ORDINANCE NO. 188 - 73 AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO CITY PARKS, ADOPTING RULES AND REGULATIONS, FOR THE CITY PARKS. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TROUTDALT THAT: RULES AND REGULATIONS REGARDING PUBLIC USE OF CITY PARKS AND RECREATION AREAS. SECTION 1. General Use of Park and Recreation Areas. A. No person shall use abusive, threatening, boisterous, vile, obscene or indecent language or gestures, now shall any person cause, attempt to cause or bring about any public demonstration or disturbance or in any way conduct himself or to use amplified devices so as to unreasonably distract or disturb the peaceable enjoyment of any park or recreation area by other members of the public. No person shall deface, mark, scratch, burn, destroy or cause damage to any park and recreation area or improvements thereon or be wantonly wasteful of material and supplies provided for the comfort of the general public. C. No person shall pick, mutilate, dig, probe or remove any plant, soil, stone, sand, wood, metal, mineral or any other substance of any kind whatsoever from any city park or recreation area. D. No person shall deposit, dump, place or leave any rubbish garbage or THE XEX PROXIMAL TRANSPORMENT PROPERTY OF ANY TYPE regardless of its source in a city park or recreation area except refuse, garbage or litter occasioned through use of such areas may and shall be deposited in refuse receptacles provided for such purposes. E. No person shall wash any clothing or other material or equipment or clean any fish, or in any way introduce or place any polluting substance, waste or litter in any stream, spring, pond, swimming or wading pool, or fountain in the city park or recreation area. F. No person shall operate a concession of any type or engage in the business of soliciting, selling, peddling, vending, hawking or advertising in any manner or display any goods, wares, equipment or merchandise for sale or otherwise in the city park or recreation area without written consent of the Common Council of the City of Troutdale. G. No person shall enter or remain in the City park or recreation area between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 10:00 a.m. SECTION 11. Hunting and Fishing. A. No person shall discharge any firearm, weapon or exposives of any type, including "fireworks"; nor pursue, hunt, trap, molest or capture any wild bird or animal in a city park or recreation area. SECTION 111. Motorized Vehicles. A. No person shall drive a motor vehicle or a motorcycle on any paths or roadway in the city park. B. No vehicle shall be driven in any section of the park or recreation area except designated parking areas built and designated as parking areas in the park. C. No motor vehicle or motorcycle shall be parked or left standing, in any area of the city park designated by signs as a "No Parking" zone. SECTION 1V. Fires. A. No person shall build, light or maintain any fire except in a stove, pit or fireplace provided for such purposes. Portable cooking equipment, gas, gasoline, or oil camp stoves or charcoal braziers may be used if in safe operating condition or if used in such a way not to burn, scorch, mar, deface or destroy park property or improvements thereon such as plants, turfed areas, picnic tables, or paved areas, etc. B. No person shall leave a fire of any type unattended and shall be responsible to extinguish any fire built, lighted or maintained by him. SECTION V. Pets. No dogs or pets shall be allowed in the city park or recreation area. Α. This includes dogs or pets on leash or within a motor vehicle. B. No horses or other animals shall be ridden, led or driven upon any path or roadway within the city park or recreation area. SECTION VI. Camping. A. No person shall camp overnight in the city park or recreation area except at such times and places as shall be approved by the Park Commissioner. -1-

## SECTION VII. Enforcement of Rules and Regulations.

- A. In order to enforce these rules and regulations and to maintain a sanitary and orderly appearance in the city parks and recreation areas, the commissioner or any employee of the Bureau of Parks or any other person authorized by the City Commissioners is vested with the authority to require under penalty of law, all persons using said areas to abide by these rules and regulations and said person shall have the authority to determine size, type and arrangement of individual picnic facilities in the park areas.
- B. No person shall interfere with any authorized person in carrying out the enforcement of these rules and regulations.
- C. No person shall refuse to leave any city park or recreation area after being directed to leave by the employee authorized to enforce the park rules and regulations.
- D. A copy of these rules and regulations and any amendments thereto shall be posted at the main entrance or entrances to any city park or recreation area owned or leased by the City of Troutdale and at such other places as the Common Council may determine.
- E. These rules and regulations supersede all previous rules and regulations heretofore adopted.
- F. Violation of these rules and regulations is a misdemeanor and is punishable by imprisonment for not more than one (1) year or by a fine of not more that Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or both, (as provided in ORS 161.080).

## SECTION VIII. Alcoholic Beverages.

A. The consumption of alcoholic beverages within the city park or recreation area will be governed by the same rules as for use therein at the Troutdale City Hall.

## SECTION 1X. Emergency.

A. It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Troutdale, its residents and inhabitants, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect when passed by the Common Council of the City of Troutdale, and signed by the Mayor.
