

October 17, 1962

The Planning Commission for the City of Canby met in regular session at the City Hall. Members present were Elsie Cutsforth, Earl Gipe, Ralph Hulburt, John Rasmussen, John Burgess, ex officio members Mayor Oliver, City Councilman Lawrence Housen, City Superintendent Lee Cox and other City Council members Lyle Read, Fred Stefani and Howard Giger. Mr. Ed Eilers of the Bureau of Municipal Research was also present. Mr. Roy Bentz was introduced as the new assistant to the City Superintendent.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Zoning was the primary purpose of the Planning Commission meeting on Wednesday evening, October 17th. After lengthy discussion and numerous suggestions, alterations were made on the current zoning map and Mr. Eilers expects to have a new map drawn up with the suggested modifications in time for the November meeting. Frank Kendall attended the meeting in the interest of the zoning proposals.

There was no report on street changes.

It was reported that the holly tree at the N.E. corner of the intersection of 4th and Elm had been trimmed and was acceptable to automobile traffic. A further survey was to be made to see if it would be acceptable to school bus traffic. Action was taken and the hedge on the N.E. corner of the intersection S.E. 4th and Ivy has been removed.

Mr. Cox reported that the street width allowed in the Roads Addition had been approved when the plans were submitted.

Mayor Oliver reported on a meeting held with other mayors of Clackamas County in the interest of inter-city relations as a result of the disaster.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:30 P.M.
