WORKSHOP NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATIONS

Matilda Deas headed a discussion of neighborhood associations. Items discussed include:

- Creating standards for associations.
- Effective size of associations, too small and people seem to burn out.
- Funding for such things as neighborhood newspapers, and staff involvement. Grants are available, but very competitive.
- Having the Planning Commissioners become involved with the creation of associations.
- The importance of explaining the role of neighborhood associations.
- Possibility of having Planning Commissioners going door to door to increase awareness and get things started.
- Changing the name from "association" to "advisory committee", "coalition" or citizen participation organizations.
- How to define the boundaries of association, interest based or area based.
- Training for citizens who spearhead associations, then they train replacements.
- Having one, City wide televised meeting to generate interest, find people who are interested and willing to get involved and create a "grassroots" base.
- Issues that could generate interest in getting involved include, traffic issues, new apartment complexes, intersection safety and large developments such as Safeway, Hope Village and School issues.
- Process could take years before the associations were up and going on their own.
