special Session.

November 11th 1896. City Council met in Special Session, and called to order by the Mayor at 7:30 P.M., Present at roll call; W.W. Weed, Jas. Phegley, G.W. Knight J.J. Schmitt A.W. Riggs, and Chief of Police Ed Shull, absent D.R. Dimick and H.A. Vorpahl,

Minutes of last meeting read & Stood approved,
The following Claims were ordered paid by the City Council, by a vote as follows; to wit; yes -
W.W. Weed, Jas. Phegley, G.W. Knight J.J. Schmitt & A.W. Riggs;
to wit: Claim of Charles Hampton of \$1.50 for one day's fee
as witness in case of City of Cauly vs. J.W. Smith, of which
one dollar was allowed and ordered paid,
also a Claim of \$1.70 in favor of James Hodges for
pcts was ordered paid by the same vote.

The following Claim in favor of Henry Evans
was disallowed; to wit; for two days witness fee's
in case of Cauly vs. J.W. Smith @ 150 per day, and 20^c
Mileage = total \$3.20 = disallowed by the same vote;
at this time appeared Councilman H.A. Vorpahl.

The Committee on Fire and Water, to whom was referred
the matter of procuring lease of ground's & get up plans
& specifications in relation to waterworks, made a verbal
report, and also presented a communication from the
Hon R. Kochler manager S.P.C. in regard to such grounds,
which communication was read, and by motion 2^d line on table,
the verbal part of the report was such, that in their estimation
they did not deem it advisable to accept Manager Kochler's
proposition, and that suitable town lots could be had
for a reasonable consideration, and for their final
report on plans &c asked for time to next Special Meeting
which was granted; after which a proposed
Ordinance was introduced. Entitled an Ordinance

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"for the purchasing, or leasing of ground to erect
waterworks thereon" and to appropriate money therefor,"
which was read first-time, and upon a
Motion duly seconded, was ordered passed
by a vote of five yeas, and one nay, and
to come up for final action, at a special
Meeting of the Council, to be held on the 20th
day of Nov. 1896 at 7.30 O'clock P.M. of said day,
after which the Council adjourned in due
form, to meet on said day, and time.

Apr. 20th 1896. -Special meeting,

Pursuant to previous adjournment the City Council met in Special session on the 20th day of Apr. 1896. Meeting Called to order at 8. O'clock P.M. by G.W.Knight President of the ~~Council~~ Council, the Mayor being absent, on account of sickness; there were present at roll call the following Councilmen G.W.Knight, W.W.Need, J.F. Schmitt, A.W.Riggs and H.A.Vorpahl; absent D.R.Dimick & Jas. Phegley, and ex Shull Chief of Police.

Minutes of last Special meeting read & approved, at this time D.R. Dimick Councilman appeared, a petition signed by J.A.Graham, S.J.Garrison and 33 others, requesting the City Council to refrain from Erecting City Waterworks = was filed; and read by the Recorder: after which a motion was made by Councilman "Vorpahl" to accept the petition, there being no Second to the same: the motion was withdrawn by Said Councilman: and a Motion to reject the petition: which was duly Seconded; was made, and Carried by a Majority vote of the Council: & so declared; after which J.C.Wolgamot verbally notified the Council that he had lost City warrant No. 141, and asked the council to issue a new one for the sum of \$1.00 in place of the one lost. The Recorder was then requested to notify the City Treasurer in regard to the matter. + that Said warrant be not paid unless presented by J.C.Wolgamot. * the matter to be ^{again} brought up at the next reg. Council meeting, after which a Summons & Complaint, in a Suit wherein Clearance Cole & George Cone are Plaintiffs & City of Caulk is Deft. was read before the Council by the recorder, and after

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being duly considered by the Council; it was moved: Seconded & Carried by unanimous vote of the Council that the Recorder confer with some competent attorney in regard to the matter and report to the Council soon as possible.

A bill, or claim against the City was then read, in favor of L.D. Shank for Recorder's salary, out \$105.00, and upon a motion duly seconded, the claim was rejected and disallowed by unanimous vote,

- after which the Committee on fire & water presented Plans of Frame for waterworks, & a Bill of lumber itemized & required for the erection of said Frameworks, which was ordered placed on file.

The reading of the proposed Ordinance, for the purchasing of grounds for waterworks, was laid over until next Regular meeting in Dec. 1896, by unanimous vote of the Council.

after which it was moved, Seconded & Carried by unanimous vote, that the Council adjourn to Dec. 8th 1896, for the Regular meeting, on account of City Election being held on the 7th day of Decr 1896.

