

Regular Council Meeting. Jan'y. 2^d, 1894. 27

The first regular Council Meeting, for the fiscal year commencing Jan'y 1st 1894, was called to order at the hour of 7 O'clock P.M. Jan'y 2^d 1894. by the Hon: Mayor V.L. Mack in the Chair.

The Roll of Officers being called by the recorder. The following Councilmen answered to their names to wit: Charles Lucke, Fred Hampton, H.A. Vorpahl, O.R. Mack, Herman A Lee, L.D. Shank, D.R. Dimick and S.J. Garrison, constituting the full board of Councilmen and Mayor Elected at the last Annual City Election, and having all been duly qualified, by filing their several Certificates of Election and Oaths of Office with the Recorder before entering upon the duties of their several offices: The Chief of Police having been elected as one of the present Councilmen; there was none to answer; Assessor, ^{Elected} A.H. Knight; and Treasurer, ^{Elected} George Knight; were also present. Having also previously filed their Certificates of Election and Oath of Office with the Recorder. Minutes of the last Meeting "of the Outgoing Council" was read by the Recorder, and no objections having been made, were declared by the Mayor to stand approved as read, After which the new Council proceeded to choose, by ballot, one of its members as president of the Council, which resulted in the Election of Council Herman A. Lee, he having received a majority of the votes cast, was declared duly elected. The Mayor then appointed Albert H. Lee to the Office of Chief of Police, which appointment was confirmed by the unanimous consent of the Council.

The Mayor then also Appointed Henry A Knight
to the Office of Street Superintendent, which was
also Confirmed by a Majority of the Council,
After which the Council proceeded to Elect
a Recorder, by ballot, which resulted in
the Election of William Knight, he having
received Seven Votes, being ^{the votes of} a Majority of
all the members constituting the Council, was
declared duly Elected as Recorder,

After which the Hon. Mayor rose from his Chair
to address the Hon: City Council in regard to the
general Condition and affairs of the Municipal Corporation,
and Recommending that the Council adopt such
Measures, as would be deemed best to pay off the

present indebtedness of the City amounting to the
 Sum of Ninetytwo dollars and fifty Cents,
 and also, to adopt some plan in regard to
 erecting a City jail, as there is at present no
 place to confine any person in case it should
 become necessary to do so, and also, in regard
 to fire, there should be some regulations for the preven-
 tion and extinguishment of fires, - and recommended
 that, in his opinion it would be to the best inte-
 =rest of the City, for the Council to pass Such
 Ordinances whereby Saloons might be licensed,
 in order to procure funds to make such improvements.
 Otherwise it would become necessary to raise such
 funds by assessment, and levy of a tax,
 it was then moved & 2^d to levy a 2. Mill tax. Carried.
 Also moved & 2^d to accept the assessment list
 as presented by S. J. Garrison, late assessor & Collector
 of Canby, Vote taken by yeas & nays, = Lost, =
 Moved & Seconded to reconsider last motion Yes 7 nays 1. ^{Enrolled}
 Whereupon the Motion was made & Seconded to
 lay said Assessment list on the table, Carried ^{Unanimous}
 Whereupon it was moved & 2^d to Reconsider
 the Motion for a 2. Mill tax, Carried ^{Unanimous}
 Again it was moved & seconded to vote a 2. ^{Mill}
 Tax, Lost, by a unanimous vote of the Council,
 whereupon it was moved, seconded, & Carried.
 That the Recorder make application to the County
 Clerk of Clackamas County, for an aggregate valu-
 =ation of the assessable property of Canby, =
 The Council not having been able to come to any
 conclusion in regard to an Ordinance which was read
 the same was withdrawn, and by Motion & Second
 adjourned to meet on Monday Dec. 8th 1894. in Special Session
 at the Hall of Wm. Knight, at the usual hour of meeting. ^{Wm. Knight}

