Canby Planning Commission Special Meeting November 13, 1986

The Minutes of the October 13, 1986, were approved as presented.

Item #1: Request for reconsideration of conditions placed on a minor land partition requested at the October 13, 1986, meeting. The parcel in question is directly south of Canby Builders Supply with Southern Pacific having ownership. The applicant is Canby Builders Supply. Mr. Atwood explained that the special meeting was called at the request of Mr. Morse. Mr. Morse explained there is a clause in his and Mrs. Cutsforth's deeds on the thirty (30) foot strip adjacent to their property. The railroad has included a clause which precludes them from relinquishing the property in any manner or it reverts back to the railroad. For this reason, Mr. Morse did not want to endanger his right to the thirty (30) foot strip on the south side of his property.

Discussion followed regarding the railroad's position on the deed restriction. It did not appear to landlock any other property than the railroads. Mrs. Cutsforth or Mr. Morse could buy the additional property along the railroad tracks and have frontage on N. E. Second Avenue. The railroad has a private road along the tracks that they could use for ingress and egress. The question arose as to whether it was legal or leave the remainder of the property on a private easement or not. Mr. Atwood said he would discuss it with the City Attorney and find out if there was any problem.

*Commissioner Davis moved to remove the restriction of condition No. 1, and that all other conditions stand. Removal of this condition is conditional on the approval of the City Attorney. The original findings of fact and the additional information received by the Commission concerning the deed restriction on the private roadway are the reasons for this action. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Seale and passed unanimously.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:50 p.m. This meeting has been recorded on tape.