Dec, 8th 1896, Reg. Session

Pursuant to previous adjournment of Nov 20th
 1896, The City-Council met on the 8th day of Dec,
 1896, in Reg. Session, and was Called to Order by
 the Mayor at 7.15 O'clock P.M. The following Officers
 were present at Roll Call, to wit; W. H. Weed, Jas
 Phlegley, A. W. Riggs, D. R. Dimick, H. A. Vorpahl and
 G. W. Knight, & Chief of Police Ed Shull, = absent, J. J. Schmitt.
 Minutes of Special Meeting of Nov. 20th (and Minutes
 of Call Meeting by the Mayor of Dec, 3^d) were read
 and Stood approved as read.

(at this time the Recorder was called away on
 account of sickness by his family, and was excused
 by the Council) after which, G. W. Knight one of the
 Councilmen, was (by motion & seconded) duly appointed
 Recorder pro tem; = The supplemental claim of J. F.
 Driggs, as witness fees, in Cases of Tull and Smith; ^{past} \$3.40
 was read, and claim of R. D. Ball, also a supplemental Bill
 for witness fee in case of "Tull" for \$1.70 was also read,
 and by Motion duly seconded, and carried; that both
 Bills be laid over to next regular meeting in Jan'y 1897.

The Bill of Ed Shull, for one month salary, as Chief
 of Police. Am't \$4.00 was ordered paid by unanimous vote;
 also claim of Wm. Knight for Recorder's fees & Salary,
~~to~~ the Am't of \$7.25 was ordered paid by unanimous vote,
 after which, by motion duly seconded, and carried. the
 quarantine ordinance; and ordinance to purchase grounds
 for waterworks, were laid over to next reg. meeting in January 1897.
 a complaint & summons, was then read wherein W. H. Dolayns
 is Plaintiff, & City of Carlyle, in Justice Court Dist No. Six,
 after ^{which} upon motion & second, to instruct the recorder to meet
 this case, and if deemed necessary to employ an Attorney,
 was carried by unanimous vote of the Council.

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at this time the Recorder appeared, and the following business was transacted. To wit; in the matter of Clarence Cole & G.M. Bone's Atty's fees (in Habeas Corpus Case) it was moved & seconded that said \$20⁰⁰ atty's fees be paid, And, ^{also} one-half of the Justices & Constable's fees & Costs, in the action, but on by said Cole & Bone atty's, against the City of Caufley in Justice Court, Dist No 4, amounting to \$6.¹⁰ be paid, Carried by unanimous vote, as per Cast bill on file; after which a bill, of \$10⁰⁰ was presented for payment in favor of Judges & Clerks of City-Election held Dec. 7th 1896, and upon motion duly seconded it was ordered that \$2⁰⁰ be allowed each Judge & Clerk of said Election, Carried by unanimous vote of the Council. It was also ordered, by the same unanimous vote that J.C. Wolgamot, be paid one dollar, in lieu of a previous City-warrant, No. 141, which was reported by said Wolgamot as having ^{been} lost, and that said City-warrant No. 141, be declared null & void, and that the same be ^{considered} Cancelled, and a new order be drawn, in favor of J.C. Wolgamot, Said J.C. Wolgamot to be responsible in case that the said warrant No. 141, be found, and presented for payment hereafter, after which, the Election returns of the City of Caufley, held on the 7th Dec. 1896, for City-officers, were canvassed by the City-Council, with the following result. To wit;

Whole no of Votes Cast at such Election. - Sixty six (66)

Geo Knight rec'd 22 votes for Treasurer, & V.L. Mack rec'd 30 votes for Treasurer, and J.H. Graham rec'd one vote for Treasurer, and the following named persons received the number of votes set opposite their respective names for Councilmen to wit: J.A. Cox 47 votes, F. Hampton 55, A.W. Riggs 24, P. Subauer 27.

Henry Smith 52, O.W. Sturges 45, V.L. Mack 1, and Joseph Knight 1, votes, whereupon those having received the highest number of votes were declared duly elected, as follows, V.L. Mack Treasurer, for one year, and J.A. Cox, F. Hampton, Henry Smith and O.W. Sturges Councilmen for two years, after which the Council adjourned in due form, to meet on Tuesday Dec. 29th 1896, in Special Session at 7:00 o'clock P.M., Wm. Knight Recorder.