Special Meeting Jan'y. 8th 1894

A Special meeting of the City Council held Jan'y 8th 1894, Council Called to Order at 7:30 P.M., Roll Call found all Members present, Except Councilman C. Lucke absent:

Minutes of last meeting read & approved, a communication (or letter), from the County Clerk in regard to aggregate valuation of City Property was read by the Recorder, stating among other things that he (said County Clerk) would send a Certificate of valuation of said property as soon as possible; whereupon it was moved, seconded and Carried to postpone said business, until heard from said County Clerk or until said Certificate of valuation was received,

a proposed Ordinance, in regard to Liquor license, was then read first time by Recorder; After which it was Moved, Seconded and Carried, by unanimous vote, to take up said Ordinance for consideration, by sections:

A motion was then made and seconded to adopt Section one of said proposed Ordinance, While the question was under debate, it was Moved & Seconded to amend, by adding the word "Mechanical" after the word Medical, Carried by unanimous vote.

After which the main question was put, to adopt Sec. 1. as amended, Carried by Unanimous vote;

It was then moved and seconded and Carried by unanimous vote, to adopt Section two (2) of said Ordinance,

A motion was then made, and seconded to adopt Section three (3), as read,

and after debating the matter, a motion was made to strike out the words; ("excepting in the case provided for in section (5) of this Ordinance") Motion was seconded, and Carried by a vote of 4. for striking out, & 3. against, after which it was moved, 2^d & Carried to insert the word "Public" and strike out the word "Conspicuous", The previous question ~~question~~ was then put; to adopt Sec. Three. = Lost by a vote 3 for, & 4, against, after which a Motion was made, and seconded to reconsider the last vote. Carried by Majority after which the main question was put, to adopt Sec Three, as amended, which was Carried by a vote of 4. for, & 3 against, A motion was made and seconded for the adoption of Sec. (4) - Carried by unanimous vote, After which it was moved, and seconded to adopt Section (5) five, The vote stood: Three (3) for adoption, and four (4) against = Lost, Moved & Second to adopt Sec. (6.) vote = Yes. 6. No. 1. Carried, after a motion & 2^d to adopt Sec. (7) the vote stood unanimous for adoption! After which it was ordered by a unanimous vote, that the proposed Ordinance be passed as amended, and to come up for 2^d reading and final action at the next Special meeting to be held Jan'y 18th 1894 at 7 P.M. Moved & 2^d, that a Committee of three be appointed by Mayor to ascertain, and report at next meeting of the Council, at what terms, a Hall, or suitable place, could be had, for future Council meetings. Mayor Appointed S.J. Garrison, D.R. Dimick and L.D. Shank, After which Joseph Knight was appointed Street Supt. in consequence of a vacancy - H.A. Knight having failed to qualify - After which on motion & 2^d the Mayor appointed H.A. Lee, Garrison & Shank, as a committee to look up a location for a city jail and report at next meeting, after which a vote was taken to place the end of Recorder at \$1000. Carried, Council then adjourned in due form to meet on Evening of Jan'y 18th 1894 at 7 P.M. in special session.

Special Meeting Jan'y 18th 1894.

Pursuant to previous adjournment,
Council Met. on the 18th day of Jan'y. 1894.
at Knights Hall. and was called to Order
by the Mayor. at the hour of 7:15 O'clock. P.M.,
At Roll Call. all Members of the Council
answered to their names. including Chief of Police,
except Councilman Lucke was absent.
Minutes of last Special Meeting read,
and approved as read.

The proposed Ordinance, which was passed
at the last Meeting, to Second reading, and
Ordered posted to come up for final action,
was read second time. after which, it was
Moved, and Seconded. that the Ordinance
be adopted and passed as read:

Whereupon, Councilman Lee. Moved the Council
to amend said Ordinance, by adding Section
five, as introduced by him, and filed by the recorder.
Which section five was then read by the recorder.
The Motion, was then seconded to adopt said section

as an amendment, and put to a vote, which
vote stood. 5. against the adoption and 2. for
adoption, the Motion to adopt was declared Lost.

