

ORDINANCE No. 19

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE RENTING OR SALE OF DIP-NETS, FISH-NETS OR SMELT-NETS; AND THE SALE OF SMELT, FOODS, CONFECTIONS, FRUIT, CHEWING GUM, POPCORN AND/OR OTHER MERCHANDISE AT RETAIL, AS A VENTURE OR BUSINESS BY PERSONS NOT PERMANENTLY LOCATED AT, OR IN BUSINESS IN TROUTDALE, OREGON, UPON ANY STREET, ROAD, THOROUGHFARE OR OTHER PUBLIC GROUNDS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF TROUTDALE, OR UPON THE PROPERTY OF ANOTHER WITHIN THE TOWN OF TROUTDALE, OREGON.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TROUTDALE:

SECTION 1. Any person, firm or corporation (not permanently located in and permanently engaged in business in the Town of Troutdale, Oregon) engaging in renting or selling dip-nets, fish-nets, smelt-nets, or engaging in the sale of smelt, foods, confections, fruits, chewing gum, popcorn and/or other merchandise at retail, as a venture or business by persons not permanently located at, or in business in Troutdale, Oregon, upon any street, road, thoroughfare or other public grounds within the corporate limits of the Town of Troutdale, Oregon, or upon the property of another within the Town of Troutdale, Oregon, shall, before engaging in or pursuing in said business or venture, or ventures, aforesaid, obtain a license so to do from the Marshal of the Town of Troutdale, and pay to said Marshal of the Town of Troutdale the sum of \$5.00 per day, or a fraction of a day, intending to so engage in such business or venture, which license shall be carried on the person of the licensee, and signed by said licensee. Said license shall be valid only for such day or days mentioned in said permit or license and not otherwise.

SECTION 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction therefor in the Court of the City Recorder of said Town of Troutdale, be punished by a fine of not less than \$10.00 not more than \$20.00, or by imprisonment in the City Jail of the Town of Troutdale for a period of not less than One (1) day, nor more than Two (2) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the Court.

SECTION 3. In as much as this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the people of the Town of Troutdale; NOW, THEREFORE, it is declared that an emergency exists, and this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council of the Town of Troutdale, and approved by the Mayor.