The City Council Met on the 29th day of Dec, 1896, in Special Session, and Called to order by the Hon Mayor at 7:15 O'clock P.M. Present at Roll Call; the Mayor H.A. Lee and Councilmen Need; Vorpahl; Dimick Phegley G.W. Knight & J.J. Schmitt, & Chief Police Ed. Shull; absent Riggs, Minutes of Last Reg. Meeting read, & Stood approved, after which; a Communication from W.S. Tull of Barlow; in regard to refunding the license money, paid to the City of Canby, by said "Tull," on Temporary Stand's^{sc} was read by the Recorder, and upon a motion duly seconded said Communication was laid over to next Reg. Meeting, by unanimous vote, and that the recorder should try to get some information regarding said matter.

An application from Rudolf Klaus, for a License to Sell Malt, & Spirituous liquors, in less quantities than one gallon within the limits of Canby, was read by the Recorder and naming his bondsmen; P.H. Miller & Adam Bany; whereupon it was Moved, Seconded and Carried; that said application be accepted; and that a License be granted as prayed for; upon the filing of the Bond with the Recorder. Said application having been filed with the recorder on the 15th day of Dec, 1896, and notices posted as required by the ordinance regulating the same, after which; the following claims against the City of Canby were read, and by unanimous vote of the Council, it was ordered that said claims be paid, a separate vote being taken for each claim:

To wit: Claim of James Andrus, amt \$0⁰⁰ = Claim of Mr. Knight Recorder, amt \$3.30 = Ed Shull Chief Police amt, \$5⁰⁰ = Oregon City Enterprise, \$3.65 = Claim of G.W. Knight for G.C. Brownell atty fee amt. \$8.50 = Carlton & Rosecrans for Oats etc, = amt \$4.30 = James Phegley amt. \$1.20 = Atkins Bros Lumber bill amt. \$17.28 Claim of Ed Shull work on ditch \$3.40 = O. Tokelson. Same. \$1.15

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after which, a Certified Transcript, of the docket entries in Justices Court for Dist No 6, Clackamas County Oregon, was read by the recorder; referring to an action wherein W.H. Dobyns is Plaintiff and City of Canby is Deft.

Said transcript was certified to by Geo. H. Brown J.P. Said showing that Complaint was filed on Dec. 5th 1896.

Summons Issued same date, and all other proceeding had in said Court, was stated therein, and that on the 16th day of Dec. 1896, it was adjudged that the said Plaintiff recover of and from the Deft. the sum of \$12.50 and his Costs and disbursements taxed at \$15.10 making a total amt of Claim against the City of Canby \$27.60

The City Council thereupon took this matter under advisement, as to whether the above Claim should be paid, or whether it would be advisable to appeal the Case to the Circuit Court.

and after considering the matter fully, it was Moved and Seconded that the above Claim be paid in full.

Whereupon a vote was taken with the following result, Those voting yes were Councilmen = W.W. Weed D.R. Dimick; James Phegley and J.J. Schmitt those voting no were: H.A. Verpahl & G.W. Knight.

The motion Carried, and so ordered paid; after which the claims heretofore presented for payment as witness fees - in the cases of Canby vs. W.S. Tull; and Canby vs. J.W. Smith; were taken under advisement by the City Council, including L.D. Shanks Claim of \$11.90 which which was presented for payment

on the 5th day of Oct. 1896, and referred to finance Committee
 of which amt six dollars & five cents was ordered paid
 on Nov 2nd 1896, leaving a bal. unpaid of \$5.85
 also including the Supplementary Claims of
 J. F. Dryor amt \$3.40 and Supplementary Claim of R.D.Ball
 amt \$1.70 - both filed Dec. 8th 1896, and laid over to
 next reg. meeting in January 1897; also, including Claim
 of Henry Evans, Filed Nov. 11th 1896 = amt \$3.20 for two days
 witness fees & mileage in case of Cauly vs. J.W. Smith which
 was not allowed & not paid on said 11th Nov. 1896,
also claim of Charles Hampton presented Nov. 11th 1896, witness fee, of which \$2.00 pa.
 Whereupon, after due consideration of all the
 foregoing Claims mentioned, it was found
 that there remained unpaid, a portion of
 each of said Claims as follows to wit;
 L.D. Shank Claim bal. \$5.85 = J. F. Dryor \$2.00
 Henry Evans " " \$2.00 = R.D. Ball - .50
 Brayton Irvine " - .50 = Willard Knight .50
 Geo. Knight " .50 = Claude Hampton 1.00
 J.C. Wolcott " .50 = George Zell .50
 Charles Hampton " .50 = - - - - -

Wherefore, it was moved & seconded that all
 the foregoing Claims be paid.

Whereupon a vote was taken with the following

 and J.J. Schmitt; absent G.W. Knight =
 after which it was moved & seconded
 to adjourn sine die. Carried;