The main question was then put - Shall the
Ordinance pass, a vote was then taken upon
the main question by yeas and nays
which stood - Yeas - Garrison, Simick, Vorpahl,
Shank, and Hampton, total 5, Those Who Voted
No - were Mack and Lee, 2. = Lucke absent.

The Main question was declared. Carried,
after which the report of Special
Committee, appointed at last meeting.

to ascertain at what terms a Hall could be procured for future Council meetings, was received, and adopted by unanimous vote, stating that they had considered the matter of Hall rent for future use of the City Council, and that they would recommend that the terms of Wm Knight for the use of hall, be accepted, said terms being at the rate of One dollar and twenty five cents per month, for use of Hall, lights, wood & janitor fees.

The Committee on Location of Jail site, were requested to look up other locations, in addition to what they have reported, and report at next meeting.

The Mayor then appointed F. D. Duval as Street Superintendent, with Consent of Council, as the former appointee, Jas Knight failed to qualify. The present Street Sup. = "after qualifying" to notify all parties, who have fences or Buildings on streets to remove them, according to Ordinance No. 15, but to defer tearing down & removing such fences & buildings until after the next City Council Meeting.

After which the rules of Order were suspended by unanimous vote of the Council, in order to take up the business of reading of Ordinances.

A proposed Ordinance was then introduced and filed by the recorder, in regard to Levying a two mill tax. Ordinance was then read first time by the Recorder, after which it was moved and seconded to adopt the Ordinance as read, a vote being taken which stood yes. 5, no. 2. Carried, and that the same be posted, & come up at next regular meeting for final action & passage. Moved & 2^d to adjourn. Carried.

Feby. 5th Council met in regular session, and called to order by the Mayor. at 7.30 O'clock P.M. Roll Call found all present except Councilman D.R. Dimick was absent, Rev. S. Mathew was then permitted to address the Council in regard to certain fences not to be torn down in order to protect certain fruit trees, from being injured by stock, or that curbing might be made around such trees on the streets, after which a communication from the C. Clerk stating that the taxable property of Canby amt. to \$62,958. as per assessment roll of 1893, also a report of Street Supt. was read. Stating that certain parties had been notified to remove fences and Buildings from street, The proposed 2. Mill Tax Ordinance was then brought up and read second time by Recorder, Moved & Seconded to pass the Ordinance & read, A vote was then taken by yeas and nays, which resulted as follows, Garrison and Dorsahl voted yes, Lee, Lucke, Mack, Shank & Hampton voted no, absent Dimick, Ordinance declared lost, after which a report of Committee on location of jail site was read, Moved & Seconded that the consideration of report be postponed to next meeting Feby 8th 1894, Carried, Also Moved & Seconded and Carried Street Supt. do not tear down any fences until instructed to do so. by the Council, and that Rev. Mathew's request be not granted, (= Bond of recorder approved) Moved & 2^d to adjourn to meet on Thursday Feby 8 in Special session, at 7 P.M. Carried: & adjourned, Wm Knight Recorder

Council Met in Special Session, on Feb'y 8th and Called to order at 7.30 P.M. by the Hon: Mayor. After Roll Call, all were found present, except Councilman Lucke, being absent.)

Minutes of last reg. Meeting read & approved. An application for a Liquor license was then read by the Recorder, praying for a license to be granted to Conrad Neibert, to sell Malt & Spirituous liquors within the Corporate limits of Canby, in less quantities than one gallon; for the period of six months, which (said application) had been previously filed with the Recorder, to wit (on the 8th day of Feb'y 1894) and signed by said applicant Conrad Neibert, together with a bond, duly executed, in the sum of Five Hundred dollars, to the City of Canby with two Sureties. Conditioned; as required by Ordinance No. 17 of said City of Canby, which said bond was duly submitted to the Hon: Mayor & City Council, for approval, and after the reading of said bond by the Recorder, the same was then duly approved by the Mayor and Council by a unanimous vote, and ordered to be placed on file with the recorder, and that a License be Issued to said applicant Conrad Neibert for the sale of such Liquors, upon compliance with all the requirements of said Ordinance No. 17, in regard to issuing such license, A proposed Ordinance was then read first time, in regard to burglary &c, referred to Committee on Streets & Public property.

