

January 7th 1895.

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The City Council met on the 7th day of January 1895, being the first Meeting of the new City Council for the year 1895, and was called to order by the Hon: Mayor V.L. Mack, at the hour of 7:00 P.M. At Roll Call the following named Councilmen were found present and answered to their names, to wit: Fred Hampton, Charles Lucke, O.R. Mack, Herman A. Lee, J.J. Schmitt, A.W. Riggs and L.A. Cloninger. The last 4 Councilmen named being the newly Elected, whose Certificate of Election and Oath of Office, had been previously duly filed with the City Recorder, Chief of Police A.H. Lee was also present, and the following named Councilman was absent, to wit: Herman A. Vorpahl, Minutes of Last Special Session was read by the Recorder, and no objections being made: stood approved as read.

The Hon: Mayor then rose from his chair, and made his Annual Communication (verbally) to the Council, making a General Statement of the Condition and affairs of the Municipal Corporation, and recommended the adoption of such measures as he deemed expedient and proper, among which were the following; to wit: An Ordinance to prohibit the ^{Prohibition of} using of firearms, and horse racing, and for the punishment of Petty larceny. also recommended that Statutes of Oregon be procured, and to have the City Charter, and Ordinances printed in pamphlet form, &c including rules of Order; and recommended that the same policy be pursued, or adopted by the City Council for the future, in regard to Liquor licenses, as

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in the past year, and also; as there seems to be a doubt, as to wheather Our Charter gives us a right to grant any License for Card tables, recommended that the City Council investigate the matter, and act accordingly,

Claims against the City were then brot up and read as follows:

a bill of \$6.70 in favor of Albert H. Lee, Chief of Police - for salary, police star & lamp work, and on motion, duly seconded was ordered paid by a vote of all the Councilmen present, being seven votes, and one (H. A. Vorpahl) absent.

after which, a bill of \$14.70 in favor of Recorder for fees, salary, rent and folio work, was read, and after making a reduction of \$1.30 for filing papers, the same was, upon motion & second, ordered paid by a vote of Eight Councilmen, as Councilman Vorpahl having appeared at this time and taken his seat,

After which, the Ordinance, which was proposed at last meeting and ordered posted in regard to an additional street lamp, was read 2^d time and upon a motion duly seconded was put on its final passage, and passed by a full vote of Eight Councilmen,

The following Miscellaneous business was then transacted, allowing the Card table License which was issued to Geo. Schwaibold to be transferred to J. F. Dryor for the balance of unexpired time of said license, after which it was moved 2^d & Carried that the recorder shall not issue any more license under Ordinance No. 5 until further permission by the City Council,

The Council then proceeded to Choose one of their Members as president of the Council, by ballot, which resulted in a vote of Seven in favor of H.A. Lee, and One vote for O.R. Mack. Herman A Lee was then ^{declared} duly Elected as president of Council, after which the Mayor appointed the following Standing Committees. to wit:

The Mayor then made the following appointments to constitute the Police force, subject to Confirmation by the City Council. to wit:

J.A. Graham, Chief of Police, and Albert H. Lee, Henry Smith and A.R. Shank, Policemen, after which the above named appointments were duly Confirmed by the Council, by a unanimous vote of Eight Councilmen, seven

The Council then proceeded to the Election of Recorder by ballot, which resulted in the Election of L. D. Shank. he having received six votes, was declared duly Elected,

after which it was moved and seconded to adjourn, which motion was lost by a Majority vote; Councilman Vorpahl then addressed the Council stating that there was a doubt as to whether the present Chief of Police, Elect at this Meeting, J. A. Graham, is a legal voter, and if such is the case, the Election of said J. A. Graham as Chief of Police would be illegal, and therefore null & void, After which it was moved, and duly seconded, and Carried, by a majority vote of the Council, that the said J. A. Graham was not a legal voter, Other appointments were then made by the Mayor for Chief of Police. but none were accepted by the appointees, After which it was moved 2^d & Carried, to Postpone the appointment of Chief of Police until next Meeting; The Committee, on "Streets and Public Property" was then, by Motion & second, requested to see about procuring a Hall for the use of the City Council Meeting, and to report at the next regular Meeting, After which the Council adjourned in due form.

February 4th 1895

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The City Council met on the 4th day of February 1895 And was called to order by the Hon. Mayor V. L. Mack at the hour of 7.30 o'clock P. M. At roll call the following named Councilman were found present and answered to their names to wit; H. A. Vorpahl H. Sell Jacob Schmitt O. R. Mack L. Croniger Charles Luecky and Fred Hampton absent A. W. Briggs. Chief of Police A. H. Sell present. Minutes of last regular meeting read and corrected. Petition of Conrad Neibert for Signor License for the period of three months, with Charles Schmitt, and Adam Bang as sureties read and approved. and the Recorder ordered to issue a License to the said Conrad Neibert. Claims against the City. Bill of W^{rs} Knight for \$2.75 as Recorder's fee. ordered paid by a vote of seven Councilman that being the number of Councilman present Bill of A. H. Sell for \$7.50 as salary of Chief of Police and one street lamp. ordered paid by the same vote as the previous bill viz; seven votes. The report of the Committee on Streets & public property. was read in regard to securing a Hall for Council purposes. the report recommend the securing of Evans Hall for the period of one year for the sum of Ten Dollars per year. The Hall to be used as a voting place in City elections, said hall occupying the second floor of the Evans building. Report adopted. The following Miscellaneous business was then transacted. Moved Seconded & Carried that the Chief of Police be present at the evening train also at the Post office. and in case he cannot be present he will instruct one of his aids to be there. Carried

March 23rd / 1895

The City Council met on the 23rd day of March A. D. 1895 in special session and was called to order by the Hon. Mayor at 7.30 o'clock P. M. Roll call found the following Councilman present to wit: C. B. Mack Charles Laseky Fred Hampton J. J. Schmitt W. Briggs & H. A. Lee. Absent, H. A. Vorpal & C. Clonigar Chief of Police A. H. Lee present. Minutes read & approved. Claims against the City.

