

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE CITY WATER SUPPLY,  
AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 99 AND DECLARING AN  
EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF

TROUTDALE:

Section 1. Chapter 2 of Ordinance 99 is amended by the  
addition of a Section 6 which reads as follows:

Section 6. Whenever an existing metered water  
supply within or without the City of Troutdale is  
disconnected for whatever reason, before such system  
will be reconnected, a reconnection charge of FIVE  
AND NO/100ths (\$5.00) DOLLARS shall be required, which  
shall be payable in advance. Such reconnection  
charge shall be in addition to any outstanding  
obligation for water supplied to such premises.

Section 2. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for  
the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety  
of the people of the City of Troutdale in the judgment of the Common  
Council, now, therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist  
and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its  
passage by the Common Council of the City of Troutdale, and its  
signing by the Mayor.

Passed by the Common Council of the City of Troutdale, this  
9th day of March, 1971.

The recorder reported that the Edwin Ege Sanitation, Inc. will need to raise the charge on garbage collection April 1, 1971.

Motion moved by Frank Simons, That the city grant the increase of cost of 50¢ per mo per can to Edwin Ege, Inc. Harold Estes seconded. Motion carried.

It was decided by the council that George need not go to the water school this year.

Mayor reported on the hearing in Salem March 2nd on City/County consolidation .

Mr. Phillips submitted the aldernate bill to apply to any county just not Mult. Co. Mayor Otto told how with the other cities they had planned to present their objections. But due to lack of time he was called on as the last on the agenda and he had only planned to give an amendment to the bill.

Bernard Hilbert reported on the hearing held March 9th, which he and Rankin Davis attended. Stated the Milikin ~~ak~~ had opposed the bill.

Leroy Smith of Corbett had letters entered opposing the bill and told of their meeting March 17th to either consider Incorporating a city or annexing to the City of Troutdale.

Elmer Stern, chairman for the Farm Bureau opposed it.

Mrs. Seidel from east co. opposed it.

It was stated that Senator Cook did not take any position on the bill.

Barney Stated the Nancy Keyes was an effective supporter in mini skirt.

Lloyd Anderson City of Portland Councilman spoke in favor.

Attorney Cook felt that it would go to the Local Government Sub-committee and could be voted out of the Urban Affairs committee.

→ A new City Ordinance No. 162 was introduced by Attorney Cook. An Ordinance relating to the City water supply, Amending Ordinance No. 99 and declaring an Emergency.

This was read in full by the city attorney and then the title twice.

Motion moved by Bernard Hilbert, That Ordinance No. 162, be adopted. Frank Simons seconded. Motion carried.

A new City Ordinance No. 163 was introduced by City Attorney Cook, An Ordinance relating to sewer use, connection and water supply and declaring an Emergency.

This was read in full and twice by title by Attorney Cook.

Motion moved by Bernard Hilbert, That the City adopt Ordinance No. 163. Harold Estes seconded. Motion carried. Yeas: 5 Nays: 0

Attorney to send letters to the people involved that are not hooked to sewer.


New Business:
