of May 1893. for City Officers. to wit:
One Mayor, One Assessor & Collector, and
One Treasurer, and Eight. Councilmen.

Said Election was held, and resulted in
the Election of the following named officers.

The said inspectors gave Certificates of
Election to the Successful Candidates.
to hold their Respective offices until the
next regular Annual Election, or until
their Successors are Elected & qualified.

Minutes of first meeting of Council,
Pursuant to a Call, by the inspectors of Election,
The Mayor "Elect," and Councilmen
Elect, of the City of Canby, in the County
of Clackamas, and State of Oregon,
Met, for the first time, on the 13th day of
May 1893, at Knight's ^{Hall} in said City of Canby,
at Three O'clock P.M. for the purpose
of Organizing.

The Officers Elect were duly qualified
by taking and filing an Oath of Office.
Administered before J. F. Briggs, a Justice
of the Peace in and for the Justice district
number Six (6) for the County of Clackamas, Oregon.

The Mayor, and Councilmen, all being
present, proceeded to ^{transact} the following business.

The Mayor announced that the first order
of business was to Elect a Recorder, and that
nominations were in order.

Councilman "James Hodges": Nominated Wm. Knight
for the Office of City Recorder, no other nominations
being made - nominations were declared closed;

And after appointing, A. H. Lee, Clerk, and Teller.

proceeded to vote for Recorder by ballot.

Which resulted in the Election of Wm. Knight.

He having received "Eight votes", being all the votes cast,

was declared duly Elected to the Office of

City Recorder, And after Qualifying by filing his

Oath of Office, Subscribed and Sworn to before

J. F. Briggs the aforesaid Justice of the Peace, immediately

entered upon the duties of said Office of

City Recorder, The next business in order

announced by the Mayor, was to Elect a president of the Council, "James Hodges was put in nomination". after which a ballot was taken for president of the Council. which resulted in the Election of James Hodges, he having recd seven votes, was declared duly elected to the Office of President of the Council.

The Council now being fully Organized, all papers in regard to the City election, and also, the Poll books, tally sheets, ballots, ballot-stubs and Certificates of nominations & acceptances of such nominations to the various City Offices, were all turned over to the City Council, by the inspectors of said Election,

All said papers were then turned over to the Recorder, together with Poll Books, Tally sheets, ballots & Stubs &c to be retained in his custody for reference.

It was then Moved & Seconded that the Rules of Order, "of the Oregon City Council, recorded in the Oregon City Charter of 1891, on pages 37 to 42 inclusive", be used and adopted for guidance so far as the same may be applicable until otherwise ordered by the Council. = adopted

Also Moved & 2^d. that Recorder procure a copy of the last Oregon Union Laws, also, a Seal and Journal & record of minutes &c, Carried.

On motion adjourned to meet at the same place, on the evening of May 22^d 1893 at 7.30 O'clock P.M.

Council Mett. at 8 o'clock P.M. at Knight's Hall. Meeting Called to order by the Mayor; - Councilmen all being present; proceeded to transact the following business:

The Minutes of previous meeting was read, and approved as read.

The Mayor then announced that it was in Order to appoint a Chief of Police, for which Office the Mayor presented the name of Lewis Rogers, and having been approved by the Council, with their unanimous Consent, was duly declared Elected as Chief of Police, and that he be notified by the Recorder of his Election, A communication from the Sec'y of State was read by the Recorder, which stated that the boundary ~~reads~~ reads in the Original Bill exactly as pointed in the Laws, After which the Mayor appointed the following Standing Committees: to wit;

Claims & Bills. were then on Motion referred to Committee on Finance. Whereupon the Finance Committee reported favorably and recommended that the same be paid - Moved & 2^d - that an order be drawn on the Treasurer to pay the same, as soon as funds could be procured for the same.

And in order that the said indebtedness may be paid as early as possible.

It was moved & seconded, and Carried that the Mayor & Recorder be authorized to procure One Hundred Dollars for the term of one year, to pay the present, and other necessary expenses which may be appropriated hereafter for City-purposes, &c, After which it was ordered by vote of the Council that the Bonds of the City Treasurer be fixed at One Thousand dollars, Also, that the Regular Meetings of the Council be held on the first Monday Evenings of Each Month, and the hour of meeting shall be from Sept. 15 to Apr 15. 7 O'clock P.M. and from Apr 15 to Sept 15 at 7.30 O'clock P.M.

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Regular Council Meeting June 5th 1893.