Bill of Carlton & Rosenkrans for the sum of Six dollars & eighty-five cents for Oil, Oil can Lamp globe & Lamp wicks orderd paid by a vote of six Councilman. Reading of Ordinances.

Ordinance No. 27. read and orderd posted by a vote of four Councilman. Two Councilman voting against the ordinance. Ordinance No. 28 read & orderd

posted by a vote of five Councilman. One Councilman voting against the ordinance. Ordinances Nos

29, & 30. read and orderd posted by a unanimous vote of the Council. An Ordinance was then read in regard to Horses, or Mules with Harness, or saddle on being allowed to stand in the Streets, or unimproved seats in Carriage, without being securely tied. Lost by a vote of three for and three

against the Ordinance. Ordinances Nos 31. & 32 read and orderd posted by a unanimous vote of the Council.

Miscellaneous matter, on motion & second the Recorder was instructed to procure a copy of Hills Code by a unanimous vote of the Council.

The Council then adjourned in due form.

April 1st 1895

The City Council met on the 1st day of April A. D. 1895 in regular session and was called to order by the Hon. Mayor W. L. Mack at the hour of 7¹⁵ o'clock P. M. Roll call found the following Councilman present to wit; C. Clonigan J. J. Schmitt C. R. Mack Fred Hampton W. Riggs Charles Lanekey and after a few minutes A. A. Lee came into the Council chamber. Chief of Police A. H. Lee present. Minutes of previous session read and approved. Claims against the City. Bill of Geo. Knight for fifty-one cents as fees, on One Hundred & two dollars, as treasurer. Bill of A. H. Lee for Four dollars as salary of Chief of Police, and a Bill of L. L. Shank for Thirteen dollars for Hills Code of Oregon, read and ordered paid by a unanimous vote of the Council. Reading of Ordinances.

Ordinance No. 26. read and on motion and second was laid on the table by a unanimous vote of the Council. Ordinance No. 27 read and on motion and second was placed on its final passage.

Carried by a vote of Five Councilman, two voting against the ordinance. Ordinances Nos. 28, 29, 30. were read and placed on their final passage, carried by the unanimous vote of the Council.

Ordinance No. 31. read and on motion & second was placed on its final passage carried by a vote of six Councilman, One Councilman voting against the ordinance. Ordinance No. 32. read and placed on its final passage carried by a unanimous vote of the Council.

On motion and second Ordinance No. 26. was taken from the table and placed on its final passage, carried by the unanimous vote of the Council. The report of Treasurer of Bank of Oregon for the quarter ending March 31st 1895 showing a balance on hand as per report of Dec. 31st 1894 to be \$157.45 received of Licenses \$102.00

Paid of City warrants to the amount of \$65.22

Leaving a balance on hand of \$194.23 on motion & second the report was accepted by a unanimous vote of the Council. Harry Gilmore was nominated by the Mayor as Supretendant of Streets & confirmed by a unanimous vote of the Council.

On motion & second the question of procuring a store for the City Jail was referd to the Committee on Streets & Public property with power to act by a unanimous vote of the Council.

Moved & second that the question of filling B. street be referd to the Com. on Streets & Public property. moved & second to amend by refering to the Com. on Finance. a mendment lost. motion then carried.

Moved & second to reconsider. carried. the Original motion was then put and lost. moved & second that the Mayor appoint a special committee carried. the Mayor then appointed Councilman H. A. Lee W. Riggs & C. G. Goring as special Com. moved and second that the expense of filling B. Street not exceed Twenty-five dollars. carried.

Council then adjourned in due form.

On motion of C. Senckey, that a rebate be given on licenses issued to temporary eating houses. after some discussion the motion was put and lost.

 Moved, second & carried that the Chief of Police be
 instructed to procure three new street lamps and
 place the one in position at the corner of second &
 d. streets. It was then moved, second & carried that
 the Street Commissioner be authorized to cut down
 the hill between d & e streets on first, at a cost
 not to exceed Twenty dollars (\$20.00)

It was then moved, seconded & carried that the sidewalk
 shall be taken up and ordered paid.

Moved second and carried, that warrants be drawn to
 pay the above claims against the City.

An Ordinance ^{to prohibit horse riding on sidewalks} was then introduced & read, and upon motion
 & second was ordered passed. H. A. Lee, whose resignation
 as Councilman had been accepted and whose seat was at this
 time declared vacant retired from the Council, and H. C.
 Gilmore & L. R. Dimmick were placed in nomination to fill the
 unexpired term of the said H. A. Lee. The election being
 by ballot, and with the following result, L. R. Dimmick
 receiving five votes, and H. C. Gilmore one vote.
