ORDINANCE NO. 726

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING PAVING OF BIKE/PEDESTRIAN WAY BY CLACKAMAS COUNTY PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Canby has planned and budgeted for bike/pedestrian ways and wishes to improve South Ivy Street from Township Road to S.E. 13th with an eight (8) foot bike/pedestrian way for an amount not to exceed \$6,000; and

WHEREAS, money to pay the cost of said improvements has been properly budgeted in the 1982-83 Revenue Sharing Budget; and

WHEREAS, Clackamas County agrees, through an Intergovernmental Cooperative effort, to provide the improvement in concert with its South Ivy Street Overlay Program for an amount not to exceed \$6,000; now, therefore,

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> The City's Public Works Supervisor is authorized to submit a letter of agreement to proceed with the bike/pedestrian way as described above and now approved.

<u>Section 2.</u> The improvement shall be completed under the direction and supervision of the City's Public Works Supervisor and be in accordance with the accepted public works design and specifications for such a project; and upon receipt of billings and approval by the Public Works Supervisor, City Administrator and City Council, payment shall be made from the 1982-83 Revenue Sharing Budget.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist in order that the improvement can be accomplished at the time Clackamas County has scheduled to overlay South Ivy Street; and this ordinance shall therefore take effect immediately upon its enactment and final reading.

Submitted to the Council and read the first time at a regular meeting on September 1, 1982, and scheduled for a second reading and action of the Canby City Council at their regular meeting on October 6, 1982, commencing at the hour of 7:30 o'clock P.M., at the Council Chambers at the Canby City Hall, in Canby, Oregon.