Council met. at 8 O'clock P.M. at Knights Hall. Meeting Called to Order. by the Mayor, Councilmen all present, excepting Councilman A. G. Stogsdill. (reported Sick) Chief of Police. L. Rogers; Treasures Knight; and Assessor S. J. Garrison, were also present; After which the Minutes of Last Meeting were read, and approved.

An Application to the ^{Mayor &} City Council was then read, presented by J. J. Schmitt, for a License to Sell Beer and Spirituous Liquors by the Glass in the City of Albany for the term of Six Months - signed = J. J. Schmitt:

Moved and seconded, that said application be laid on the table, to be taken up at the next meeting for consideration - Carried; and so ordered.

A bill for the sum of \$2⁸⁵ for Ledger & record books was presented, in favor of Messrs. Carlton & Parentrans.

Bill accepted, and on Motion & 2⁵ Ordered paid,

The Special Committee = (Mayor & Recorder) made a verbal report, that they had as yet, not ^{been} successful in procuring any funds, as Authorized at last Meeting,

After which the following Proposed Ordinances were introduced, and read first time. To wit:

- 1st An Ordinance to regulate & License the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors.
- 2^d An Ordinance to regulate & license the Sale of Malt & Spirituous Liquors.
- 3^d " " to Open & Clear all streets.
- 4th " " to License Pedlars; Keepers of Stands, Restaurants, or Eating Houses, &c.
- 5th " " to prevent & punish, quarreling, fighting & disorderly Conduct.
- 6th " " to License Theatricals: Jugglers, Lecturers, Concerts, &c.
- 7th " " to License Drays, Trucks, Wagons, Hacks or other Vehicle.
- 8th " " to License Billiard, Pool; Card or other gaming tables.
- 9th " " to compel to work on streets, on refusal to pay fine &c.
- 10th " " to prevent gambling, or betting on games of chance.

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All the foregoing proposed Ordinances were read first time, and passed to second reading, to be read at a special meeting to be held on Monday evening June 19th 1893. at which time Council proposes to take final action on all of said ^{proposed} Ordinances. Except, that Ordinance numbered two (2) be laid on the table, and that all other proposed ordinances be posted in three public places in the City.

On Motion & second. the recorder was requested to ascertain at what price, printed Blanks of City = Orders could be procured, and also at what price the Charter could be printed in pamphlet form and such other printed blanks & forms for the use of the City Officers. and report at next Meeting. And whereas the Council deemed it necessary that a Street ~~Commissioner~~ Superintendent be appointed.

The name of W.A. Avery was put in nomination by the Mayor, for said office. and by the unanimous Consent of the Council was declared duly elected.

No other business being presented. it was moved & seconded to Adjourn, to meet in Special Session, on Monday June 19th 1893 at 7:30 p.m. Carried:-

Demmison, President, addressed to the City Council, was then read by the recorder, in reference to a license fee of five dollars, which had been collected from said Association for keeping an Eating house during the week of Campmeeting held within the City limits in July 1893. and praying that the said sum of five dollars be refunded to said association.

The matter was then immediately taken into consideration by the City Council, and after argument it was moved and seconded - and Carried that that the said amount of Five dollars be refunded to said association - on the grounds that there were no refreshments, Caudies or nuts sold at said eating house, vote. ~~stood~~ as follows to wit: for refunding, Four; against, Two, not voting two; and that an order be drawn on the City Treasurer in favor of said Association for the amt. of Five dollars.

After which an Ordinance to regulate and license the sale of ^{and refreshments} Malt Liquors (which was introduced at a meeting held June 19th 1893. & read first time - and amended at a regular meeting held July 3rd 1893) was read second time and passed as amended, by a vote of the Council, of Seven (7) votes for, and One (1) against, Also, an Ordinance to regulate the salary & fees of Recorder. was read second time and passed the City Council by a vote of Seven (7) for; and One (1) against the passage of the Ordinance. - Passed -

July 17th Continued

An Ordinance^{No. 12} to Open Certain Streets in the Town of Canby was then read second time and passed by a vote of Six (6) for, + 2 against, No further business being presented. The Council adjourned in due form to meet in Regular August term.

