

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE INTERFERING WITH OR IMPERSONATING PEACE OFFICERS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TROUTDALE:

SECTION 1. Interfering with prohibited. It is unlawful for any person to resist any peace officer, or to refuse to assist him in the discharge of his duties, or encourage any other person to interfere with a peace officer in the performance of his duties.

SECTION 2. Impersonating prohibited. It is unlawful for any person to assume to be, hold himself out to be or represent himself to be a peace officer, either by words, actions or appearance, unless such person is authorized by law so to do.

SECTION 3. It is unlawful for any person to have, possess or display the badge, identification or other credential of a peace officer, unless such person is authorized by law so to do.

SECTION 4. Escape of person in custody of peace officer. It is unlawful for any person in the custody of a peace officer of the state or any county, city or judicial process, to escape or attempt to escape from the custody of such peace officer.

SECTION 5. It is unlawful for any person to rescue or attempt to rescue, with or without the use of force, any other person in the custody of a peace officer of the state, or any county, city or town thereof, by virtue of a lawful arrest or judicial process, or to aid or assist such other persons to escape or attempt to escape from the custody of such peace officer.

SECTION 6. Escape of person in confinement. It is unlawful for any person confined in the city jail, house of detention, industrial home or other place of confinement, or in the custody of any person in charge of the city jail, house of detention, industrial home or other place of confinement, to escape or attempt to escape from such place or from the custody of any person in charge of such place.

SECTION 7. It is unlawful for any person to aid or assist any other person to commit any of the acts set forth in section 6.

SECTION 8. Any persons violating this ordinance and upon conviction of violation thereof, such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00, or imprisonment in jail for not more than one year, or both.

SECTION 9. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the people of the City of Troutdale in the judgement of the Common Council, now, therefore, as emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council of the City of Troutdale, and its signing by the Mayor.