Also a proposed Ordinance was read first time, in regard to hindering officers, which was ordered posted, and to come up for final action next meeting, the consideration of location for jail site was laid over to next reg. meeting after which council adjourned in due form. Wm Knight Recorder.

March 5th 1894, Council met at the usual time and place of meeting, and called to order by the Mayor, after which it was moved, and seconded that the Council adjourn to meet on the 6th day of March 1894, in adjourned meeting, at the hour of 7.30 O'clock P.M. in order to give all an opportunity to attend the Annual School Meeting of School dist. No. 86. The motion was then put, and carried to adjourn by unanimous vote of all members present.

Meeting then adjourned in due form to meet as above stated.

Council Met in Reg. Session at the hour of 7:45 and was called to order by the Mayor. Roll Called by the Recorder, present as follows: H. R. Lee, O. R. Mack, F. Hampton Chas Lucke and L. D. Shank and Chief of Police A. H. Lee, absent: H. A. Vorpahe, D. R. Dimick & S. J. Garrison;

Minutes of Last meeting was read & stood approved,

The Quarterly report of City Treasurer: was then filed - read and adopted as correct. Showing a bal. on hand in Treasury Mch 31st 1894, amt; \$106.90

The following Claims against the City were then read by the recorder, and accepted by the Council and ordered paid by unanimous vote, as follows:

Bill of Chief of Police for three dollars, being three Mo's Salary at \$1.00 per Mo. Ending March 31st 1894, Also Bill of Recorder for \$11.30, being 3 Mo's Salary, a 1.00 per Mo. & Hall rent for 3 Mo @ 1.25 per Mo.

and fees on writing Ordinances & filing papers &c

Also Bill of \$1.00 to Treasurer for percentage on Collections;

The Report of Committee on St's & Public Property, to whom "The Matter of ascertaining the probable cost of Material, and construction of Jail;" was referred to, was then read by the recorder, and after taking the matter into consideration, the Council Ordered that the report be laid over for further consideration to a Special Meeting of the Council to be held on Monday Evening April 9th 1894 at the usual hour.

A deed from H. A. Lee & wife for a certain tract of land, to the City of Canby: (38^{ft} x 40^{ft}.) was read. Ordered that the deed be changed to read 38^{ft} x 50^{ft}. and present the same at next meeting. Council then adjourned in due form. to meet Apr 9th 94.

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Council met in Special Session on April 9th 1894. at 7:30 O'clock P.M. and called to order by the Mayor. Roll Call found all Members present including Chief of Police.

Minutes of last reg. Meeting read and approved.

The Warranty Deed for jail site from H.A. Lee & wife to the Municipal Corporation of Canby. which was ordered by the Council at last meeting to be changed to read 38ft by 50ft instead of 38x40ft, was then read, after which it was moved and seconded that the same be accepted as read, and to be put on Record in the Records Office of the County of Clackamas, and that an order be drawn on the Treasurer for the sum of Nineteen (\$19.⁰⁰/₁₀₀) dollars in favor of Herman A. Lee. which motion was carried by a vote as follows, to wit:

J. Garrison; D.R. Dimick; H.A. Vorspahl; Charles Lucke. Fred Hampton; O.R. Mack; and L.D. Shank, total 7.

Not Voting: H.A. Lee, one. The Mayor then declared the same closed.

After which the report, and business, "in the matter of ascertaining the probable cost of Material & Construction of Jail" was taken up for consideration, which had been laid over from last meeting.

