

ORDINANCE NO. 20

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR AUTOMOBILES TO ENTER CERTAIN INTERSECTIONS WITHOUT MAKING A FULL STOP, PROVIDING PENALTIES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TROUTDALE:

SECTION 1. The following streets are hereby designated as main traveled highways within the town of Troutdale:

- Troutdale Road
- S. E. Third Street from Troutdale Road to Dora Street
- Dora Street from S. E. Third to E. Columbia Street
- Buxton Street
- Cherry Park Road

SECTION 2. Except as otherwise provided herein, it shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to enter any of said main traveled highways from an intersecting street without first stopping his vehicle.

SECTION 3. The provisions of Section 2 hereof shall not apply to traffic entering the following intersections traveling in the following directions:

Traffic traveling North or South entering intersection of Troutdale Road and Cherry Park Road;

All traffic entering intersection of Troutdale Road and S. E. Third Street;

Traffic traveling West and turning North and traffic traveling South and turning East, entering intersection of S. E. Third Street and Dora Street;

Traffic traveling East or West entering intersection of Cherry Park Road and Buxton Street.

SECTION 4. Signs shall be placed at the intersections affected by this ordinance instructing traffic of the duty to stop provided herein.

SECTION 5. Violation of Section 2 of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$25.00.

SECTION 6. It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City, and therefore an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect when signed by the Mayor.
