AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNEXATION TO THE CITY OF TERRITORY SURROUNDED BY ITS CORPORATE LIMITS.

WHEREAS, the territory described below is surrounded by the corporate limits or boundaries of the City of Troutdale and is not an incorporated City; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be in the best interest of the city and the proposed area that the territory described below be annexed to the City without an election in the city; now therefore

The City of Troutdale ordains as follows:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TROUTDALE:

SECTION 1. <u>Annexed Territory</u>. The following described territory which is surrounded by the city boundaries is hereby annexed to the City of

WHEREAS, on April 21, 1970, the Commission received a resolution from the City Council of Troutdale requesting that the property described above be annexed to the City;

WHEREAS, the resolution meets the requirements for initiating boundary change proposals in ORS 222.750 and paragraph (a), Section (1) of ORS 199.495;

WHEREAS, the Commission duly published notice of public hearing in accordance with ORS 199.520 and conducted a public hearing on May 20, 1970, in accordance with the rules of the Commission and paragraph (b), Section (1) of ORS 199.475;

WHEREAS, the Commission caused a study to be made of this proposal as provided in paragraph (a), Section (1) of ORS 199.475;

WHEREAS, on the basis of the study which considered economic, demographic, and sociological trends and physical development of the land, and the public hearing, the Commission found that:

- a) the territory to be annexed is contiguous to the City by being completely surrounded by the corporate limits of the City;
- b) the territory to be annexed contains approximately 33 acres, two single family dwellings and an estimated population of 6 persons;
- c) the City Council initiated the boundary change because it determined that it is "in the best interest of the city and the proposed area that the territory...be annexed to the City";
- d) the territory to be annexed is included within the study area for the city's Comprehensive Land Use Plan (now underway), Sewerage Plan (recently completed, and Water Plan (now underway); and
- e) the territory when developed can most logically be served by the City's water and sewer systems.

WHEREAS, on the basis of the findings the Commission approved BOUNDARY CHANGE PROPOSAL NO. 156 on May 20, 1970;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS ORDERED THAT the territory described above be annexed to the City of Troutdale as of this date.