And after considering the matter in regard to the plan & specifications of the jail building, the Council by unanimous vote, concluded

as follows: That the building shall be in size 14½ feet front by 10½ ft. gable end, out side, and 10ft high to eaves.

Sills to be 6x8 in. ^{front} and ^{back} 6x6 in. ends, plank for main building

to be 2x6 inch sized one side & one edge, laid flat and

nailed together with (6 in ^{30 lb} wire nails) floor and ceiling to be the same as side walls. Common roof with rafters, sheeting,

and Cedar Shingles; gable ends to be boxed with inch lumber.

One door in front 2ft 6 in by 6ft 6 in. same as wall, miter end to close.

With Two Windows = one at each end. Lower part of window to be about 6½ ft from floor, an 8 ft. window to be used, 10 x 12" glass, half of same to be placed at one end, & half at other end. to be put on inside so as to slide sideways to open & shut, the openings to be barred in center of wall. with One inch, round Iron bars up & down & 4 inches apart from center to center. With Cross bars, not less than ½ in by 2 in. one on inside & one on out side of round bars to be riveted together, door to be hung on heavy Iron Blacksmith's hinges, and fastenings ready for pad lock. Also a suitable and safe water closet to be placed in one corner of room. And that the building of said jail be let to the lowest responsible bidder. Contractor to furnish all material. After which it was moved & seconded and Carried by unanimous vote of the Council, that the Recorder write out the plan and Specifications, and advertise for bids, by pasting notices in three public places in the City of Canby, Or. bids to be opened at next Reg. Council meeting in May, 1894, building to be completed on or before the first day of June 1894. Right reserved to reject any small bids, On Motion, Council adjourned in due form.

May 22nd 1894.

A Special Meeting of the City Council was held on the 22nd day of May 1894.

Which meeting was called by the Mayor for the purpose of receiving the Jail Building and for paying the Contractor therefor, and for transacting such other business that may properly come before the Council.

Roll Call found all present excepting Councilman D. R. Dimick.

Minutes of last reg. Meeting was read, ^{and} approved. and whereas the Contractor John A. Rydman was present at this meeting and informed the Council that the Jail Building was completed, and that the same was ready to be turned over to the City Council. A contract having been previously made with proper Bonds for the faithful performance of said contract, and the claim against the City according to said Contract was Seventy five dollars.

And after taking the Matter under Consideration. It was moved seconded and Carried by unanimous vote of the Council that the Jail Building be accepted, and that a warrant be drawn in favor of the Contractor for the sum of \$75⁰⁰.

and it was so ordered. and that by request of the Contractor John A. Rydman an order of \$41⁰⁰ be drawn in favor of James Hodges, out of said amount of \$75⁰⁰ and the balance amounting to \$34⁰⁰ be drawn in favor of John A. Rydman the Contractor.

Also a Claim of one dollar against the City was presented by the Recorder, for Charges of County Recorder for Recording deed of City Lots, which was ordered paid by unanimous vote of the Council,
Also moved & 2^d that the Jail building be insured for \$100.⁰⁰ for three years. which was Carried by a vote of 6. to 1. and that the Recorder see about insuring the same.

Also moved. 2^d & Carried that the Recorder procure a suitable Lock and Key for the Jail, and appliances for one bed to be used in the City Jail. and to put up three Bunks, in the Jail building, one above the other,

Also moved 2^d and Carried that the Chief of Police procure a pair of hand Cuffs, and Onehalf Doz. Cheap police Stars, and a Book of Arrests. and that he also is authorized to procure bedding for the Jail from time to time whenever there is need for more than one.

After which: the Mayor: with the Consent of the City Council. appointed the following named Citizens. as Regular Policemen. to serve without pay, except for making arrests, to wit: J. B. Howard. Adam. H. Knight and Ed. Schull.

After which the Council adjourned in due form to ^{meet} in Reg. Session, to wit: on June 6th at the usual hour, on account of June 4th being a General Election day.