Said Ordinance passed the Council July 17th 1893. - and was submitted to the Mayor for his approval, and on the 24th day of July 1893. the same was returned to, and filed with the recorder without the approval of the Mayor, together with his reasons for not approving the same. - The Ordinance was then put on its passage again: Vote of Council stood as follows.

of the City of Canby. Signed by Geo. Susbauer and 26
others, purporting to be legal voters of Canby, respectfully
praying said Hon. body, to Cause a license to be issued
to Mr. J. J. Schmitt, to Sell Malt and Spirituous Liquors
in less quantities than one gallon within the Corporate
limits of the City of Canby, for the period of One year,
which petition was thereupon referred to the City Council
by the recorder. A remonstrance having also been
filed with the recorder on said day, signed by
S. Mathew and 26 others, also purporting to be legal
voters, remonstrating against such license being
granted by the Hon. Councilmen of Canby, which said
remonstrance was also referred to the City Council,
And, after satisfying themselves that notices had
been posted in three public places in the city limits,
according to Sec. 4. of City Ordinance No. 10: The City
Council then proceeded to determine whether said
petition and remonstrance was signed by legal voters
according to Sec. 5. of said City Ordinance No. 10.

The recorder was then requested to read said petition
and the Names thereon, and after reading the same,
the following names were objected to (by remonstrators.)
to wit: W. S. Kellogg; John Sims; J. H. Floyd; Henry Smith
W. A. Kendall and F. Hampton, which objections were
all sustained by the City Council and stricken out.

Excepting the name of "F. Hampton" which was not sustained by the Council, After which the remonstrance was also read by the recorder, and the following names were objected to (by Petitioners) to wit James Hodges. A. G. Stogsdill; A. H. Lee and Joseph Knight and also L. B. Mack.

which said objections were not sustained by the Council, and not stricken out;

It being then decided by the Council, by a majority vote, that said License be refused to said applicants, and not be issued, as it appears that only 22 petitioners were legal voters; and 27 on the remonstrance: being a majority of 5 votes against granting any license;

After which a Claim against the City was presented for payment in favor of Recorder Wm Knight for writing and Copying Ordinances, and for 4 Mo. Salary, & Hall rent, and for Stationery &c. Amounting to \$37.50.

Which Claim was accepted, and on Motion and Second: was ordered that said amt be paid and an order drawn on the City Treasurer for said amount.

No other business being presented, the Council adjourned to next Reg. Meeting in Oct.

After which a petition was presented by S. Mathew signed by W. J. Gardner and 24 others. Praying the City Council to Repeal City Ordinance No. 12.

The same was filed by the Recorder, and read in open Council.

And after due consideration, it was Moved & Seconded to lay said petition on the table. which was carried by a unanimous vote.

A claim against the City was then presented by Chief of Police L. Rogers. in the sum of Five dollars for 5 Mo's Salary up to Sept. 30th 1893.

Moved & 2^d that said bill be allowed, and an order drawn on the Treasurer for the amt of \$5.00 in favor of L. Rogers. Carried unanimously.

Resignation of L. Rogers, as Chief of Police, "Accepted" on account of having removed out of City Limits.

And Douglas R. Dimick was appointed to fill vacancy of Chief of Police office for the unexpired term, and that he be notified of his appointment.

An Ordinance in regard to Recorder's fees, was read Second time, and on Motion & Second was amended so as to take effect on the first

Monday in January 1894. Carried by unanimous vote of the Council. and ordered to be posted and come up for final action at a Special Meeting to be held on Monday Nov. 20th 1893 at 7:30 P.M.

Also, an Ordinance introduced by S. Mathew and filed by the recorder, was read first time. for the repeal of Ordinance No 12, in regard to opening certain streets or parts of streets, which passed the City Council August 7th 1893. over veto.

After taking said proposed Ordinance into Consideration, the Council by a vote of 3 for, and 3 against said ordinance being adopted, which was a tie vote. the Mayor then cast his vote in favor of adoption. making it a majority vote in favor of adoption. and that the same be posted. and come up for second reading at a Special Council Meeting to be held on Monday Nov. 20th 1893. at 7:30 P.M.

After which the Council, by a unanimous vote with the consent of the Mayor. appointed the following named parties to act as Judges. and Clerks of the Annual City Election to be held on the first Monday in Dec. 1893.

to wit; William Knight (Chairman) and Samuel Terry & John Schach. Judges. and David J. Cox and L.D. Shank. Clerks.

And it was ordered that the Recorder post notices of said Annual Election according to Law, & naming the Judges & Clerks appointed to conduct said Election. the officers to be elected thereat. and the place designated for holding the Election therein. The place designated to hold election is at Knights Hall, no other business being on hand. Council adjourned to meet Nov 20th in Special Session.
